Transmitted herewith for your review and approval are three bond acts (the "Bond Acts") which, if adopted, would authorize the County of Westchester (the "County") to issue bonds to finance the

Your Committee is in receipt of a transmittal from the County Executive recommending approval of a bond act (the "Bond Act") in the total aggregate amount of \$1,100,000 to authorize the County of Westchester (the "County") to finance the following two (2) capital projects:

RGP15 - General Infrastructure – Fuel Tank Replacement (2024-2028)

RGP16 - General Infrastructure – Roofing Systems (2024-2028)

Your Committee is advised that the Bond Act, prepared by the law firm of Harris Beach PLLP, would authorize the County to issue bonds in the total amount of \$1,100,000 to finance the study, design, construction management and construction associated with the following projects required by the Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation ("Department"), including:

- (i) Removal and/or replacement of fuel storage tanks and related distribution system piping, equipment, remediation and related infrastructure and site work for fuel tank systems located at Glenn Island Park, Muscoot Farm, Sprain Ridge Golf Course and other County parks. This study will consider the potential for transitioning to alternative energy infrastructure where possible and practical.
- (ii) Repair and/or replacement of existing roofs and associated building renovations and site work at the Lenoir Preserve (Maintenance Garage), Macy Park (Astapycyk Residence), Croton Point Park (Recreation Hall) and other building roofs in the County Park System.

Your Committee is advised that the anticipated cost estimates, anticipated project timeline, and whether the design is anticipated to be undertaken in-house or by consultants for each capital

project is set forth below:

It is hoped that by combining projects that have the same objects and purposes into a single bond act, the County can dramatically reduce the amount of bond legislation that your Honorable Board would be required to review, thereby expediting the approval process and avoiding backlogs.

Your Committee is further advised that the County Budget Department is submitting the proposed Bond Act to your Honorable Board simultaneously with the proposed 2024 Capital Budget. It is the County's goal to submit the proposed Bond Act now so that the referenced projects will be ready to proceed without delay in early 2024.

The Planning Department has advised your Committee that based on its review, the above-referenced capital projects may be classified as a Type "II" action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQR") and its implementing regulations, 6 NYCRR Part 617. Therefore, no environmental review is required. Your Committee has reviewed the annexed SEQR documentation and concurs with this recommendation.

It should be noted that an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of your

Honorable Board is required in order to adopt the Bond Act.	Your Committee recommends the

With respect to the State Environmental Quality Review Act and its implementing regulations 6 NYCRR Part 617, the Planning Department recommends that no environmental review is required for the proposed action, because the project or component of the project for which funding is requested may be classified as a **TYPE II action** pursuant to section(s):

- 617.5(c)(2): replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction of a structure or facility, in kind, on the same site, including upgrading buildings to meet building, energy, or fire codes unless such action meets or exceeds any of the thresholds in section 617.4 of this Part;
- 617.5(c)(27): conducting concurrent environmental, engineering, economic, feasibility and other studies and preliminary planning and budgetary processes necessary to the formulation of a proposal for action, provided those activities do not commit the agency to commence, engage in or approve such action.

COMMENTS: The initial work involves a study of existing fuel tanks at park facilities, which may be classified as Type II. Subsequent work will involve the design and construction for the replacement of existing fuel storage and dispensing systems to meet current regulations and policies, including bringing underground tanks above ground in the same vicinity or within the developed areas of an existing maintenance yard, which may also be classified as Type II. However, any work involving construction in new or undeveloped areas or involving new off-site infrastructure would require further environmental review prior to authorizing construction.

ACT NO. -20

BOND ACT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,100,000 BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, OR SO MUCH THEREOF AS MAY BE NECESSARY, TO FINANCE THE COST OF GENERAL INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS, RECREATION & CONSERVATION; STATING THE ESTIMATED TOTAL MAXIMUM COST THEREOF IS \$1,100,000; STATING THE PLAN OF FINANCING SAID COST INCLUDES THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,100,000 BONDS HEREIN AUTHORIZED TO FINANCE SUCH COST; AND PROVIDING FOR A TAX TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON SAID BONDS. (Adopted , 20)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF LEGISLATORS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK (by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the voting strength of said Board), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (the "Law"), the Westchester County Administrative Code, being Chapter 852 of the Laws of 1948, as amended, to the provisions of other laws applicable thereto, \$1,100,000 bonds of the County, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby authorized to be issued to finance the cost of general infrastructure improvements for the Department of Parks, Recreation & Conservation, including (a) the study, design, construction management, and construction associated with the removal,

and/or replacement of fuel storage tanks and related distribution system piping, equipment, remediation and related infrastructure and site work for fuel tank systems located at Glenn Island Park, Muscoot Farm, Sprain Ridge Golf Course and other County Parks (Project ID RGP15), at the estimated maximum cost of \$600,000 and (b) the design, construction management, and construction associated with the repair and/or replacement of existing roofs and associated building renovations and site work at the Lenoir Preserve (Maintenance Garage), Macy Park (Astapycyk Residence), Croton Point Park (Recreation Hall) and other building roofs in the County Park System (Project ID RGP16), at the estimated maximum cost of \$500,000, all as set forth in the County's current year Capital Budget, as amended. The total estimated maximum cost of said objects or purposes, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof is \$1,100,000. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$1,100,000 bonds herein authorized, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds, and the levy of a tax to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds.

