Dear Members of the Board of Legislators:

In a continuing effort to maximize federal funding to the County, I hereby request that you enact the attached Act which would:

- Authorize the filing an application to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") for approximately \$5,325,000 from three federal sources: Community Development Block Grant ("CDBG") funds, the HOME Investment Partnership Program ("HOME") and the Emergency Solutions Grant ("ESG") Program;
- 2) Authorize the County to submit to HUD an amendment to the Five Year FY 2019-2023 Consolidated Plan (the "Plan") consisting of an Action Plan for Fiscal Year 2021 consistent with the requirements of federal regulations. Your Board, by Act No. 2018-86 authorized the County to enter into cooperation agreements non-entitlement municipalities to participate in the programs as the first step in qualifying these municipalities to receive these funds during Fiscal Year 2021 (May 1, 2021, to April 30, 2022).

Development of the Plan began on a local level and has included extensive citizen participation. Municipalities were required to hold local hearings on their project submissions.

The Plan has been developed in consultation with members of the County Planning Board, Westchester Urban County Council and the Community Development Advisory Group, and has been the subject of a public comment period. The federal award will provide approximately \$4,000,000 from CDBG, \$1,000,000 from HOME and \$325,000 from ESG. For your information, one original and two (2) copies of the Plan and the FY 2021 Action Plan's Project Listings are submitted herewith.

Please note, I have been advised that the Planning Department has determined that under the State Environmental Quality Review Act Regulations, your Board is not required to make any determinations because this legislation is a "Type II" action. As you know, your Board may use such expert advice to make its own conclusion.

In past years, the County has received over \$229 million of non-repayable Federal funding to undertake activities such as housing rehabilitation, public improvements in designated target areas, code enforcement, and a complete array of community development activities on behalf of the municipalities participating in the program. Approval of submission of the application must occur prior to the expected March 15, 2021 submittal to HUD.

Your Honorable Board, by Act No. 2018-86, authorized the County to enter into Cooperation Agreements with no-entitlement municipalities to participate in the programs, as the first step in qualifying these municipalities to receive these funds during Fiscal Year 2021 (May 1, 2021, to April 30, 2022).

The Plan has been developed in consultation with members of the County Planning Board, Westchester Urban County Council and the Community Development Advisory Group, and has been subject to public comment on a local level before project application submissions, and on a County level as a whole Plan. The Federal award will provide approximately \$4,000,000 from CDBG, \$1,000,000 from HOME and \$325,000 from ESG, subject to the approval of a 2021 appropriations bill by Congress. One original and two (2) copies of the FY 2021 Plan's project Listings have been submitted with the proposed Act.

Please note, your Committee has been advised that the Planning Department has determined that under the State Environmental Quality Review Act Regulations, your Board is not required to make any determination because this legislation is a "Type II" action. Your Committee concurs with this conclusion.

In past years, the County has received over \$229 million of non-repayable federal funding to undertake activities such as housing rehabilitation, public improvements in

designated target areas, code enforcement, and a complete array of community development activities on behalf of the municipalities participating in the program.



**PLAN** 

**PROJECT/ACTION:** Filing of an application to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for funds from the Community Development Block Grant Program, the HOME Investment Partnership Program and the Emergency Solutions Grant Program. Also, submission of an amendment to the FY 2019-2023 Consolidated Plan to HUD including the Action Plan for FY 2021 for the County's administration of HUD funds.

With respect to the State Environmental Quality Review Act and its implementing regulations 6 NYCRR Part 617, the Planning Department recommends that no further environmental review is required because the project/action:

DOES NOT MEET THE DEFINITION OF AN "ACTION" AS DEFINED UNDER SECTION 617.2(b)
MAY BE CLASSIFIED AS TYPE II PURSUANT TO SECTION 617.5(c)(26): routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment.

**COMMENTS:** The submission of a Consolidated Plan every five years and an Action Plan every year are prerequisite routine administrative procedures that are required by HUD in order for the County to administer HUD funds for housing and community development programs. Environmental reviews are conducted for the specific projects in the annual Action Plan at the time that they are to be funded. Funds will not be released by HUD until all environmental review requirements pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act have been met. Additionally, environmental reviews pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act will also be undertaken prior to state or local approvals for each individual project where applicable.

