Dear Members of the Board of Legislators:

Transmitted herewith for your review and approval is an Act which, if adopted, would authorize the County of Westchester ("County") to amend its current-year Capital Budget ("Capital Budget Amendment") in connection with capital projects SPC03 - Port Chester Waste Water Treatment Plant – Electrical System Upgrade ("SPC03"), and SPC09 – Port Chester Waste Water Treatment Plant HVAC Systems Upgrade ("SPC09"). Also transmitted herewith is an amending and superseding Bond Act ("Amended Bond Act") which, if adopted, would amend and supersede Bond Act No. 52-2024 to:

- (i) increase the amount of bonds authorized by Act 52-2024 by \$18,000,000, from \$11,000,000, to a new total of \$29,000,000,
- (ii) increase the estimated maximum cost of the combined SPC03 and SPC09 projects from \$45,200,000 to \$63,200,000 (an increase of \$18,000,000), and
- (iii) update the plan of financing to include (a) \$34,200,000 bonds authorized under Bond Act No. 5-2021 and (b) the new total of \$29,000,000 to be authorized by the Amended Bond Act.

The proposed Capital Budget Amendment will amend the County's capital budget to increase the appropriations for SPC03 and SPC09 by a total aggregate amount of \$18,000,000, comprised of a \$6,000,000 increase for SPC03, and a \$12,000,000 increase for SPC09.

The Department of Environmental Facilities (the "Department") advised that all bids received exceeded available construction budgets for SPC03 and SPC09. Cost increases are attributable to tariffs and unpredictable market conditions. Many raw materials and manufactured electrical and heating, ventilation, and air conditioning ("HVAC") components are imported and therefore subject to increased tariffs. In addition, tariffs are causing supply chain disruption thereby risking long lead times and further increasing costs.

The Amended Bond Act would authorize the County to issue \$29,000,000 bonds of the County (including \$11,000,000 previously authorized by Bond Act 52-2024) to finance a portion of the \$63,200,000 estimated maximum cost of the design, construction management and construction for the replacement and upgrading of the electrical system and replacement of the HVAC system at the County's Port Chester Water Resource Recovery Facility, including incidental expenses.

The Department advised that SPC03 and SPC09 provide for replacement and upgrade of plant electrical system and HVAC system at the Port Chester Water Resource Recovery Facility. The electrical system replacement and upgrade includes, but is not limited to, replacement of the

electrical switch gear, electrical panel boards, motor controls centers, emergency generators and any other related ancillary equipment reaching the end of its useful life. The HVAC system replacement and upgrade includes, but is not limited to, replacement of the HVAC units, as well as odor control equipment and all ancillary systems and controls.

Design has been completed by a consultant. It is estimated that construction will take thirty-six months to complete and will begin after award and execution of the construction contracts.

Section 167.131 of the County Charter mandates that a capital budget amendment that introduces a new capital project or changes the location, size or character of an existing capital project be accompanied to the Board of Legislators by a report of the Westchester County Planning Board (the "Planning Board") with respect to the physical planning aspects of the project. The Planning Department has advised that the Planning Board has previously reviewed SPC03 and SPC09 and issued a report, and that since there is no change in the scope of the work and this is simply a change in the financing plan, no further action by the Planning Board is necessary at this time.

Based on the importance of these projects to the County, favorable action on the proposed Acts is respectfully requested.

HONORABLE BOARD OF LEGISLATORS THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK

Your Committee is in receipt of a transmission from the County Executive recommending approval by the County of Westchester ("County") of an act amending the County's current-year capital budget ("Capital Budget Amendment"), as well as adoption of a related amending and superseding bond act prepared by the law firm Norton Rose Fulbright ("Amended Bond Act") in connection with capital projects SPC03 - Port Chester Waste Water Treatment Plant – Electrical System Upgrade ("SPC03"), and SPC09 – Port Chester Waste Water Treatment Plant HVAC Systems Upgrade ("SPC09").

The Amended Bond Act would amend and supersede Bond Act No. 52-2024 to:

- (i) increase the amount of bonds authorized by Act 52-2024 by \$18,000,000, from \$11,000,000 to a new total of \$29,000,000,
- (ii) increase the estimated maximum cost of the combined SPC03 and SPC09 projects from \$45,200,000 to \$63,200,000 (an increase of \$18,000,000), and
- (iii) update the plan of financing to include (a) \$34,200,000 bonds authorized under Bond Act No. 5-2021 and (b) the new total of \$29,000,000 to be authorized by the Amended Bond Act.

The Planning Department has advised your Committee that based on its review, the above-referenced capital projects may be classified as Type "II" actions pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act and its implementing regulations, 6 NYCRR Part 617 ("SEQR"). Therefore, no environmental review is required. Your Committee has reviewed the annexed SEQR documentation and concurs with this recommendation.

Your Committee has carefully considered the proposed Capital Budget Amendment, as well as the related Amended Bond Act, and recommends approval of both of the proposed Acts,

noting that the Amended Bond Act can only be enacted following adoption of the Capital Budget Amendment. It should be noted that an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of your Honorable Board is required in order to amend the County's Capital Budget and to adopt the Amended Bond Act.
