Dear Members of the Board of Legislators:

Transmitted herewith for your review and approval is an amended bond act ("Amended Bond Act"), which, if adopted by your Honorable Board, would authorize the County of Westchester ("County") to issue additional bonds to finance the following capital project:

BCR63 (3044) Post 2 Entrance Gate Booths ("BCR63").

The Amended Bond Act, in the total amount of \$1,050,000.00, which includes \$125,000.00 in previously authorized bonds of the County, would finance the construction of the replacement of the existing Post 2 entrance booth for the Department of Corrections ("Department"), including the preparation of preliminary plans and specifications and associated work such as plumbing, electrical, and exterior improvements.

The Department has advised that the existing booth must be replaced because it has been active for more than a decade and has developed a significant amount of rust in the floor framing and the steel floor plate. The plate floor has numerous patches spanning the rusted sections and these are unstable and failing. The rusting floor is also compromising the wall anchorage and the operation of the sliding doors.

The Department has further advised that plumbing, electrical pipes, and conduit(s) require upgrades to ensure continued compliance with health, safety, and electrical codes. The new booth will be enlarged from 12'-0" to 13'-6", to allow room for computers, screens, and the new data/fiber racks for communications.

In addition to the structural concerns and technology upgrades, BCR63 upgrades and improves the safety of the entire booth structure by upgrading it to a 'Ballistic Level 3' protection capability. This protection level will allow the entire new booth to resist hand pistols of 9 mm and 0.357 caliber projectiles, and some 9 mm rifles. Currently, 'Ballistic Level 3' protection is limited only to the existing booth's windows.

BCR63 also includes replacement of the existing booth's two outdated and malfunctioning 'traffic control' gates with related 'induction loops' in the roadway to provide reliable gate operation and updated control systems for the new booth's automatic gates.

The design phase for the project is currently being undertaken by in-house Department staff and is expected to be completed by the fourth quarter of 2025. Subsequently, the Department estimates

that the construction phase will take six months to complete and will begin after award and execution of the construction contracts.

It should be noted that your Honorable Board has authorized the County to issue bonds for BCR63 as follows: Bond Act No. 222 - 2024 in the amount of \$125,000.00 to finance the cost of design for the replacement of the existing Post 2 entrance booth for the Department. These bonds have not been sold. Accordingly, it is now requested that Bond Act No. 222 - 2024 be amended to increase the amount authorized by \$925,000.00, for a total authorized amount, as amended, of \$1,050,000.00, to revise the scope of Bond Act No. 222-2024 to include work associated with the construction phase of the project, and to increase the period of probable usefulness of said bonds.

Based on the importance of this project to the County, favorable action on the proposed Amended Bond Act is respectfully requested.

HONORABLE BOARD OF LEGISLATORS THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK

Your Committee is in receipt of a transmission from the County Executive recommending approval by the County of Westchester ("County") of an amended bond act ("Amended Bond Act") which, if adopted, will authorize the County to issue up to \$925,000.00 in additional bonds of the County to finance capital project BCR63 (3044) - Post 2 Entrance Gate Booths ("BCR63").

The Amended Bond Act in the total amount of \$1,050,000.00 was prepared by the law firm Hawkins, Delafield & Wood LLP and includes \$125,000.00 in previously authorized bonds of the County. The Bond Act would finance the construction of the replacement of the existing Post 2 entrance booth for the Department of Corrections ("Department"), including the preparation of preliminary plans and specifications and associated work such as plumbing, electrical, and exterior improvements.

Your Committee is advised that the existing booth must be replaced because it has been active for more than a decade and has developed a significant amount of rust in the floor framing and the steel floor plate. The plate floor has numerous patches spanning the rusted sections and these are unstable and failing. The rusting floor is also compromising the wall anchorage and the operation of the sliding doors.

Your Committee is further advised that plumbing, electrical pipes, and conduit(s) require upgrades to ensure continued compliance with health, safety, and electrical codes. The new booth will be enlarged from 12'-0" to 13'-6", to allow room for computers, screens, and the new data/fiber racks for communications.

In addition to the structural concerns and technology upgrades, BCR63 upgrades and improves the safety of the entire booth structure by upgrading it to a 'Ballistic Level 3' protection

BCR63 also includes replacement of the existing booth's two outdated and malfunctioning 'traffic control' gates with related 'induction loops' in the roadway to provide reliable gate operation and updated control systems for the new booth's automatic gates.

Your Committee is advised that the design phase for the project is currently being undertaken by in-house Department staff and is expected to be completed by the fourth quarter of 2025. Subsequently, the Department estimates that the construction phase will take six months to complete and will begin after award and execution of the construction contracts.

It should be noted that your Honorable Board has authorized the County to issue bonds for prior components of this capital project as follows: Bond Act No. 222 - 2024 in the amount of \$125,000.00, which financed the cost of design for the replacement of the existing Post 2 entrance booth for the Department. These bonds have not been sold. Accordingly, it is now requested that Bond Act No. 222 - 2024 be amended to increase the initial amount authorized by \$925,000.00, for a total authorized amount, as amended, of \$1,050,000.00, to revise the scope of Bond Act No. 222-2024 to include work associated with the construction phase of the project, and to increase the period of probable usefulness of said bonds.

The Planning Department has advised your Committee that based on its review, BCR63 may be classified as a Type "II" action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQR") and its implementing regulations, 6 NYCRR Part 617. Therefore, no environmental

review is required. Your Committee has reviewed the annexed SEQR documentation and concurs with this recommendation.

Your Committee has carefully considered the Amended Bond Act, and recommends approval of the Amended Bond Act. It should be noted that an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of your Honorable Board is required in order to adopt the Amended Bond Act.

BOND ACT OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK, AMENDING THE BOND ACT ADOPTED OCTOBER 21, 2024, IN RELATION TO THE REPLACEMENT OF THE EXISTING POST 2 ENTRANCE BOOTH FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS, AT THE MAXIMUM ESTIMATED COST OF \$1,050,000. (Adopted , 20).

WHEREAS, this Board has heretofore duly authorized the issuance of \$125,000 bonds to finance the cost of preparation of surveys, preliminary and detailed plans, specifications and estimates necessary for planning the replacement of the existing Post 2 entrance booth for the Department of Corrections, pursuant to Act No. 222-2024 duly adopted on October 21, 2024; and

WHEREAS, it is now appropriate to authorize such improvements, and it is necessary to increase the amount of bonds to be issued and the appropriation for such project for the estimated cost of such improvement;

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF LEGISLATOR'S OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK (by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the voting strength of said Board), AS FOLLOWS:

Section (A). The bond act duly adopted by this Board on October 21, 2024, entitled:

"ACT NO. 222-2024

BOND ACT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$125,000 BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, OR SO MUCH THEREOF AS MAY BE NECESSARY, TO FINANCE THE COST OF PREPARATION OF SURVEYS, PRELIMINARY AND DETAILED PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS AND ESTIMATES NECESSARY FOR PLANNING THE REPLACEMENT OF THE EXISTING POST 2 ENTRANCE BOOTH FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS, STATING THE ESTIMATED TOTAL COST THEREOF IS \$125,000; STATING THE PLAN OF FINANCING SAID COST INCLUDES THE ISSUANCE OF \$125,000 BONDS HEREIN AUTHORIZED; AND PROVIDING FOR A TAX TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON SAID BONDS."

is hereby amended to read as follows:

BOND ACT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,050,000 BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, OR SO MUCH THEREOF AS MAY BE NECESSARY, TO FINANCE THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE REPLACEMENT OF THE EXISTING POST 2 ENTRANCE BOOTH FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS, INCLUDING THE PREPARATION OF PRELIMINARY PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS, STATING THE ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST THEREOF IS \$1,050,000; STATING THE PLAN OF FINANCING SAID COST INCLUDES THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,050,000 BONDS HEREIN AUTHORIZED; AND PROVIDING FOR A TAX TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON SAID BONDS. (Adopted , 20____)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF LEGISLATORS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK (by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the voting strength of said Board), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (the "Law"), the Westchester County Administrative Code, being Chapter 852 of the Laws of 1948, as amended, and to the provisions of other laws applicable thereto; \$1,050,000 bonds of the County, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby authorized to be issued to finance the construction of the replacement of the existing Post 2 entrance booth for the Department of Corrections, including the preparation of preliminary plans and specifications and associated work such as plumbing, electrical and exterior improvements, all as set forth in the County's Current Year Capital Budget, as amended. To the extent that the details set forth in this act are inconsistent with any details set forth in the Current Year Capital Budget of the County, such Budget shall be deemed and is hereby amended. The estimated maximum cost of said specific object or purpose, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof is \$1,050,000. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$1,050,000 bonds herein authorized; and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds and the levy of a tax to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds and notes.

