Request for Authorization to Settle the Lawsuit of Guzman et al. v. County of Westchester, et al., pending in the Supreme Court of the State of New York, Putnam County Index No. 500558/2023

Dear Honorable Members of the Board:

Attached for your consideration is an Act which, if enacted by your Board, would authorize the settlement of the lawsuit entitled *Guzman et al. v. County of Westchester et al.*, as set forth below.

As you are aware, this action challenges Local Law 18-2022, which enacted the Existing Redistricting Plan adopted by your Board in December 2022. This action alleges that certain legislative districts enacted in the Existing Redistricting Plan violate certain rules set forth in sections 10 and 34 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law ("MHRL"). This action names your Board, the County, the Board of Elections and its commissioners, the County Executive, and several individual legislators as respondents.

On behalf of the County, your Board, the County Executive, and several individual legislators, this Office, with the assistance of the firm of Cuti Hecker Wang LLP, has taken the position that the Existing Redistricting Plan is in full compliance with the MHRL and that the petition is without merit.

Legislators Cunzio and Nolan, represented by separate counsel, have taken the position that the petitioners are correct and that the Existing Redistricting Plan violates the MHRL. They have also filed a cross-petition seeking payment of their attorneys' fees for supporting the petition in this action. The Board of Elections and its commissioners have taken no position in this action.

Prior to trial commencing in this matter, the parties engaged in extensive settlement negotiations to see if a resolution could be reached that, first and foremost, complied with and advanced the goals of the MHRL, and that would satisfy all the litigants in this action. We believe the proposed settlement being submitted for your approval does so.

The proposed settlement would result in modifying the Existing Redistricting Plan. Specifically, the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan makes changes to five districts—3, 5, 14, 15, and 17. The proposed changes improve the overall compliance with the MHRL and are therefore legally appropriate modifications.

In brief, the proposed modifications are as follows: most of a single election district currently in District 5 will be moved to District 3. This change will reduce the population deviations of these districts from the ideal district, furthering the goals of the MHRL. No other changes are being made to these two districts. Districts 14 and 15 will be swapping certain election districts in Yonkers and Mount Vernon. This will advance the MHRL by increasing core retention, removing a split of a municipal boundary, and ensuring compact districts. Further, a small portion of District 17 will be moved to District 14, in order to equalize population and increase compactness.

The proposed settlement also contains provisions that, if a future challenge is brought against the redistricting plan, no legislator will take a position against the adopted maps, which would alleviate any future cross-petitions regarding payment of counsel fees.

The proposed settlement does not, however resolve the pending application by Legislators Cunzio and Nolan for attorneys' fees in this action. That matter is fully briefed before the Supreme Court, and the settlement agreement allows the Court to make an ultimate determination on that question. We are confident in the County's position on that matter, and do not believe that it should be an impediment to settlement.

The proposed modifications to the Existing Redistricting Plan appear to be fair, balanced, and in compliance with the requirements of the MHRL. Entering into this settlement would remove the risks and uncertainty inherent in going to trial, and we believe that it would be in the best interests of the County to enter into this settlement.

Therefore, we are requesting that this Board approve the accompanying Act authorizing the settlement of all remaining claims in the action Guzman et al. v. County of Westchester et al. We note that there is also a companion Local Law being submitted herewith amending the Existing Redistricting Plan adopted in 2022 that would need to be enacted as part of the settlement process.

BOARD OF LEGISLATORS COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER

Your Committee is in receipt of a proposed Act which, if enacted by your Board, would authorize the settlement of the lawsuit entitled *Guzman et al. v. County of Westchester et al.*, as set forth below.

This action challenges Local Law 18-2022, which enacted the Existing Redistricting Plan adopted by in December 2022. This action alleges that certain legislative districts enacted in the Existing Redistricting Plan violate certain rules set forth in sections 10 and 34 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law ("MHRL").

Your Committee is informed that, prior to trial commencing in this matter, the parties engaged in extensive settlement negotiations to see if a resolution could be reached that, first and foremost, complied with and advanced the goals of the MHRL, and that would satisfy all the litigants in this action.

Your Committee is further informed that the proposed settlement would result in modifying the Existing Redistricting Plan. Specifically, the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan makes changes to five districts—3, 5, 14, 15, and 17. The proposed changes improve the overall compliance with the MHRL and are therefore legally appropriate modifications.

