MINUTES APPROVAL

1. <u>2024-473</u> <u>PH - Amend Ground Lease Agreement with White Plains Aviation</u> Partners

Mr. Nonna, Ms. MacLeod, Mr. Adin, and Joan McDonald, Director of Operations for the County Executive's office, discussed the items with the committee. Mr. Nonna provided the history and prior motion practice for the lease amendment and settlement. Mr. Nonna said that the amendment to the lease will provide that 1) the T25 hanger will be used for light general aviation, 2) Million Air will have 39 tie down spaces, and 3) the County will provide Million Air with 35 parking spaces, for which they will pay additional rent. He further explained that Million Air is required to do storm water improvements on the parking area.

Ms. McDonald explained that Million Air and the FAA have agreed to move forward with a standard environmental assessment on only the built hanger and built terminal (which should have been done in 2017 before anything was built).

Legislator Barr noted that Million Air has also made several false claims. She noted that when the current administration said that Million Air could not build an additional 70,000 square foot hangar pursuant to the lease, Million Air's CEO came before the legislators and claimed that the T hangar needed to be torn down because it was in irreparable condition, and could not be used for light GA or anything else. She stressed that at that time, Million Air was using the hangar for storage, which is not permissible because it is not aeronautical use. She said that they also claimed that there was a grading to the land surrounding the T hangar that made it impossible for light GA to operate there, and that there was no real demand to park at that hangar, since most of the light GA planes were parking somewhere else.

Legislator Barr said that the chair of the AAB said that the building is in fine shape for light GA if the stored items were removed, there was in fact demand for parking inside the hangar, and there was no property grading issue, which was confirmed when legislators saw the hangar themselves.

With a motion by Legislator Imamura seconded by Legislator Woodson-Samuels, the committee voted unanimously to go into executive session to discuss legal advice at 3:22 p.m. With a motion by Legislator Imamura seconded by Legislator Woodson-Samuels, the committee voted unanimously to come out of executive session at 4:10 p.m.

Legislator Pierce noted that the SEQRA states that "parking lot reconstruction requirements will reduce storm water runoff from impervious surfaces that were added without storm water management. Porous pavement will infiltrate runoff to meet the runoff reduction requirements." She wanted the Planning Department to correct the SEQRA to clarify that this work has already been done. She also requested that someone from DPW appear at the next meeting

to provide more detail regarding the storm water work that was done.