Section 2. The period of probable usefulness of said specific object or purpose, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 11(a)(1) of the Law, is thirty (30) years;

Section 3. Current funds are not required to be provided as a down payment pursuant to Section 107.00 d. 9. of the Law prior to issuance of the bonds authorized herein, or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds. The County intends to finance, on an interim basis, the costs or a portion of the costs of said improvements for which bonds are herein authorized, which costs are reasonably expected to be reimbursed with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the County, pursuant to this Act, in the maximum amount of

\$1,050,000. This Act is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to the requirements of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

Section 4. The estimate of \$1,050,000 as the estimated maximum cost of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is hereby approved.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this Act and of the Law, and pursuant to the provisions of §30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals thereof, and of §\$50.00, 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of said Law, the powers and duties of the County Board of Legislators relative to authorizing the issuance of any notes in anticipation of the sale of the bonds herein authorized, or the renewals thereof, relative to providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, relative to prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the respective amounts of bonds herein authorized, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and relative to executing agreements for credit enhancement, are hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance of the County, as the chief fiscal officer of the County.

Section 6. Each of the bonds authorized by this Act and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale thereof shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by §52.00 of said Local Finance Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the County of Westchester, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the County. The faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and provision shall be made annually in the budgets of the County by

appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the notes and bonds to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 7. The validity of the bonds authorized by this Act and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the County is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this Act or a summary hereof, are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity, is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 8. This Act shall take effect in accordance with Section 107.71 of the Westchester County Charter.

Section (B). The amendment of the bond act set forth in Section (A) of this act shall in no way affect the validity of the liabilities incurred, obligations issued, or action taken pursuant to said bond act, and all such liabilities incurred, obligations issued, or action taken shall be deemed to have been incurred, issued or taken pursuant to said bond act, as so amended.

Section (C). This Act shall take effect in accordance with Section 107.71 of the Westchester County Charter.

Pursuant to New York State Correction Law sections 500-c and 500-d, the County of Westchester ("County") is required to transport, at its own expense, prisoners between local municipalities and the Westchester County Jail located at Valhalla, New York. In addition, the County is required to provide meals to such prisoners. The County relies on assistance from local municipalities to carry out these functions and by so doing saves taxpayer funds.

Transmitted herewith for your review and approval is legislation which would authorize the County to enter into an intermunicipal agreement ("IMA") with the City of Yonkers ("Yonkers") in order to reimburse Yonkers an amount not to exceed \$332,928.00 in 2026, and \$339,586.56 in 2027, for a total amount not to exceed \$672,514.56, for the term commencing January 1, 2026 and expiring December 31, 2027. This IMA will allow the County to reimburse Yonkers for the costs incurred by Yonkers to transport prisoners who have been arraigned to and from Yonkers and the Westchester County Jail located at Valhalla, New York.

Reimbursement to Yonkers in 2026 for round trip prisoner transportation, will be at the following rates: \$223.00 per round trip with two detention officers; \$334.50 per round trip with three detention officers, and \$446.00 per round trip with four detention officers. In 2027, Yonkers will be reimbursed as follows: \$227.45 per round trip with two detention officers; \$341.17 per round trip with three detention officers, and \$454.90 per round trip with four detention officers. Yonkers will also be reimbursed for vehicle usage at the rate of seventy cents (\$.70) per mile, or at the then current Internal Revenue Service mileage reimbursement rate multiplied by the mileage to and from the Westchester County Jail, which is agreed to be 16 miles each way. The County will also reimburse Yonkers for the actual and reasonable cost of meals provided to post-arraignment prisoners.

Your Committee has been advised that pursuant to sections 500-c and 500-d of the New York State Correction Law, the County of Westchester ("County") is required at its own expense to transport prisoners between local municipalities and the Westchester County Jail located at Valhalla, New York. Your Committee is in receipt of a communication from the County Executive recommending approval of an Act, which, if adopted, would authorize the County to enter into an intermunicipal agreement ("IMA") with the City of Yonkers ("Yonkers") in order to reimburse Yonkers an amount not to exceed \$332,928.00 in 2026 and \$339,586.56 in 2027, for a total aggregate amount not to exceed \$672,514.56, for the term commencing January 1, 2026 and expiring December 31, 2027. This IMA will allow the County to reimburse Yonkers for the costs incurred by Yonkers to transport prisoners who have been arraigned to and from Yonkers and the Westchester County Jail located at Valhalla, New York.

Your Committee is further advised that reimbursement to Yonkers will be for round trip transportation and will be based on the per trip labor costs of detention officers and for vehicle usage. Reimbursement to Yonkers for prisoner transportation in 2026 will be at the following rates: \$223.00 per round trip with two detention officers; \$334.50 per round trip with three detention officers, and \$446.00 per round trip with four detention officers. In 2027, Yonkers will be reimbursed as follows: \$227.45 per round trip with two detention officers; \$341.17 per round trip with three detention officers, and

\$454.90 per round trip with four detention officers. Yonkers will also be reimbursed for

vehicle usage at the rate of seventy cents (\$.70) per mile, or at the then current Internal

Revenue Service mileage reimbursement rate multiplied by the mileage to and from the

Westchester County Jail, which is agreed to be 16 miles each way. The County will also

reimburse Yonkers for the actual and reasonable cost of meals provided to post-

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AN ACT authorizing the County of Westchester to enter into an Intermunicipal Agreement with the City of Yonkers in order to provide reimbursement for prisoner transportation to the Westchester County Jail within the period from January 1, 2026 through December 31, 2027, for a total amount not to exceed \$672,514.56.

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Board of the County of Westchester, State of New York as follows:

Section 1. The County of Westchester (the "County") be and hereby is authorized to enter into an Intermunicipal Agreement ("IMA") with the City of Yonkers ("Yonkers") in order to reimburse Yonkers for the cost to transport prisoners round trip between Yonkers City Court and the Westchester County Jail located at Valhalla, New York, in an amount not to exceed \$332,928.00 in 2026 and \$339,586.56 in 2027, for a total aggregate amount not to exceed \$672,541.56. The IMA will be for the term commencing January 1, 2026 and expiring December 31, 2027.

§2. The County will reimburse Yonkers for prisoner transportation for the term January 1, 2026 through December 31, 2026 at the following rates: \$223.00 per round trip with two detention officers; \$334.50 per round trip with three detention officers, and \$446.00 per round trip with four detention officers. The County will reimburse Yonkers for prisoner transportation for the term January 1, 2027 through December 31, 2027 at the following rates: \$227.45 per round trip with two detention officers; \$341.17 per round trip with three detention officers, and \$454.90 per round trip with four detention officers. Yonkers will also be reimbursed for vehicle usage between the City Court of Mount Vernon and the Westchester County Jail, which is agreed to be sixteen (16) miles each way, at the rate of seventy cents (\$.70), or at the then current

Internal Revenue Service mileage reimbursement rate for the term of the IMA. Yonkers will also be reimbursed for the actual and reasonable costs of meals provided to post-arraignment prisoners.

- §3. The County Executive or his authorized designee be and hereby is authorized and empowered to execute instruments and take any and all action necessary and appropriate to accomplish the purposes hereof.
 - §4. This Act shall take effect immediately.

The Municipality, where possible, shall hold prisoners for one daily trip to the Department of Correction.
- 2. <u>REIMBURSEMENT</u>: The Municipality shall be reimbursed by the County for prisoner transportation services at the following rates:

<u>2026</u> - \$223.00 per round trip with two detention officers; \$334.50 per round trip with three detention officers and \$446.00 per round trip with four detention officers;

<u>2027</u> - \$227.45 per round trip with two detention officers; \$341.17 per round trip with three detention officers and \$454.90 per round trip with four detention officers.

The Municipality shall also be reimbursed for vehicle usage between the City Court of Yonkers and the Westchester County Jail, which is deemed to be sixteen (16) miles each way, at the rate of seventy cents (\$.70) per mile, or at the then current Internal Revenue Service mileage reimbursement rate for the term hereof.

