Legislator Clements asked how long these systems usually last? Sgt. Donovan responded that they typically have a 15-20 year life span. Legislator Clements also asked about what kind of battery is being used in the replacement, citing the County's fairly recent legislation and concerns regarding lithium ion batteries. Sgt. Donovan said that the battery being used is similar to a car battery and that he would check with DPW on exactly what type of battery it is.