BE IT ENACTED BY the Board of Legislators by the County of Westchester as follows:

Section 1. The County of Westchester (the "County") is hereby authorized to file an application, including all understandings and assurances contained therein and an amendment to the FY 2019-2023 Consolidated Plan, including an Action Plan for Fiscal Year 2021, as required by Federal regulations, as an Urban County, to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for the purpose of undertaking a Community Development Program pursuant to the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 as amended, and the Housing and Urban/Rural Recovery Act of 1983.

Section 2. The County is hereby authorized to receive a grant of approximately \$5,325,000 from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for the purpose of implementing the Community Development Program.

Section 3. The County Executive, or his authorized designee, is hereby authorized and empowered to take all action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the purposes of this Act.

Section 4. This Act shall take effect immediately.

This matter arises out of a pedestrian knockdown accident which occurred on January 6, 2015, at approximately 9:45 a.m. at the intersection of Nepperhan Avenue and South Broadway, in the City of Yonkers. The plaintiff was crossing Nepperhan Avenue with the pedestrian walk signal in his favor and within the painted crosswalk, walking in a southerly direction. The bus driver was on South Broadway facing south with a green light, waiting within the intersection due to opposing vehicle traffic before making a left turn from South Broadway onto Nepperhan Avenue. While waiting, the driver heard and saw fire trucks approaching the intersection from her right with lights and sirens activated. **DECISION & ORDER** 

In an action to recover damages for personal injuries, the plaintiff moves for summary judgment, pursuant to CPLR 3212, on the issue of liability:

## Factual and Procedural Background

On January 6, 2015, the plaintiff, a pedestrian, was struck by a bus operated by the defendant Vikki E. Chafouleas and owned by the defendants County of Westchester, Westchester County Department of Transportation, and Department of Public Works and Transportation. The accident occurred as plaintiff was crossing Nepperhan Avenue within the crosswalk and the bus was attempting to make a left turn onto South Broadway.

Plaintiff testified that at the corner of Nepperhan Avenue, he waited for the light to turn and for the walk signal. Once the light turned and the walk signal was in his favor, plaintiff proceeded across the street within the crosswalk. He crossed the westbound lanes of Nepperhan Avenue and reached the median. He continued walking across the eastbound lanes of Nepperhan Avenue when he was struck by a Liberty Lines bus. Plaintiff did not hear any sirens as he was crossing the street.

Chafouleas testified that she stopped the bus at a red light on South Broadway with the intention of turning left onto Nepperhan Avenue. The bus was the first vehicle at

the light. When the light turned green, she waited for traffic to clear and began to make a left turn. As she began to make the left turn, while in the intersection, she heard sirens. Chafouleas testified that she tried to get out of the way of the fire truck by making a wide left turn. Chafouleas then heard contact between the plaintiff and the mirror of the bus. She had observed the plaintiff step off the sidewalk into the crosswalk when the light changed.

Plaintiff now moves for partial summary judgment on the issue of liability. Plaintiff submits video surveillance of the accident obtained from the City of Yonkers. In opposition, defendants argue that Chafouleas was faced with an emergency situation.

### Discussion

The proponent of a motion for summary judgment must make a prima facie showing of entitlement to judgment as a matter of law, tendering sufficient evidence to eliminate any material issues of fact from the case (see Winegrad v N.Y. Univ. Med. Ctr., 64 NY2d 851, 853 [1985]; Zuckerman v City of New York, 49 NY2d 557, 562 [1980]). Failure to make such showing requires denial of the motion, regardless of the sufficiency of the opposing papers (see Winegrad v N.Y. Univ. Med. Ctr., 64 NY2d at 853).

"Once this showing has been made, however, the burden shifts to the party opposing the motion for summary judgment to produce evidentiary proof in admissible form sufficient to establish the existence of material issues of fact which require a trial of the action" (*Alvarez v Prospect Hosp.*, 68 NY2d 320, 324 [1986]; see *Zuckerman v City of New York*, 49 NY2d at 562). Mere conclusions, expressions of hope or unsubstantiated allegations or assertions are insufficient to defeat a prima facie showing of entitlement to summary judgment (see *Zuckerman v New York*, 49 NY2d at 562).