- 3. <u>MEALS</u>: The County shall reimburse the Municipality for meals provided to post-arraignment prisoners for the actual and reasonable costs incurred and receipts submitted as part of the municipality's monthly voucher submitted to the Department of Correction.
- 3. <u>TERM</u>: This Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2026 and shall expire on December 31, 2027. The County or the Municipality may, upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party, terminate this Agreement in whole or in part when it deems

it to be in its best interest. In such event, the Municipality shall be compensated and the County shall be liable only for payment for services rendered prior to the effective date of termination.

4. PAYMENT: Requests for reimbursement shall be submitted by the Municipality on a monthly basis on properly executed County claim forms and paid after approval by the Commissioner of Correction. The number of round trips made, prisoners transported and dates should be listed on the claim forms submitted to the Department of Correction. Reimbursement request shall be subject to audit by the County, and the Municipality shall keep and make available to the County such detailed books and records as are reasonably necessary to substantiate the basis for reimbursement. The Municipality shall not be entitled to reimbursement for any prisoner transportation expense not specifically provided for herein.

The total aggregate cost to the County under this Agreement pursuant to Act No.

2025 – _____ approved by the Westchester County Board of Legislators on ______, 2025, in 2026 shall not exceed \$332,928.00, and in 2027 shall not exceed \$339,586.56, for a total aggregate cost to the County pursuant to this Agreement, which shall not exceed \$672,514.56. This Agreement shall be deemed executory only to the extent of the monies appropriated and available for the purpose of this Agreement and no liability on account hereof shall be incurred by the County beyond the amount of such monies.

5. INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION: All personnel and vehicles engaged in prisoner transportation duties shall at all times remain and be deemed the employees and property of the Municipality. In addition to, and not in limitation of the insurance provisions contained in Schedule "A" of this Agreement, the Municipality agrees to indemnify, defend and hold the County, its officers, employees and agents harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, damage or expense the County may suffer as a result of any and all claims, demands, causes of action or judgments arising directly or indirectly out

of the transportation of prisoners for which reimbursement is sought hereunder and for losses arising out of the negligent acts or omissions of the Municipality, its agents or employees.

- 6. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This Agreement constitutes the entire and integrated agreement between and among the parties hereto and supersedes any and all prior negotiations, agreements and conditions, whether written or oral. Any modification or amendment to this Agreement shall be void unless it is in writing and subscribed by the party to be charged.
- 7. <u>APPLICABLE LAW</u>: This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of New York.
- 8. <u>APPROVALS</u>: This Agreement is subject to the approval of the Westchester County Board of Legislators and the governing legislative body of the Municipality.

SCHEDULE "A"

STANDARD INSURANCE PROVISIONS (Municipality - LEO)

1. Prior to commencing work, and throughout the term of the Agreement, the Municipality shall obtain at its own cost and expense the required insurance as delineated below from insurance companies licensed in the State of New York, carrying a Best's financial rating of A or better. Municipality shall provide evidence of such insurance to the County of Westchester ("County"), either by providing a copy of policies and/or certificates as may be required and approved by the Director of Risk Management of the County ("Director"). The policies or certificates thereof shall provide that ten (10) days prior to cancellation or material change in the policy, notices of same shall be given to the Director either by overnight mail or personal delivery for all of the following stated insurance policies. All notices shall name the Municipality and identify the Agreement.

If at any time any of the policies required herein shall be or become unsatisfactory to the Director, as to form or substance, or if a company issuing any such policy shall be or become unsatisfactory to the Director, the Municipality shall upon notice to that effect from the County, promptly obtain a new policy, and submit the policy or the certificate as requested by the Director to the Office of Risk Management of the County for approval by the Director. Upon failure of the Municipality to furnish, deliver and maintain such insurance, the Agreement, at the election of the County, may be declared suspended, discontinued or terminated.

Failure of the Municipality to take out, maintain, or the taking out or maintenance of any required insurance, shall not relieve the Municipality from any liability under the Agreement, nor shall the insurance requirements be construed to conflict with or otherwise limit the contractual obligations of the Municipality concerning indemnification.

All property losses shall be made payable to the "County of Westchester" and adjusted with the appropriate County personnel.

In the event that claims, for which the County may be liable, in excess of the insured amounts provided herein are filed by reason of Municipality's negligent acts or omissions under the Agreement or by virtue of the provisions of the labor law or other statute or any other reason, the amount of excess of such claims or any portion thereof, may be withheld from payment due or to become due the Municipality until such time as the Municipality shall furnish such additional security covering such claims in form satisfactory to the Director.

In the event of any loss, if the Municipality maintains broader coverage and/or higher limits than the minimums identified herein, the County shall be entitled to the broader coverage and/or higher limits maintained by the Municipality. Any available insurance proceeds in excess of the specified minimum limits of insurance and coverage shall be available to the County.

- The Municipality shall provide proof of the following coverage (if additional coverage is required for a specific agreement, those requirements will be described in the Agreement):
 - a) Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability. Certificate form C-105.2 or State Fund Insurance Company form U-26.3 is required for proof of compliance with the New York State Workers' Compensation Law. State Workers' Compensation Board form DB-120.1 is required for proof of compliance with the New York State Disability Benefits Law. Location of operation shall be "All locations in Westchester County, New York."

Where an applicant claims to not be required to carry either a Workers' Compensation Policy or Disability Benefits Policy, or both, the employer must complete NYS form CE-200, available to download at: http://www.wcb.ny.gov.

If the employer is self-insured for Workers' Compensation, he/she should present a certificate from the New York State Worker's Compensation Board evidencing that fact (Either SI-12, Certificate of Workers' Compensation Self-Insurance, or GSI-105.2, Certificate of Participation in Workers' Compensation Group Self-Insurance).

- b) Commercial General Liability Insurance with a combined single limit of \$5,000,000 (c.s.1) per occurrence limit naming the "County of Westchester" as an additional insured on a primary and non-contributory basis. This insurance shall include the following coverages:
 - i. Premises Operations.
 - ii. Broad Form Contractual.
 - iii. Independent Contractor and Sub-Contractor.
 - iv. Products and Completed Operations.
- c) Commercial Umbrella/Excess Insurance: This policy can be utilized to supplement the General Liability policy so as to yield a minimum total combined single limit of \$5,000,000 each Occurrence and Aggregate naming the "County of Westchester" as additional insured, written on a "follow the form" basis.

NOTE: Additional insured status shall be provided by standard or other endorsement that extends coverage to the County of Westchester for both on-going and completed operations.

- d) Automobile Liability Insurance with a minimum limit of liability per occurrence of \$5,000,000 for bodily injury and property damage unless otherwise indicated in the contract specifications. This insurance shall include for bodily injury and property damage (and can be provided within a Law Enforcement Liability or offered as a stand-alone policy) the following coverages and name the "County of Westchester" as additional insured:
 - (i) Owned automobiles.
 - (ii) Hired automobiles.
 - (iii) Non-owned automobiles.

- e) Law Enforcement Liability/Police Liability insurance The Municipality shall provide proof of such insurance naming the County as additionally insured. (Limits of \$5,000,000 per occurrence). This policy shall include but not be limited to: coverage for moon lighting, assault and battery, excessive force, failure to render medical attention, failed CPR, false arrest, deliberate indifference, misuse of fire arms, Abuse and Molestation, sexual, racial and other forms of harassment and discrimination, auto liability, mistakes resulting in harm.
- f) Professional Liability. The Municipality shall provide proof of such insurance. (Limits of \$5,000,000 per occurrence). This policy can be provided as a stand-alone policy or can be provided within a Law Enforcement Liability policy.
- g) Abuse and Molestation Liability, either by separate policy of insurance or through endorsement to the General Liability Policy or Professional Liability Policy, or can be provided within a Law Enforcement Liability policy. (Limits of \$5,000,000.00 per occurrence). This insurance shall include coverage for the following, including coverage for client on client, counselor client, and third parties:
 - (i) Misconduct
 - (ii) Abuse (including both physical and sexual)
 - (iii) Molestation
- 3. All policies of the Municipality shall be endorsed to contain the following clauses:
- (a) Insurers shall have no right to recovery or subrogation against the County (including its employees and other agents and agencies), it being the intention of the parties that the insurance policies so effected shall protect both parties and be primary coverage for any and all losses covered by the above-described insurance.
- (b) The clause "other insurance provisions" in a policy in which the County is named as an insured, shall not apply to the County.
- (c) The insurance companies issuing the policy or policies shall have no recourse against the County (including its agents and agencies as aforesaid) for payment of any premiums or for assessments under any form of policy.
- (d) Any and all deductibles in the above described insurance policies shall be assumed by and be for the account of, and at the sole risk of, the Municipality.