Your Committee is aware that the proposed modifications are as follows: most of a single election district currently in District 5 will be moved to District 3. This change will reduce the population deviations of these districts from the ideal district, furthering the goals of the MHRL. No

other changes are being made to these two districts. Districts 14 and 15 will be swapping certain election districts in Yonkers and Mount Vernon. This will advance the MHRL by increasing core retention, removing a split of a municipal boundary, and ensuring compact districts. Further, a small portion of District 17 will be moved to District 14, in order to equalize population and increase compactness. Your Committee notes that greater detail and information can be found in the accompanying Local Law that would actually modify the districts.

Your Committee further notes that the proposed settlement also contains provisions that, if a future challenge is brought against the redistricting plan, no legislator will take a position against the adopted maps, which would alleviate any future cross-petitions regarding payment of counsel fees.

Your Committee is aware that the proposed settlement does not resolve the pending application by Legislators Cunzio and Nolan for attorneys' fees in this action. The County Attorney has informed your Committee that the question is fully briefed before the Supreme Court, and the settlement agreement allows the Court to make an ultimate determination on that question. The County Attorney has also stated that he confident in the County's position on that matter, and does not believe that it should be an impediment to settlement.

Upon your Committee's review, the proposed modifications to the Existing Redistricting Plan appear to be fair, balanced, and in compliance with the requirements of the MHRL. Entering into this settlement would remove the risks and uncertainty inherent in going to trial, and we believe that it would be in the best interests of the County to enter into this settlement.

Your Committee further notes that the proposed settlement only requires this Board to

consider the modifications to the Existing Redistricting Plan. If the Board ultimately does not decide

to adopt those modifications, then the settlement would be rendered void and the matter would

proceed. The Local Law submitted by the County Attorney contemporaneously with this Act would

be required to finalize and fully effectuate the settlement.

The County Attorney has recommended that the County accept this settlement as a fair and

equitable resolution of this action. Your Committee concurs with this recommendation and

recommends that this Honorable Board adopt the proposed Act.

ACT NO. 2023

AN ACT authorizing the County Attorney to settle the lawsuit of Guzman et al. v. County of Westchester, et al., pending in the Supreme Court of the State of New York, Putnam County Index No. 500558/2023

BE IT ENACTED by the County Board of Legislators of the County of Westchester as follows:

Section 1. The County Attorney is hereby authorized to settle the lawsuit of *Guzman et al. v. County of Westchester, et al.*, pending in the Supreme Court of the State of New York, Putnam County Index No. 500558/2023, for terms that result in the dismissal of this action, other than an application for attorneys' fees by Respondents Cunzio and Nolan, if this Board adopts Local Law Intro. No. 2023-246.

Section 2. The County Attorney or his designee is hereby authorized to execute and deliver all documents and take such actions as the County Attorney deems necessary or desirable to accomplish the purposes hereof.

Section 3. This Act shall take effect immediately.

TO: BOARD OF LEGISLATORS COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER

Your Committee recommends passage of "A LOCAL LAW amending Section 107.31 of the Laws of Westchester County regarding the County Board of Legislators' Districts 3, 5, 14, 15, and 17."

Your Committee understands that, pursuant to section 107.31 of the Laws of Westchester County, "[t]he County Board shall, if necessary, after each decennial federal census . . . adopt a local law amending . . . this section to prescribe County Board districts." In accordance with this section, following the 2020 Census, the County Board passed and the County Executive signed Local Law 18-2022 in December 2022, which established newly drawn legislative districts consistent with all applicable laws (the "Existing Redistricting Plan").

Your Committee is aware that in March 2023, a group of Petitioners filed a proceeding challenging the legality of the Existing Redistricting Plan, claiming that it violates certain redistricting rules set forth in sections 10 and 34 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law ("MHRL") and the New York State Constitution. See Guzman, et al. v. County of Westchester, et al., Index No. 500558/2023 (N.Y. Sup. Ct. Putnam County). The operative petition in Guzman alleges that the Existing Redistricting Plan modified Districts 3 and 15 in ways that unfairly benefit Democratic voters and candidates, and that disadvantage the Conservative and Republican incumbents. The County Respondents—including the County Board—have denied and continue to deny any allegations of wrongdoing or illegality in the passing, adoption, or configuration of the Existing Redistricting Plan.

¹ The proceeding was brought against the Westchester County Board of Legislators, the County of Westchester, the County Board Chair, Majority Leader, Majority Whip, Minority Leader, Minority Whip, the County Executive, and the County Board of Elections and its Commissioners, all in their official capacities.

