


**TO THE COUNTY BOARD OF LEGISLATORS

1	Budgetary	Support the Governor's proposal to make County sales tax authorization permanent		Requested in 2020 and 2021. Included in previous Budgets by former Governor	Support Governor Hochul's measure to make County sales taxes no longer require state legislation for renewal. Our current authorization would expire in 2023.
2	Budgetary	Ensure Sunset of Distressed Provider Assistance Account		New request	The Distressed Provider Assistance Account, which allows NYS to withhold roughly \$1 million per quarter from counties outside of NYC for hospitals, puts significant pressure as a recurring expense on property and sales tax. Governor Hochul's Executive Budget would make this program permanent, but as many hospitals now express confidence in their surge capacity – Westchester County believes that this account is not sustainable in the long term and should be allowed to sunset.
3	Budgetary	Support the Expansion of Downstate Casino Licenses and Mobile Sports Betting		Requested in 2020 and 2021; FY22-23 budget authorizes mobile sports betting and authorizes NYS's Gaming Commission to issue Requests for Information - indicating state interest in issuance of new licenses	MGM's request for Empire City Casino to become a fully licensed casino would generate significant revenue for Westchester County, the City of Yonkers, and the Yonkers City School District. It will also be a significant vehicle for job creation in both Westchester & the Bronx. As such, Westchester County requests that downstate casino licenses be supported.
4	Budgetary	Support Gov. Hochul's effort to lift the burden of AIM payments from counties		Requested in 2021; NYS shifted these costs gradually under the previous admin, completing that process in the FY21-22 budget.	Aid and Incentives to Municipalities (AIM) payments were shifted to draw from county sales tax through FY2021, but this put significant pressure on local property taxes. We support Governor Hochul's initiative to remove the burden of these fees from counties.
5	Budgetary	Support the Governor's Executive Budget increase for the Income Threshold for Child Care Subsidy Programs		New request	The current State threshold for families seeking support through the Child Care Subsidy Program is 200% of the federal poverty level. The cost of living and median income in Westchester exempt many needy families from this support. In her Executive Budget, Governor Hochul increased this threshold to 300% of the federal poverty level. Westchester supports this move, as it accounts for our local cost of living.
6	Budgetary	Amend the STOA Formula		Requested every year since 2008. NYS increased Westchester's STOA aid from \$51.8 to \$59.8 million in the FY21-22 budget; this is still less than parity with Nassau despite our larger ridership; Nassau receives a greater share as the STOA formula provides more funding for mileage than ridership	Increase Westchester County's STOA to provide financial parity with Nassau County's transit assistance. Westchester County's ridership and number of buses is significantly higher than Nassau's, but Westchester receives less aid due to the way the aid formula is structured.
7	Budgetary	Urge Governor Hochul to set aside emergency funding to address massive cuts to New York's essential victims' services			FY21 Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funding is \$140M less than FY18. Cuts of 10-15% have been proposed for FY22-23. Potential relief if Governor uses emergency funding process to dedicate a portion of the state's surplus to address these cuts or ARPA funding to maintain services at current levels for next two year cycle
8	Budgetary	Allow Westchester County to set its own gun permit fees		New Request S6659 (Mayer)/A7939 (Otis) of 2021-2022	Westchester noted that its gun permit fees are dramatically lower than those of surrounding counties, and asked for authority to manage them locally going forwards. Senator Mayer and Assemblyman Otis sponsored legislation providing this authority last year.

Heavily trafficked sections of Route 9A, such as the stretch between Briarcliff and Ossining, see more than 40,000 vehicles every day with high number of accidents along this stretch (120 accidents occurred in 2018, or one every three days). Primarily as a result of outdated, unsafe infrastructure that is nearly ninety years old that is ill-equipped to accommodate large commercial vehicles, with narrow shoulders, low-clearance underpasses, and general design deficiencies which pose a significant risk to motorists. This bill will requires NYSDOT to study, at minimum, costs of new guardrails, underpass renovations, and the impact of improvements on local traffic and environment, and report its findings to governor and legislature.

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8	State Del Support	Exempt diapers from all sales and use taxes	A8528 - Sayegh (Galef, Paulin) S8033 - Bailey	Assembly - Ways and Means Senate - Budget and Revenue	Diapers are often a very large, if not the largest expense for both parents caring for infants, as well as for seniors. Whilst the state has decided effective April 1, 2006 that adult and children's diapers (including disposable) are exempt from the New York State 4% sales tax, there are multiple counties/jurisdictions which do not provide for the local exemption. This bill would therefore ensure that specifically adult and children's diapers (including disposable) are not subject to this tax by the counties/jurisdictions and follow the state exemption.
9	State Del Support	Use updated census numbers used to calculate certain education funding	A8533 - Sayegh (Galef) S7681 - Jackson	Assembly - Education Senate - Education	Provides for more equitable funding to school districts by using more up to date census figures