Pursuant to New York State Correction Law sections 500-c and 500-d, the County of Westchester ("County") is required to transport at its own expense, prisoners between local municipalities and the Westchester County Jail located at Valhalla, New York ("Westchester County Jail"). In addition, the County is required to provide meals to such prisoners. The County relies on assistance from local municipalities to carry out these functions and by so doing saves taxpayer funds.

Transmitted herewith for your review and approval is legislation which would authorize the County to enter into an intermunicipal agreement ("IMA") with the City of Mount Vernon ("Mount Vernon") in order to reimburse Mount Vernon an amount not to exceed \$310,849.00 in 2025 and an amount not to exceed \$320,175.00 in 2026, for a total not to exceed amount of \$631,024.00. This IMA will allow the County to reimburse Mount Vernon for the costs incurred by Mount Vernon to transport prisoners who have been arraigned to and from Mount Vernon and the Westchester County Jail.

The County will reimburse Mount Vernon for round trip prisoner transportation for the term January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2026, at the following rates: in 2025: \$245.00 per round trip with two police officers; \$367.00 per round trip with three police officers. In 2026, Mount Vernon will be reimbursed as follows: \$252.00 per round trip with two police officers; \$378.00 per round trip with three police officers. Mount Vernon will also be reimbursed for vehicle usage at the rate of seventy cents (\$.70) per mile, or at the then current Internal Revenue Service mileage rate multiplied by the mileage to and from the Westchester County Jail which is agreed to be 16 miles each way. The County will also reimburse Mount Vernon for the actual and reasonable cost of meals provided to post-arraignment prisoners.

The County will reimburse Mount Vernon for prisoner transportation for the term January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025 at the following rates: \$245.00 per round trip with two police officers; \$367.00 per round trip with three police officers. The County will reimburse Mount Vernon for prisoner transportation for the term January 1, 2026 through December 31, 2026 at the following rates: \$252.00 per round trip with two police officers; \$378.00 per round trip with three police officers. Mount Vernon will also be reimbursed for vehicle usage between the City Court of Mount Vernon and the Westchester County Jail, which is agreed to be sixteen (16) miles each way, at the rate of seventy (\$.70) cents, or at the then current Internal Revenue Service mileage rate for the

PRISONER TRANSPORTATION: Except for prisoners arrested by the Westchester County Department of Public Safety Services, the Municipality shall provide round trip prisoner transportation using its own police department personnel and vehicles between the Municipality and the Westchester County Department of Correction (the "Department") for all prisoners remanded to the Westchester County Jail by court order or required to appear before the local Court within the Municipality. The County will reimburse

the Municipality for the actual number of round trips. The Municipality, where possible, shall hold prisoners for one daily trip to the Westchester County Jail.

2. <u>PAYMENT TERMS</u>: The Municipality shall be reimbursed by the County for prisoner transportation services at the following rates:

<u>2025</u> - \$245.00 per round trip with two police officers; \$367.00 per round trip with three police officers.

<u>2026</u> - \$252.00 per round trip with two police officers; \$378.00 per round trip with three police officers.

The Municipality shall also be reimbursed for vehicle usage between the City Court of Mount Vernon and the Westchester County Jail, which is deemed to be sixteen (16) miles each way, at the rate of sixty-seven cents (\$.70) per mile, or at the then current Internal Revenue Service mileage reimbursement rate for the term hereof.

The annual cost of this Agreement in 2025 shall not exceed \$310,849.00, and in 2026 shall not exceed \$320,175.00, for a total aggregate cost to the County pursuant to this Agreement which shall not exceed \$631,024.00.

Requests for reimbursement shall be submitted by the Municipality on a monthly basis on properly executed County claim forms and paid after approval by the Commissioner of the Department. The number of round trips made, prisoners transported and dates should be listed on the claim forms submitted to the Department. Reimbursement request shall be subject to audit by the County, and the Municipality shall keep and make available to the County such detailed books and records as are reasonably necessary to substantiate the basis for reimbursement. The Municipality shall not be entitled to reimbursement for any prisoner transportation expense not specifically provided for herein.

This Agreement shall be deemed executory only to the extent of the monies appropriated and available for the purpose of this Agreement and no liability on account hereof shall be incurred by the County beyond the amount of such monies.

- 3. <u>MEALS</u>: The County shall reimburse the Municipality for meals provided to post-arraignment prisoners for the actual and reasonable costs incurred and receipts submitted as part of the Municipality's monthly voucher submitted to the Department.
- 4. **TERM**: This Agreement shall commence retroactively on January 1, 2025 and shall expire on December 31, 2026. The County or the Municipality may, upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party, terminate this Agreement in whole or in part when it deems it to be in its best interest. In such event, the Municipality shall be compensated and the County shall be liable only for payment for services rendered prior to the effective date of termination.
- 5. <u>INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION</u>: All personnel and vehicles engaged in prisoner transportation duties shall at all times remain and be deemed the employees and property of the Municipality. In addition to, and not in limitation of the insurance provisions contained in Schedule "A" of this Agreement, the Municipality agrees to indemnify, defend and hold the County, its officers, employees and agents harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, damage or expense the County may suffer as a result of any and all claims, demands, causes of action or judgments arising directly or indirectly out of the transportation of prisoners for which reimbursement is sought hereunder for losses arising out of the negligent acts or omissions of the Municipality, its agents or employees.

SCHEDULE "A"

STANDARD INSURANCE PROVISIONS (Municipality - LEO)

1. Prior to commencing work, and throughout the term of the Agreement, the Municipality shall obtain at its own cost and expense the required insurance as delineated below from insurance companies licensed in the State of New York, carrying a Best's financial rating of A or better. Municipality shall provide evidence of such insurance to the County of Westchester ("County"), either by providing a copy of policies and/or certificates as may be required and approved by the Director of Risk Management of the County ("Director"). The policies or certificates thereof shall provide that ten (10) days prior to cancellation or material change in the policy, notices of same shall be given to the Director either by overnight mail or personal delivery for all of the following stated insurance policies. All notices shall name the Municipality and identify the Agreement.

If at any time any of the policies required herein shall be or become unsatisfactory to the Director, as to form or substance, or if a company issuing any such policy shall be or become unsatisfactory to the Director, the Municipality shall upon notice to that effect from the County, promptly obtain a new policy, and submit the policy or the certificate as requested by the Director to the Office of Risk Management of the County for approval by the Director. Upon failure of the Municipality to furnish, deliver and maintain such insurance, the Agreement, at the election of the County, may be declared suspended, discontinued or terminated.

Failure of the Municipality to take out, maintain, or the taking out or maintenance of any required insurance, shall not relieve the Municipality from any liability under the Agreement, nor shall the insurance requirements be construed to conflict with or otherwise limit the contractual obligations of the Municipality concerning indemnification.

All property losses shall be made payable to the "County of Westchester" and adjusted with the appropriate County personnel.

In the event that claims, for which the County may be liable, in excess of the insured amounts provided herein are filed by reason of Municipality's negligent acts or omissions under the Agreement or by virtue of the provisions of the labor law or other statute or any other reason, the amount of excess of such claims or any portion thereof, may be withheld from payment due or to become due the Municipality until such time as the Municipality shall furnish such additional security covering such claims in form satisfactory to the Director.

In the event of any loss, if the Municipality maintains broader coverage and/or higher limits than the minimums identified herein, the County shall be entitled to the broader coverage and/or higher limits maintained by the Municipality. Any available insurance proceeds in excess of the specified minimum limits of insurance and coverage shall be available to the County.

- The Municipality shall provide proof of the following coverage (if additional coverage is required for a specific agreement, those requirements will be described in the Agreement):
 - a) Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability. Certificate form C-105.2 or State Fund Insurance Company form U-26.3 is required for proof of compliance with the New York State Workers' Compensation Law. State Workers' Compensation Board form DB-120.1 is required for proof of compliance with the New York State Disability Benefits Law. Location of operation shall be "All locations in Westchester County, New York."

Where an applicant claims to not be required to carry either a Workers' Compensation Policy or Disability Benefits Policy, or both, the employer must complete NYS form CE-200, available to download at: http://www.wcb.ny.gov.

If the employer is self-insured for Workers' Compensation, he/she should present a certificate from the New York State Worker's Compensation Board evidencing that fact (Either SI-12, Certificate of Workers' Compensation Self-Insurance, or GSI-105.2, Certificate of Participation in Workers' Compensation Group Self-Insurance).