Your Committee is informed that a settlement was reached, contingent upon the adoption of certain changes to Districts 3, 5, 14, 15, and 17, which are being considered in this Local Law, to ensure these districts advance neutral redistricting criteria as required by the MHRL. The details of the *Guzman* settlement can be found in the Act authorizing the County Attorney to settle the *Guzman* lawsuit, which is submitted contemporaneously with this proposed Local Law, and in the Settlement Agreement itself, which can be viewed on the *Guzman* court docket, Index No. 500558/2023, NYSCEF No. 61 (N.Y. Sup. Ct. Putnam Cnty.).

Upon review, your Committee finds that certain proposed changes to the Existing Redistricting Plan are consistent with the MHRL and actually improve Districts 3 and 15, as well as the surrounding Districts 5, 14, and 17 under the MHRL criteria, as set forth below. This proposed Local Law, which modifies those districts (the "Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan") furthers the redistricting goals set forth in Section 34 of the MHRL. Although only legislative Districts 3, 5, 14, 15, and 17 are affected by the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan, informational maps depicting all the County's legislative districts, consistent with the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan, are attached to this Committee Report for reference.

Your Committee understands that this Local Law amends the district lines for Districts 3 and 5 by moving most of Election District 1 in Harrison from District 5 to District 3. The portion that remains in District 5 is a function of the size of the remaining Census block, which spans three election districts and cannot be split under established redistricting rules.

Your Committee also understands that this Local Law amends the district lines for Districts 14, 15, and 17 in three ways. First, it returns four election districts in Mount Vernon—which had been part of District 14 in the redistricting plan established after the 2010 Census (the "Prior Redistricting Plan"), but which were moved to District 15 in the Existing Redistricting Plan—back to

District 14. Second, it returns certain election districts in Yonkers, which had been part of District 15 in the Prior Redistricting Plan but were moved to District 14 in the Existing Redistricting Plan, back to District 15. Third, it moves a small area from District 17 to District 14, for population equality reasons and to establish cleaner, more compact lines for the boundary between District 14 and District 17.

Your Committee has been informed that the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan that would be effected if this Local Law is enacted satisfies all the redistricting criteria set forth in the MHRL. Moreover, in certain respects, the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan furthers the criteria set forth in the MHRL.² First, the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan advances the MHRL priority of population equality. The newly proposed Districts 3 and 5 are significantly improved in this regard, relative Districts 3 and 5 in the Existing Redistricting Plan. In the Existing Redistricting Plan, District 3 is underpopulated, with a population deviation of -1.50% from the population of an ideal district. District 5 is among the most overpopulated districts in the Existing Redistricting Plan, with a population deviation of 2.16%. In the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan, the population deviation in District 3 improves to 1.19%. The population deviation in District 5 improves significantly, from 2.16% to -0.52%, which is among the smallest deviations anywhere in the plan. The populations of Districts 14, 15, and 17 in the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan are comparable in this regard to those in the Existing Redistricting Plan, and well within permissible population deviations—specifically, the population deviations in each changed district are less than +/- 2% of the ideal district population.

² This Committee Report highlights the benefits of the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan compared with the Existing Redistricting Plan. For a more exhaustive discussion of the merits of the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan, please refer to the Affirmation of A. Goldenberg, dated May 25, 2023, which may be viewed on the *Guzman* court docket, Index No. 500558/2023, NYSCEF No. 58 (N.Y. Sup. Ct. Putnam Cnty.).

Second, the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan advances the MHRL redistricting rule that "[d]istricts shall be as compact in form as practicable." As your Committee is aware, a significant priority for the County in enacting the Existing Redistricting Plan was to improve the compactness of legislative districts relative to the Prior Redistricting Plan created after the 2010 Census. Your Committee has been advised that, under the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan and using the widely cited and well-respected Polsby-Popper compactness test, the compactness of all the affected districts improves.

Third, the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan significantly improves core preservation relative to the Existing Redistricting Plan in Districts 14, 15, and 17. The changes to Districts 3 and 5 leave core retention virtually unchanged.

Fourth, the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan eliminates a municipal boundary split. In the Existing Redistricting Plan, Mount Vernon is split three ways—among District 13, District 14, and District 15. In the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan set forth in the attached Local Law, Mount Vernon is split only between Districts 13 and 14. The Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan does not create any new splits of municipal boundaries.

The final statutory requirement is that districts be formed to promote the orderly and efficient administration of elections. Your Committee has been informed that the County Board of Elections has reviewed the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan and has no objections on the grounds of election administration. The Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan specifically accounts for the election that is currently in progress and avoids changing any districts with primary elections in 2023. This will allow the primary elections currently scheduled for June 27, 2023, to proceed without interruption, and will avoid voter confusion or added expense in this year's elections.