Vehicle and Traffic Law 1146(a) provides, in pertinent part, that notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the contrary, every driver of a vehicle shall exercise due care to avoid colliding with any pedestrian upon any roadway and shall give warning by sounding the horn when necessary (see Vehicle and Traffic Law § 1146[a]). Here, the plaintiff established, prima facie, his entitlement to judgment as a matter of law on the issue of liability by presenting proof that he was walking within a crosswalk and that he looked for approaching traffic before he began to cross the street (see Hamilton v Kong, 93 AD3d 821 [2d Dept 2012]).

In opposition, defendant failed to raise a triable issue of fact. "The emergency doctrine acknowledges that when an actor is confronted with a sudden and unanticipated situation which leaves little or no time for deliberation and requires him to make a speedy decision without weighing alternative courses of conduct, the actor may not be liable for negligence if the actions taken are reasonable and prudent when evaluated in the context of the emergency conditions" (Wu Kai Ming v Grossman, 133 AD3d 742, 742 [2d Dept 2015]; Aiken v Liotta, 167 AD3d 826, 827 [2d Dept 2018]). Viewing the evidence in the light most favorable to the defendants, including the video surveillance, defendants failed to raise an issue of fact that the emergency doctrine is applicable or that Chafouleas'

actions were reasonable and prudent since she observed the plaintiff in the crosswalk prior to making the left-hand turn.

Accordingly, the plaintiff's motion for summary judgment on the issue of liability is GRANTED.

Counsel for the remaining parties are directed to appear in the Settlement Conference Part, room 1600, on November 19, 2019, at 9:15 a.m. for further proceedings.

BOND ACT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$10,515,000 BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, OR SO MUCH THEREOF AS MAY BE NECESSARY, TO FINANCE THE COST OF ACQUISITION OF EQUIPMENT AND FURNISHINGS FOR VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS; STATING THE ESTIMATED TOTAL MAXIMUM COST THEREOF IS \$10,515,000; STATING THE PLAN OF FINANCING SAID COST INCLUDES THE ISSUANCE OF \$10,515,000 BONDS HEREIN AUTHORIZED TO FINANCE SUCH COST; AND PROVIDING FOR A TAX TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON SAID BONDS. (Adopted , 20\_\_\_)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF LEGISLATORS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK (by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the voting strength of said Board), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (the "Law"), the Westchester County Administrative Code, being Chapter 852 of the Laws of 1948, as amended, to the provisions of other laws applicable thereto, \$10,515,000 bonds of the County, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby authorized to be issued to finance the cost of the acquisition of equipment and furnishings for various departments comprised of the following capital projects:

BIT4C, BIT6D, BIT44, BIT47, BIT49, BIT54, BIT45, BDA02, BIT40; T0045, BLR2E and

B015E, all as set forth in the County's current year Capital Budget, as amended. The total estimated maximum cost of said objects or purposes, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof is \$10,515,000. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$10,515,000 bonds herein authorized, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds, and the levy of a tax to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds.

Section 2. The period of probable usefulness applicable to the objects or purposes for which the bonds authorized by this Act are to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 89 of the Law, is five (5) years.

Section 3. Current funds are not required to be provided as a down payment pursuant to Section 107.00 d. 9. of the Law prior to issuance of the bonds authorized herein, or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds. The County intends to finance, on an interim basis, the costs or a portion of the costs of said improvements for which bonds are herein authorized, which costs are reasonably expected to be reimbursed with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the County, pursuant to this Act, in the maximum amount of \$10,515,000. This Act is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to the requirements of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

Section 4. Subject to the provisions of this Act and of the Law, and pursuant to the provisions of §30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals thereof, and of §\$50.00, 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of said Law, the powers and duties of the County Board of Legislators relative to authorizing the issuance of any notes in

anticipation of the sale of the bonds herein authorized, or the renewals thereof, relative to providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, relative to prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the respective amounts of bonds herein authorized, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and relative to executing agreements for credit enhancement, are hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance of the County, as the chief fiscal officer of the County.

Section 5. Each of the bonds authorized by this Act and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale thereof shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by §52.00 of said Local Finance Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the County of Westchester, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the County. The faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and provision shall be made annually in the budgets of the County by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the notes and bonds to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this Act and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

(a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the County is not authorized to expend money, or

(b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this Act or a summary hereof, are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity, is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 7. This Act shall take effect not earlier than January 1, 2021 and in accordance with Section 107.71 of the Westchester County Charter.