- b) Commercial General Liability Insurance with a combined single limit of \$5,000,000 (c.s.1) per occurrence limit naming the "County of Westchester" as an additional insured on a primary and non-contributory basis. This insurance shall include the following coverages:
 - i. Premises Operations.
 - ii. Broad Form Contractual.
 - iii. Independent Contractor and Sub-Contractor.
 - iv. Products and Completed Operations.

Dear Honorable Members of the Board of Legislators:

Attached for your consideration is an Act which, if approved by your Honorable Board, would authorize the County of Westchester (the "County") to enter into an intermunicipal agreement ("IMA") with the Village of Mount Kisco (the "Village") whereby the County, acting through its Department of Public Safety Services (the "Department"), will provide policing services to the Village for a term commencing retroactively on April 1, 2025 and expiring December 31, 2029.

Under the terms of the proposed IMA, the Department will provide, on a daily basis, policing services to the Village which shall include: 1.) Patrol services consisting of the assignment of seventeen (17) police officer full time equivalents ("FTEs) to patrol the Village in consultation and coordination with the Village, with at least two (2) police officers, each with a patrol car, at any given time; 2.) Investigative services consiting of three (3) detective FTEs assigned at such times as the Department shall deem appropriate, in consultation with the Village, in order to investigate matters that arise in the Village; and 3.) First-line police supervisors consisting of the assignment of five (5) police sergeant FTEs with one (1) police sergeant FTE provided with a patrol car at all times.

The Village will pay the County a sum (the "Annual Fee") equal to the County's costs, including but not limited to salary, overtime, holiday pay, shift differential, and fringe benefits. The Village will pay the Annual Fee in two (2) equal installments due July 1st and December 1st each year. The prorated Annual Fee for the 2025 year of the IMA (April 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025) is \$5,917,237.00. The County will give the Village a credit toward the cost of retiree healthcare included within the Annual Fee. Such credit will be equal to \$1,000.00 per month for each of the eleven (11) former Village employees hired by the County on June 1, 2015 for as long as such employee remains on County payroll for the provision of these services.

By October 1st of years 1 through 4 of the IMA, the County will notify the Village of the Annual Fee for the upcoming year. In the event that either the County or the Village determines that the Annual Fee for any year of the IMA does not accurately reflect the cost to the County for providing the services, or that the policing services provided to the Village do not accurately reflect the scope of services contracted for herein or meet the needs of the Village, either party, on upon sixty (60) days written notice, may schedule a meeting to discuss whether adjustments

to the Annual Fee or scope of additional policing services is warranted. The Village will make any additional payments based on this adjustment calculation for the previous year in two (2) equal installments, payable on or before July 1st and December 1st of the upcoming year of the IMA. If a credit is due, the Village may deduct the amount of such credit from the next payment due to the County. For the final year of the IMA, any credit due to the Village, or additional charge owed by the Village, will be made within thirty (30) days of the expiration of the IMA by the appropriate party.

As your Honorable Board may recall, the County has been providing police services to the Village pursuant to various IMAs since 2015 under substantially the same terms, and the most recent IMA for these services expired on March 31, 2025.

I believe that entering into the IMA with the Village is in the best interests of the County. Therefore, I recommend your favorable action on the annexed proposed Act.

HONORABLE BOARD OF LEGISLATORS THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK

Your Committee is in receipt of a communication from the County Executive requesting that your Honorable Board authorize the County of Westchester (the "County") to enter into an intermunicipal agreement ("IMA") with the Village of Mount Kisco (the "Village") whereby the County, acting through its Department of Public Safety Services (the "Department"), will provide policing services to the Village for a term commencing retroactively on April 1, 2025 and expiring December 31, 2029.

Under the terms of the proposed IMA, the Department will provide, on a daily basis, policing services to the Village which shall include: 1.) Patrol services consisting of the assignment of seventeen (17) police officer full time equivalents ("FTEs) to patrol the Village in consultation and coordination with the Village, with at least two (2) police officers, each with a patrol car, at any given time; 2.) Investigative services consiting of three (3) detective FTEs assigned at such times as the Department shall deem appropriate, in consultation with the Village, in order to investigate matters that arise in the Village; and 3.) First-line police supervisors consisting of the assignment of five (5) police sergeant FTEs with one (1) police sergeant FTE provided with a patrol car at all times.

The Village will pay the County a sum (the "Annual Fee") equal to the County's costs, including but not limited to salary, overtime, holiday pay, shift differential, and fringe benefits. The Village will pay the Annual Fee in two (2) equal installments due July 1st and December 1st each year. The prorated Annual Fee for the 2025 year of the IMA (April 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025) is \$5,917,237.00. The County will give the Village a credit toward the cost of retiree healthcare included within the Annual Fee. Such credit will be equal to \$1,000.00 per month for each of the eleven (11) former Village employees hired by the County on June 1, 2015 for as long as such employee remains on County payroll for the provision of these services.

By October 1st of years 1 through 4 of the IMA, the County will notify the Village of the Annual Fee for the upcoming year. In the event that either the County or the Village determines that

the Annual Fee for any year of the IMA does not accurately reflect the cost to the County for providing the services, or that the policing services provided to the Village do not accurately reflect the scope of services contracted for herein or meet the needs of the Village, either party, on upon sixty (60) days written notice, may schedule a meeting to discuss whether adjustments to the Annual Fee or scope of additional policing services is warranted. The Village will make any additional payments based on this adjustment calculation for the previous year in two (2) equal installments, payable on or before July 1st and December 1st of the upcoming year of the IMA. If a credit is due, the Village may deduct the amount of such credit from the next payment due to the County. For the final year of the IMA, any credit due to the Village, or additional charge owed by the Village, will be made within thirty (30) days of the expiration of the IMA by the appropriate party.

Your Committee has been advised that the proposed IMA does not meet the definition of an action under the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act and its implementing regulations, 6 NYCRR Part 617. Therefore, no environmental review is required. Please refer to the memorandum from the Department of Planning dated January 14, 2025, which is on file with the Clerk of your Honorable Board.

Your Committee has been advised that the County has been providing police services to the Village pursuant to various IMAs since 2015 under substantially the same terms, and the most recent IMA for these services expired on March 31, 2025.

It should be noted that approval of the Act authorizing the County to enter into the IMA requires the affirmative vote of a majority of the voting strength of your Honorable Board.

Your Committee believes that this IMA is in the best interest of the County. Therefore, your Committee recommends adoption of the proposed attached Act.

An Act authorizing the County of Westchester (the "County") to enter into an inter-municipal agreement with the Village of Mount Kisco (the "Village") whereby the County, acting through its Department of Public Safety Services, will provide police services to the Village for a term commencing on April 1, 2025 and expiring December 31, 2029.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the County Board of the County of Westchester as follows:

Section 1. The County of Westchester (the "County") is hereby authorized to enter into an intermunicipal agreement ("IMA") with the Village of Mount Kisco (the "Village") for a term commencing retroactively on April 1, 2025 and expiring December 31, 2029, whereby the County, acting through its Department of Public Safety Services (the "Department"), will provide additional general police services to the Village.

- which will include: 1.) Patrol services consisting of the assignment of seventeen (17) police officer full time equivalents ("FTEs) to patrol the Village in consultation and coordination with the Village, with at least two (2) police officers, each with a patrol car, at any given time; 2.) Investigative services consiting of three (3) detective FTEs assigned at such times as the Department shall deem appropriate, in consultation with the Village, in order to investigate matters that arise in the Village; and 3.) First-line police supervisors consisting of the assignment of five (5) police sergeant FTE's with one (1) police sergeant FTE provided with a patrol car at all times.
- §3. The Village will pay the County a sum equal to the County's costs, including but not limited to salary, overtime, holiday pay, shift differential, and fringe benefits for that period.

- §4. The County Executive or his authorized designee is hereby authorized and empowered to execute all instruments and to take all action necessary and appropriate to effectuate the purposes hereof.
 - §5. This Act shall take effect immediately.