Your Committee is of the opinion that the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan complies

with the MHRL, the New York State Constitution, the John R. Lewis Voting Rights Act of New York,

and the U.S. Constriction. The Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan improves upon the Existing

Redistricting Plan, complying with the laws while balancing the various interests as fairly as possible.

Your Committee is informed that the proposed project does not meet the definition of an

action under New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") and its implementing

regulations 6 NYCRR Part 617. Please refer to the memorandum from the Department of Planning,

dated January 12, 2023, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Legislators. Your Committee

concurs in this conclusion.

Your Committee, after careful consideration, recommends the adoption of this Local Law.

Section 2. All other legislative districts in Section 107.31(2) of the Laws of Westchester County remain unchanged and unaffected by this Local Law.

Section 3. This Local Law shall take effect immediately.

TO: BOARD OF LEGISLATORS COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER

Your Committee recommends passage of "A LOCAL LAW amending Section 107.31 of the Laws of Westchester County regarding the County Board of Legislators' Districts 3, 5, 14, 15, and 17."

Your Committee understands that, pursuant to section 107.31 of the Laws of Westchester County, "[t]he County Board shall, if necessary, after each decennial federal census . . . adopt a local law amending . . . this section to prescribe County Board districts." In accordance with this section, following the 2020 Census, the County Board passed and the County Executive signed Local Law 18-2022 in December 2022, which established newly drawn legislative districts consistent with all applicable laws (the "Existing Redistricting Plan").

Your Committee is aware that in March 2023, a group of Petitioners filed a proceeding challenging the legality of the Existing Redistricting Plan, claiming that it violates certain redistricting rules set forth in sections 10 and 34 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law ("MHRL") and the New York State Constitution. See Guzman, et al. v. County of Westchester, et al., Index No. 500558/2023 (N.Y. Sup. Ct. Putnam County). The operative petition in Guzman alleges that the Existing Redistricting Plan modified Districts 3 and 15 in ways that unfairly benefit Democratic voters and candidates, and that disadvantage the Conservative and Republican incumbents. The County Respondents—including the County Board—have denied and continue to deny any allegations of wrongdoing or illegality in the passing, adoption, or configuration of the Existing Redistricting Plan.

¹ The proceeding was brought against the Westchester County Board of Legislators, the County of Westchester, the County Board Chair, Majority Leader, Majority Whip, Minority Leader, Minority Whip, the County Executive, and the County Board of Elections and its Commissioners, all in their official capacities.

Your Committee is informed that a settlement was reached, contingent upon the adoption of certain changes to Districts 3, 5, 14, 15, and 17, which are being considered in this Local Law, to ensure these districts advance neutral redistricting criteria as required by the MHRL. The details of the *Guzman* settlement can be found in the Act authorizing the County Attorney to settle the *Guzman* lawsuit, which is submitted contemporaneously with this proposed Local Law, and in the Settlement Agreement itself, which can be viewed on the *Guzman* court docket, Index No. 500558/2023, NYSCEF No. 61 (N.Y. Sup. Ct. Putnam Cnty.).

Upon review, your Committee finds that certain proposed changes to the Existing Redistricting Plan are consistent with the MHRL and actually improve Districts 3 and 15, as well as the neighboring Districts 5, 14, and 17 under the MHRL criteria, as set forth below. This proposed Local Law, which modifies those districts (the "Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan") furthers the redistricting goals set forth in Section 34 of the MHRL. Although only legislative Districts 3, 5, 14, 15, and 17 are affected by the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan, informational maps depicting all the County's legislative districts, consistent with the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan, are attached to this Committee Report for reference.

Your Committee understands that this Local Law amends the district lines for Districts 3 and 5 by moving most of Election District 1 in Harrison from District 5 to District 3. The portion that remains in District 5 is a function of the size of the remaining Census block, which spans three election districts and cannot be split under established redistricting rules.

Your Committee also understands that this Local Law amends the district lines for Districts 14, 15, and 17 in three ways. First, it returns four election districts in Mount Vernon—which had been part of District 14 in the redistricting plan established after the 2010 Census (the "Prior Redistricting Plan"), but which were moved to District 15 in the Existing Redistricting Plan—back to

District 14. Second, it returns certain election districts in Yonkers, which had been part of District 15 in the Prior Redistricting Plan but were moved to District 14 in the Existing Redistricting Plan, back to District 15. Third, it moves a small area from District 17 to District 14, for population equality reasons and to establish cleaner, more compact lines for the boundary between District 14 and District 17.

