1. <u>RES-2024-45</u> <u>PH-Emergency Contracts</u>

Ms. Altschiller discussed the changes she made to the legislation pursuant to the legislators' requests at the last meeting. She said that the law will now provide that "No emergency contract shall have a term in excess of one year, provided, however, that if additional time is necessary, as determined by the County Executive, or duly authorized designee, an emergency contract may be extended for up to two additional one-year terms, provided that an extension may be up to one year and no longer, and each one-year extension shall be subject to the approval of the Board of Acquisition and Contract."

She noted that she added a new §2 of the law, providing that "A new Section 233.03 is hereby added to the Laws of Westchester County to read as follows: Sec. 233.03. - Yearly Report to

the County Board ... For each emergency contract, such report shall identify the name of the relevant county department(s), contractor(s), date of execution, purpose, term, project status updates, and, if applicable, why the emergency contract was extended and when such extension was executed."

Chair Williams Johnson said the BOL's Director of Finance suggested that the report should also indicate the source of the funding for these contracts. Ms. Altschiller said she will add that requirement to the committee report and the legislation. With a motion by Legislator Woodson-Samuels seconded by Legislator Barr, the committee voted to amend the legislation to include that language. The vote passed unanimously.

The amount of the exemption is calculated based upon the annual income of the applicant. Applicants who make more than the threshold limit contained in those Chapters are not entitled to an exemption.