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THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, a municipal corporation of the State of New York, having an office and place of business in the Michaelian Office Building, 148 Martine Avenue, White Plains, New York 10601 (hereafter the "County"),

and

THE VILLAGE OF MOUNT KISCO, a municipal corporation of the State of New York, having an office and place of business located at 104 Main Street, Mount Kisco, New York 10549 (hereafter the "Village"),

(The County and the Village shall be referred to each as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Village desires to obtain policing services from the County, acting through its Department of Public Safety (the "Department"); and

WHEREAS, the Parties have successfully concluded negotiations and have agreed on the relevant terms and conditions pursuant to which such policing services will be provided; and

WHEREAS, Article 5-G of the General Municipal Law authorizes municipal corporations to enter into, amend, cancel and terminate agreements for the performance among themselves or one for the other of their respective functions, powers and duties on a cooperative or contract basis; and

WHEREAS, the Village and County intend to provide cost-effective policing services to the Village; and

WHEREAS, no rights of the Village or its officers shall be deemed curtailed, transferred or abolished pursuant to or by virtue of this Agreement; and;

WHEREAS, the Village has duly adopted a Resolution authorizing its Mayor to execute an agreement with the County whereby the County will provide policing services to the Village for the compensation and upon the terms described below; and

WHEREAS, the County is authorized to enter into this agreement to provide such policing services to the Village for the compensation and upon the terms described below.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms and conditions herein contained, the Parties agree as follows:

FIRST: The Department shall provide general policing services to the Village which shall include: 1) patrol services consisting of the assignment of seventeen (17) police officer full time equivalents ("FTE's) to patrol the Village in consultation and coordination with the Village, with at least two police officers, each with a patrol car, at any given time; 2) investigative services consisting of three detective FTE's assigned at such times as the Department shall deem appropriate, in consultation with the Village, in order to investigate matters requiring same that arise in the Village; and 3) first-line police supervisors consisting of the assignment of five police sergeant FTE's with one assigned, with a patrol car, at all times. The above described services to be provided to the Village shall be the primary job duties of such Department personnel when they are assigned to provide such services.

The scope of policing services to be provided to the Village is more particularly described in Schedule "A" attached hereto and made part hereof. Notwithstanding any other provision within this Agreement, the Village may upon not less than sixty (60) days written notice to the County, modify the aforementioned contract staffing to accommodate either the Village's budgetary constraints or additional policing needs.

SECOND: For the services rendered pursuant to Paragraph "FIRST", the Village shall pay the County a sum (the "Annual Fee") equal to the County's actual costs, including but not limited to salary, overtime, holiday pay, shift differential, fringe benefits, and additional communications personnel costs. The Village shall pay the Annual Fee in two equal installments due July 1st and December 1st. The Annual Fee for the 2025 year of the Agreement (April, 2025)

through December, 2025) is \$5,914,398.00. Attached hereto and made a part hereof as Schedule "B" is a budget upon which the Annual Fee for the 2025 year of the Agreement is based, as well as a projected budget for each subsequent year of the Agreement. The Parties acknowledge and agree that this Annual Fee may require adjustment based on salary and benefit increases required under applicable collective bargaining agreements and as provided in Paragraph FIRST. The County shall give the Village a credit toward the cost of retiree healthcare included within the Annual Fee. Such credit shall be equal to \$1,000.00 per month for each of the twenty-five (25) former Village employees hired by the County on June 1, 2015 for as long as such employee remains on the County payroll for the provision of services outlined in Paragraph "FIRST" of this Agreement. As of the execution date of this agreement, there are eleven (11) such former Village employees on the County payroll.

On or about October 1st of years 1 through 4 of this Agreement, the County shall notify the Village of the Annual Fee for the upcoming year. The County shall also provide the Village with a budget in support of the Annual Fee for each of the remaining years of the Agreement.

Subject to the provisions set forth above, in the event that either the County or the Village determines that the Annual Fee for any year of the Agreement does not accurately reflect the cost to the County for providing the services, or that the policing services provided to the Village does not accurately reflect the scope of services contracted for herein or meet the needs of the Village, either Party, on upon sixty (60) days written notice, may schedule a meeting to discuss whether adjustments to the Annual Fee or scope of policing services is warranted. Any requested adjustment(s) shall be supported by documentation sufficiently detailing the basis for the requested adjustment. If any such notice seeks to modify any prospective Annual Fee, such notice shall be provided at least One Hundred and Twenty (120) days before the beginning of the fiscal year for which the Annual Fee is being adjusted. The Village shall make any additional payments based on this adjustment calculation for the previous year in two equal installments, payable on or before July 1st and December 1st of the upcoming year of this Agreement. If a credit is due, the Village may deduct the amount of such credit from the next payment due to the County. For the final year of this Agreement, any credit due to the Village, or additional charge owed by the Village, shall be made within thirty (30) days of the expiration of this Agreement by the appropriate Party.

Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the Parties agree that in computing the actual cost of providing police services to the Village, the County shall calculate such figures or true up the costs not less than annually and shall contemporaneously provide copies of such figures to the Village to insure that all Parties are fully familiar with the actual cost of the policing services, as compared to projected costs. Should these figures substantially deviate from the proposed Annual Fee, the Village shall have the right to renegotiate the scope of services provided in Schedule "A" to avoid any potential for cost overruns. In addition, the County agrees to provide monthly reports to the Village on overtime spending. The Parties do hereby further agree that any adjustments to a single year's Annual Fee (truing up) shall not result in a truing up cost to exceed One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) annually without such number having been properly reflected, disclosed or trended in the aforementioned monthly reports and duly consented to by the Village.

Similarly, no prospectively proposed increase in any given year's projected Annual Fee (as set forth in Schedule B), shall exceed two percent (2%) of such projected number unless the number is presented and documented as soon as practicable to the Village by the County.

THIRD: The Village agrees that for so long as this Agreement is effective, the Department shall have joint use of the Village police facility at 40 Green Street, Mount Kisco, New York for purposes of conducting policing services for the Village at no charge to the County. The Village will provide a clearly delineated amount of space in the existing police facility limited to furnished office space for three detectives, space for reporting writing and interviews, a locker room and bathroom facilities for officers assigned to the Village patrol force, and a prisoner detention facility consisting of at least one regular prisoner cell and one temporary prisoner holding cell or cage. The Village shall, during all such times, continue to maintain the police facility, including the provision of utilities and janitorial services at no cost to the County.

The Village also agrees that for so long as this Agreement is effective, the County, its employees, agents and contractors shall have access to the Village's radio communications tower for the purpose of maintaining radio equipment for police communications and also allowing for the installation of such additional equipment as may be necessary or desirable for the maintenance or enhancement of police communications.

FOURTH: The term of this Agreement shall commence retroactively on April 1, 2025 ("Effective Date") and shall expire on December 31, 2029 ("Expiration Date"), unless sooner terminated in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement. Should such termination occur, the Village shall be responsible to the County for the Annual Fee on a per diem basis.

<u>FIFTH:</u> (a) Either Party, upon one (1) year's notice to the other Party, may terminate this Agreement when the terminating Party deems it to be in its best interest.

(b) In the event that there has been a material breach by either Party of any of the terms of the Agreement and such breach remains uncured for thirty (30) days after service on the breaching Party of written notice thereof, or in the event that such breach is not susceptible of being cured within such thirty (30) days, such cure has not been commenced within such period and diligently pursued and completed within a reasonable time thereafter, the non-breaching Party, in addition to any other right or remedy it might have, may terminate this Agreement. Notice hereunder shall be effective on the date of receipt.

Upon termination or expiration of this Agreement, the County shall reimburse the Village for any advance payments made by the Village prior to such termination or expiration. The Village shall satisfy any and all arrears to the County. Any such adjustments shall be made by the responsible Party within thirty days of termination or expiration of this Agreement. In the event of a dispute as to the value of the services rendered by the County prior to the date of termination, it is understood and agreed that the Commissioner of Public Safety ("Commissioner") shall determine the value of such services rendered by the County. Subject to the provisions set forth above, the Village shall accept such reasonable and good faith determination, which will be supported by documentation provided to the Village, as final. Upon termination or expiration of this Agreement, the County shall deliver all relevant records to the Village and shall deliver the police facility to the Village within a mutually agreed upon reasonable time in order to allow the County sufficient time to produce records and to remove its equipment and items.

<u>SIXTH:</u> In addition to, and not in limitation of the insurance requirements contained in Schedule "C" entitled "Standard Insurance Provisions", attached hereto and made a part hereof, the Village agrees:

- (a) that except for the amount, if any, of damage contributed to, caused by, or resulting from the sole negligence of the County, the Village shall indemnify and hold harmless the County, its officers, employees and agents from and against any and all liability, damage, claims, demands, costs, judgments, fees, attorneys' fees or loss arising directly or indirectly out of the acts or omissions hereunder by the Village or third parties under the direction or control of the Village; and
- (b) to provide defense for and defend, at its sole expense, any and all claims, demands or causes of action directly or indirectly arising out of the acts or omissions hereunder by the Village or third parties under the direction or control of the Village and to bear all other costs and expenses related thereto.
- (c) In the event the Village does not provide the above defense and indemnification to the County, and such refusal or denial to provide the above defense and indemnification is found to be in breach of this provision, then the Village shall reimburse the County's reasonable attorney's fees incurred in connection with the defense of any action, and in connection with enforcing this provision of the Agreement.