Your Committee has been informed that the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan that would be effected if this Local Law is enacted satisfies all the redistricting criteria set forth in the MHRL. Moreover, in certain respects, the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan furthers the criteria set forth in the MHRL.² First, the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan advances the MHRL priority of population equality. The newly proposed Districts 3 and 5 are significantly improved in this regard, relative to Districts 3 and 5 in the Existing Redistricting Plan. In the Existing Redistricting Plan, District 3 is underpopulated, with a population deviation of -1.50% from the population of an ideal district. District 5 is among the most overpopulated districts in the Existing Redistricting Plan, with a population deviation of 2.16%. In the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan, the population deviation in District 3 improves to 1.19%. The population deviation in District 5 improves significantly, from 2.16% to -0.52%, which is among the smallest deviations anywhere in the plan. The populations of Districts 14, 15, and 17 in the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan are comparable in this regard to those in the Existing Redistricting Plan, and well within permissible population deviations—specifically, the population deviations in each changed district are less than +/- 2% of the ideal district population.

² This Committee Report highlights the benefits of the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan compared with the Existing Redistricting Plan. For a more exhaustive discussion of the merits of the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan, please refer to the Affirmation of A. Goldenberg, dated May 25, 2023, which may be viewed on the *Guzman* court docket, Index No. 500558/2023, NYSCEF No. 58 (N.Y. Sup. Ct. Putnam Cnty.).

Second, the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan advances the MHRL redistricting rule that "[d]istricts shall be as compact in form as practicable." As your Committee is aware, a significant priority for the County in enacting the Existing Redistricting Plan was to improve the compactness of legislative districts relative to the Prior Redistricting Plan created after the 2010 Census. Your Committee has been advised that, under the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan and using the widely cited and well-respected Polsby-Popper compactness test, the compactness of all the affected districts improves.

Third, the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan significantly improves core preservation relative to the Existing Redistricting Plan in Districts 14, 15, and 17. The changes to Districts 3 and 5 leave core retention virtually unchanged.

Fourth, the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan eliminates a municipal boundary split. In the Existing Redistricting Plan, Mount Vernon is split three ways—among District 13, District 14, and District 15. In the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan set forth in the attached Local Law, Mount Vernon is split only between Districts 13 and 14. The Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan does not create any new splits of municipal boundaries.

The final statutory requirement is that districts be formed to promote the orderly and efficient administration of elections. Your Committee has been informed that the County Board of Elections has reviewed the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan and has no objections on the grounds of election administration. The Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan specifically accounts for the election that is currently in progress and avoids changing any districts with primary elections in 2023. This will allow the primary elections currently scheduled for June 27, 2023, to proceed without interruption, and will avoid voter confusion or added expense in this year's elections.

Your Committee is of the opinion that the Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan complies

with the MHRL, the New York State Constitution, the John R. Lewis Voting Rights Act of New York,

and the U.S. Constitution. The Proposed Modified Redistricting Plan improves upon the Existing

Redistricting Plan, complying with these laws while balancing the various interests fairly.

Your Committee is informed that the proposed project does not meet the definition of an

action under New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") and its implementing

regulations 6 NYCRR Part 617. Please refer to the memorandum from the Department of Planning,

dated January 12, 2023, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Legislators. Your Committee

concurs in this conclusion.

Your Committee, after careful consideration, recommends the adoption of this Local Law.

TITLE OF BILL:

An act to amend the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to adjudications and owner liability for a violation of traffic-control signal indications in the county of Westchester; to amend the public officers law, in relation to accessing records; and providing for the repeal of certain provisions upon expiration thereof

PURPOSE:

This legislation will prevent reckless driving, reduce the number of accidents, while making the streets of Westchester County safer for drivers and pedestrians.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS:

Section 1. The vehicle and traffic law is amended by adding a new section 1111-g:

- § 2. Section 1803 of the vehicle and traffic law is amended by adding a new subdivision 13:
- § 3. Subdivision 2 of section 87 of the public officers law, is amended by adding a new paragraph (t):
- § 4. The purchase or lease of equipment for a demonstration program established pursuant to section 1111-g of the vehicle and traffic law shall be subject to the provisions of section 103 of the general municipal law § 5. Effective Date:

JUSTIFICATION:

Westchester County police have witnessed an uptick in drivers moving through red lights. The Red Light Camera program has shown effectiveness in other jurisdictions in reducing such incidents and promoting greater public safety. Westchester seeks the State's permission to implement a system at the traffic signals with the highest accident rates in order to dissuade drivers of unsafe driving habits.

EFFECTIVE DATE:

This act shall take effect on the thirtieth day after it shall have become a law and shall expire and be deemed repealed on December 1, 2027, provided, further, that any such local law as may be enacted.