- Section 2. The following additional matters are hereby determined and stated:
- (a) The period of probable usefulness applicable to the specific objects or purposes for which \$600,000 bonds authorized by Section 1(a) in this resolution are to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 5 of the Local Finance Law, is thirty (30) years.
- (b) The period of probable usefulness applicable to the specific objects or purposes for which \$500,000 bonds authorized by Section 1(b) in this resolution are to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 12(a)(2) of the Local Finance Law, is fifteen (15) years.

Section 3. Current funds are not required to be provided as a down payment pursuant to Section 107.00 d. 9. of the Law prior to issuance of the bonds authorized herein, or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds. The County intends to finance, on an interim basis, the costs or a portion of the costs of said improvements for which bonds are herein authorized, which costs are reasonably expected to be reimbursed with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the County, pursuant to this Act, in the maximum amount of \$1,100,000. This Act is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to the requirements of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

Section 4. Subject to the provisions of this Act and of the Law, and pursuant to the provisions of §30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals thereof, and of §§50.00, 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of said Law, the powers and duties of the County Board of Legislators relative to authorizing the issuance of any notes in anticipation of the sale of the bonds herein authorized, or the renewals thereof, relative to providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, relative to prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the respective amounts of bonds herein authorized, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and relative to executing agreements for credit enhancement, are hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance of the County, as the chief fiscal officer of the County.

Section 5. Each of the bonds authorized by this Act and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale thereof shall contain the recital of validity

prescribed by §52.00 of said Local Finance Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the County of Westchester, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the County. The faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and provision shall be made annually in the budgets of the County by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the notes and bonds to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

- Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this Act and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:
 - (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the County is not authorized to expend money, or
 - (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this Act or a summary hereof, are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity, is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 7. This Act shall take effect in accordance with Section 107.71 of the Westchester County Charter.

HONORABLE BOARD OF LEGISLATORS THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK

Your Committee is in receipt of an amended bond act ("Amended Bond Act") of the County of Westchester ("County") authorizing amendment to prior Bond Act No. 219-2021 to remove a \$50,000 portion of the authorization allocable to components of Capital Project RCC17 – County Center Facility Improvements ("RCC17"), and to decrease the authorization of said Bond Act No. 219-2021 attributable to RCC17 by \$50,000, to a new total decreased authorization of \$13,650,000.

The Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation ("Department") has advised your Committee that the County Center roof is in poor condition and in need of replacement. The existing roof is leaking in several places and has exceeded its life expectancy. RCC17 will fund the complete roof replacement and underlayment including roof deck repairs, waterproofing, stucco wall repairs, eaves, gutters and downspouts, and all other associated building renovations. The Department has advised that this infrastructure repair is critical to the safe operation of the park facility.

Design is currently being undertaken by in-house staff and is expected to be completed by the first quarter of 2024. It is estimated that construction will take twelve months to complete and will begin after award and execution of the construction contracts.

It should be noted that your Honorable Board has authorized the County to issue bonds in connection with RCC17 as indicated in the annexed fact sheet and as follows: Bond Act No. 219-2021, in relevant part, authorized the County to issue bonds to finance design and construction management for restoration and modification of the County Center. These bonds have not been sold. Accordingly, it is now requested that Bond Act No. 219-2021 be amended to decrease the amount authorized and attributable to RCC17 by \$50,000, for a total authorized amount, as amended, of \$13,650,000.

A separate, concurrent requests seeks approval of a Bond Act to authorize the County to

issue bonds to finance design and construction for RCC17 in the total amount of \$10,050,000,

which includes the \$50,000 authorization proposed to be removed from Bond Act No. 219-2021.

Your Committee is advised that as was initiated last year, the County Budget Department is

submitting this Design and Construction to your Honorable Board simultaneously with the

proposed 2024 Capital Budget. It is the County's goal to submit this Amended Bond Act now so

that the referenced projects will be ready to proceed without delay in early 2024.

The Planning Department has advised your Committee that based on its review, RCC17

may be classified as a Type "II" action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act

("SEQR") and its implementing regulations, 6 NYCRR Part 617. Therefore, no environmental

review is required. Your Committee has reviewed the annexed SEQR documentation and concurs

with this recommendation.

Your Committee has carefully considered the Amended Bond Act, and recommends

approval of the Amended Bond Act. It should be noted that an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the

members of your Honorable Board is required in order to adopt the Amended Bond Act.