SEVENTH: The County agrees to self-insure all liability for bodily injury and death and/or property damage under the County's self-insurance program in accordance with Local Law 6-1986 and Chapter 295 of the Laws of Westchester County. Such self-insurance shall insure against all costs, damages, expenses and/or any payment of any and all claims, accidents and injuries, and all damages whatsoever caused to any person or any property. Attached hereto as Schedule "D", is a written assurance from the County of its decision to self-insure. In addition to, and not in limitation of the above, the County agrees:

(a) that except for the amount, if any, of damage contributed to, caused by, or resulting from the sole negligence of the Village, the County shall indemnify and hold harmless the Village, its officers, employees and agents from and against any and all liability, damage, claims, demands, costs, judgments, fees, attorneys' fees or loss arising directly or indirectly out of the acts or omissions hereunder by the County or third parties under the direction or control of the County; and

(b) to provide defense for and defend, at its sole expense, any and all claims, demands or causes of action directly or indirectly arising out of the acts or omissions hereunder by the County or third parties under the direction or control of the County and to bear all other costs and expenses related thereto.

(c) In the event the County does not provide the above defense and indemnification to the Village, and such refusal or denial to provide the above defense and indemnification is found to be in breach of this provision, then the County shall reimburse the Village's reasonable attorney's fees incurred in connection with the defense of any action, and in connection with enforcing this provision of the Agreement.

EIGHTH: All notices of any nature referred to in this Agreement shall be in writing and sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage pre-paid, or sent by hand or overnight delivery, or sent by facsimile (with acknowledgement received and a copy of the notice sent by overnight courier) to the respective addresses set forth below or to such other addresses as the respective Parties hereto may designate in writing:

NINTH: This Agreement and its attachments constitute the entire Agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and shall supersede all previous negotiations, commitments and writings. The recitals set forth in this Agreement are incorporated into the body of this Agreement as if they had been originally set forth herein. This Agreement shall not be released, discharged, changed or modified except by an instrument in writing signed by a duly authorized representative of each of the Parties. In the event of any conflict between this Agreement and any of its attachments, the terms of this Agreement shall control.

In the event that any term or provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or void or unenforceable, the remainder of the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall in no way be affected, impaired, or invalidated, and to the extent permitted by applicable law, any such term or provision shall be restricted in applicability or reformed to the minimum extent required for such to be enforceable. This provision shall be interpreted and enforced to give effect to the original written intent of the Parties as expressed herein prior to the determination of such invalidity or unenforceability.

<u>TENTH:</u> This Agreement is not intended to create a partnership or joint venture between the Parties, nor an employer/employee relationship. Instead, the County shall be deemed an independent contractor in the providing of policing services to the Village.

ELEVENTH: Pursuant to Section 308.01 of the Laws of Westchester County, it is the goal of the County to use its best efforts to encourage, promote and increase the participation of business enterprises owned and controlled by persons of color or women in contracts and projects funded by all departments of the County. Under this IMA it is recognized and understood that the County encourages the Municipality to do similarly.

TWELFTH: Any purported delegation of duties or assignment of rights under this Agreement by one Party without the prior express written consent of the other is void.

THIRTEENTH: This Agreement may be executed simultaneously in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

FOURTEENTH: Nothing in this Agreement shall provide any benefit to any third party or entitle any third party to any claim, cause of action, remedy or right of any kind, it being the intent of the Parties that this Agreement shall not be construed as a third party beneficiary contract.

<u>FIFTEENTH:</u> All exhibits or schedules referred to in this Agreement and attached hereto are incorporated herein by reference.

<u>SIXTEENTH:</u> Each Party hereto shall keep complete and accurate records of its operations hereunder and shall maintain such data as may be necessary to determine with reasonable accuracy any item relevant to this Agreement. Each Party shall have the right to examine all such records insofar as may be necessary for the purpose of ascertaining the reasonableness and accuracy of any statements of costs relating to transactions hereunder.

SEVENTEENTH: This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of New York. Should any provision of this Agreement for any reason be declared invalid or unenforceable by final and non-appealable order of any court or regulatory body having jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions, and the remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect as if this Agreement had been executed without the invalid portion.

EIGHTEENTH: This Agreement shall not be enforceable until signed by all Parties and approved by the Office of the County Attorney.

Supplementing Paragraph "FIRST", this Schedule "A" is intending to more particularly describe the core policing services, specific items covered, services incidentally included and items expressly excluded or reserved by the Village:

Core Additional Policing Services:

County shall provide 3 police officers and one supervisor on the day tour, 3 police officers and one supervisor on the evening tour and 2 police officers and one supervisor on the overnight tour, with such police officers being assigned to patrol duties, within the municipal boundaries of the Village of Mount Kisco and the Byram Lake Reservoir Watershed Area. The County shall assign 3 detectives exclusively to the Village.

Mount Kisco Police Patrol Sector Checks:

Reporting of non-functioning street lights, traffic control signals and traffic control signs that need repair or replacement to Department of Public Works.

Water line breaks and sanitary sewer overflows reported to Public Works when first observed. Patrol checks of all village owned buildings and facilities, (doors locked and perimeter check) of Village Hall, Library, Senior Center, Byram Lake Water Filtration Plant (gate locked), Byram Lake Reservoir Pump Station (gate locked), water lift stations (Hillside and Chase), water tanks (gates locked: Mountain & Emery Street; driveway off of Rolling Ridge), Saw Mill Sewer Pump Station, sewer lift stations (Radio Circle Drive, Cold Spring Court), Leonard Park Multi-Purpose Building and Leonard Park Teahouse, Public Safety/Court Building, Mutual Fire House, Green Street Fire House, Independent Fire House, Mount Kisco Volunteer Ambulance Corps, Kirbyville Schoolhouse, Maple Avenue Community Center.

Patrol of all parks and recreation facilities (Leonard Park and pool complex, Fox Park, Kirby Plaza, Flewellyn Park, Maple Avenue Park, St. Mark's Cemetery, Conservation Areas defined and regulated under Chapter 54 of the Village Code).

Central business district checks of storefronts and back parking lots.

Police presence to meet all evening trains (after sunset) and checking of sidewalk under Route 133 to North Moger Parking Lot.

Mid-Night tours from November 15 - April 1: winter overnight parking restrictions for snow removal.

Drive through and check of Public Works and Parks maintenance buildings.

Assistance with overcrowding conditions; Notify building inspector of conditions upon entry by police in response to a police matter (Establish protocol for coordination with Building Department).

Dark House patrol and checks.

Other on/off street parking enforcement, particularly during evening and overnight tours.

Byram Lake Reservoir Security and watershed enforcement.

Inspect taxicabs at Taxicab Stand to ensure proper licensing of taxicabs and taxicab drivers under Chapter 98 of the Village Code.

Additional Administrative duties:

Background checks on new hires.

Participation in Drug Council Program.

Assistance with processing Cabaret and Peddling licenses including State Liquor Authority licensing process.

Monthly notice to Clerical staff for Alarm billing based off of IMPACT software.

Conduct letters: applicants to apply to WCPD directly.

WCPD to assist with taxi cab and license inspection and permitting program by processing fingerprinting and background checks in accordance with §98-7 and §98-10 of the Village Code. (MK limits the number of cabs).

WCPD to perform all required fingerprinting for various purposes.

Coordination of police coverage with Village for all special events; i.e. Parades (St. Patrick's Day, Memorial Day, Little League, Fire Parade) and 9-11 memorial (use available Village staff to minimize Police overtime costs) (street closing and postings for no parking).

Court appearances to be scheduled when involved officer is scheduled to work regular tour to the greatest extent possible.

Continue with current initiatives in crime prevention – targeted patrol details.

Assignment of staff duties to patrol sergeants; i.e. traffic committee, facilities management.

Alarm calls for DPW water and sewer lift stations go to PD and need to be forwarded onto Public Works.

Assistance with DPW operations for overnight snow removal, line painting, utility repairs "Dig Safe" Notices go to PD as well as DPW and others.

When feasible or practical, WCPD will provide one Spanish-speaking officer per 8- hour tour.

When feasible or practical, WCPD will endeavor to maintain consistency in assignment of personnel (same group of people generally).

When feasible or practical, WCPD will regularly conduct foot patrols of the downtown area.

