This bond act is to fund two projects: Capital Project B035E-Equipment Acquisition Program (associated with the Department of Public Works and Transportation) and Capital Project RGP13-General Infrastructure-Equipment Acquisition (associated with the Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation). The equipment requested for both projects allows for these departments to continue fulfilling their roles and providing maintenance throughout different facilities in the County. There are no financially reasonable alternatives for energy efficient vehicles which is why they are leaning towards diesel fueled vehicles, though they are not turning away from the idea for the future.

The current historical 100-year old bridge needs to be completely reconstructed as it has worn out components. The funding amendment of \$5.175 million was previously authorized for the design portion, while the remainder of the \$58 million will go towards construction, construction management and a temporary moveable bridge. The moveable bridge will allow two ways of traffic along with having a walking or biking area on the sides as well, while the old bridge can stay open while they replace the machinery, without any traffic. One of the final steps remaining for this project is to accept the easement from New York State which encompasses the project area. After its reparations, the draw bridge will have a span of about 50 years.