WCPD and Village leadership shall convene on a quarterly basis to discuss operational issues and review reporting.

To the extent practical, WCPD shall report to the Village on a monthly basis on the amount and types of VTL and local law violations.

To the extent feasible, WCPD shall endeavor to distinguish the OCR reporting for the Village from that of the rest of the County.

<u>Village Police Jurisdiction to Remain Unchanged and list of Services Exclusively Retained by Village:</u>

The Village of Mount Kisco shall retain jurisdiction to perform any and all of the abovereferenced functions, irrespective of County's contracting for services. Notwithstanding the County's contractual obligations set forth above, the Village's jurisdiction shall be expressly deemed to include but not be limited to core functions, patrols, investigations, background checks, investigations, sector checks, licensing, administrative functions and the like.

As to retained functions of the Village and not deemed part of the IMA:

Courtroom security- Primary courtroom security will be provided by Village. The County may provide additional officers, as needed, provided such service is provided on a non-overtime basis.

The Village reserves the right to utilize its own employees (e.g. parking and traffic control agents), as needed, to perform non-sworn police officer duties such as traffic control, parking enforcement and similar duties.

SCHEDULE "C"

STANDARD INSURANCE PROVISIONS (Municipality - LEO)

1. Prior to commencing work, and throughout the term of the Agreement, the Municipality shall obtain at its own cost and expense the required insurance as delineated below from insurance companies licensed in the State of New York, carrying a Best's financial rating of A or better. Municipality shall provide evidence of such insurance to the County of Westchester ("County"), either by providing a copy of policies and/or certificates as may be required and approved by the Director of Risk Management of the County ("Director"). The policies or certificates thereof shall provide that ten (10) days prior to cancellation or material change in the policy, notices of same shall be given to the Director either by overnight mail or personal delivery for all of the following stated insurance policies. All notices shall name the Municipality and identify the Agreement.

If at any time any of the policies required herein shall be or become unsatisfactory to the Director, as to form or substance, or if a company issuing any such policy shall be or become unsatisfactory to the Director, the Municipality shall upon notice to that effect from the County, promptly obtain a new policy, and submit the policy or the certificate as requested by the Director to the Office of Risk Management of the County for approval by the Director. Upon failure of the Municipality to furnish, deliver and maintain such insurance, the Agreement, at the election of the County, may be declared suspended, discontinued or terminated.

Failure of the Municipality to take out, maintain, or the taking out or maintenance of any required insurance, shall not relieve the Municipality from any liability under the Agreement, nor shall the insurance requirements be construed to conflict with or otherwise limit the contractual obligations of the Municipality concerning indemnification.

All property losses shall be made payable to the "County of Westchester" and adjusted with the appropriate County personnel.

In the event that claims, for which the County may be liable, in excess of the insured amounts provided herein are filed by reason of Municipality's negligent acts or omissions under the Agreement or by virtue of the provisions of the labor law or other statute or any other reason, the amount of excess of such claims or any portion thereof, may be withheld from payment due or to become due the Municipality until such time as the Municipality shall furnish such additional security covering such claims in form satisfactory to the Director.

In the event of any loss, if the Municipality maintains broader coverage and/or higher limits than the minimums identified herein, the County shall be entitled to the broader coverage and/or higher limits maintained by the Municipality. Any available insurance proceeds in excess of the specified minimum limits of insurance and coverage shall be available to the County.

- The Municipality shall provide proof of the following coverage (if additional coverage is required for a specific agreement, those requirements will be described in the Agreement):
 - a) Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability. Certificate form C-105.2 or State Fund Insurance Company form U-26.3 is required for proof of compliance with the New York State Workers' Compensation Law. State Workers' Compensation Board form DB-120.1 is required for proof of compliance with the New York State Disability Benefits Law. Location of operation shall be "All locations in Westchester County, New York."

Where an applicant claims to not be required to carry either a Workers' Compensation Policy or Disability Benefits Policy, or both, the employer must complete NYS form CE-200, available to download at: http://www.wcb.ny.gov.

If the employer is self-insured for Workers' Compensation, he/she should present a certificate from the New York State Worker's Compensation Board evidencing that fact (Either SI-12, Certificate of Workers' Compensation Self-Insurance, or GSI-105.2, Certificate of Participation in Workers' Compensation Group Self-Insurance).

- b) Commercial General Liability Insurance with a combined single limit of \$1,000,000 (c.s.1) per occurrence limit naming the "County of Westchester" as an additional insured on a primary and non-contributory basis. This insurance shall include the following coverages:
 - i. Premises Operations.
 - ii. Broad Form Contractual.
 - iii. Independent Contractor and Sub-Contractor.
 - iv. Products and Completed Operations.
- c) Commercial Umbrella/Excess Insurance: \$2,000,000 each Occurrence and Aggregate naming the "County of Westchester" as additional insured, written on a "follow the form" basis.

NOTE: Additional insured status shall be provided by standard or other endorsement that extends coverage to the County of Westchester for both on-going and completed operations.

- d) Automobile Liability Insurance with a minimum limit of liability per occurrence of \$5,000,000 for bodily injury and a minimum limit of \$100,000 per occurrence for property damage or a combined single limit of \$1,000,000 unless otherwise indicated in the contract specifications. This insurance shall include for bodily injury and property damage the following coverages and name the "County of Westchester" as additional insured:
 - (i) Owned automobiles.
 - (ii) Hired automobiles.
 - (iii) Non-owned automobiles.
- e) Law Enforcement Liability/Police Liability insurance The Municipality shall provide proof of such insurance naming the County as additionally insured. (Limits of \$5,000,000 per occurrence).

- 3. All policies of the Municipality shall be endorsed to contain the following clauses:
- (a) Insurers shall have no right to recovery or subrogation against the County (including its employees and other agents and agencies), it being the intention of the Parties that the insurance policies so effected shall protect both Parties and be primary coverage for any and all losses covered by the above-described insurance.
- (b) The clause "other insurance provisions" in a policy in which the County is named as an insured, shall not apply to the County.
- (c) The insurance companies issuing the policy or policies shall have no recourse against the County (including its agents and agencies as aforesaid) for payment of any premiums or for assessments under any form of policy.
- (d) Any and all deductibles in the above described insurance policies shall be assumed by and be for the account of, and at the sole risk of, the Municipality.

Transmitted herewith for your review and approval is an Act which, if adopted by your Honorable Board, would authorize the County of Westchester ("County"), acting by and through its Department of Public Safety, to enter into an inter-municipal agreement ("IMA") with Putnam Northern Westchester BOCES ("BOCES"), a municipal corporation as defined in Article 5-G of the New York State General Municipal Law, pursuant to which BOCES will coordinate and present a portion of the Bureau of Justice Assistance's STOP School Violence Program by implementing Project Schools Transforming Real Interventions to Violence ("Project STRIV") at various public, private, parochial and charter schools throughout Westchester County, for a term commencing on October 1, 2025 and continuing through September 30, 2026. In consideration for services rendered, the County will pay BOCES an amount not to exceed \$212,000.00, payable in accordance with an approved budget and payment schedule.

Project STRIV, which is funded through a grant from the U.S. Department of Justice ("DOJ"), will expand and build upon existing school violence prevention initiatives and implement trainings to provide students, parents and school personnel with tools to recognize, respond quickly to, and prevent acts of violence. Training will be directed at the safety of the school communities to ensure the development of a positive school community climate and culture where students feel safe, accepted and respected regardless of their gender, race culture or sexual orientation.

Under the proposed IMA, BOCES will offer additional Comprehensive School Threat Assessment Guidelines ("CSTAG") and Digital Threat Assessment trainings. The focused trainings will offer coordinated strategies to increase the levels of security and safety within the school environment. The digital training will help attendees get a better understanding of the social media world and online activity and what tools and methods are available to identify online threat related behavior to prevent tragedy and intervene when worrisome behavior is observed.

I have been advised that because the definition of "municipal corporation" under New York General Municipal Law § 119-n includes "Boards of Cooperative Educational Services", the proposed agreement constitutes an IMA requiring your Honorable Board's approval.

I have been further advised that the proposed IMA is exempt from the requirements of the Westchester County Procurement Policy and Procedures (the "County Procurement Policy") pursuant to section 3(a)xviii thereof, which exempts "any procurement for the purpose of entering into a contract or contracts with persons for the creation and support of recreation

entering into a contract or contracts with persons for the creation and support of recreation projects, youth service projects and other appropriate programs and services for prevention of delinquency and youth crime and the advancement of the moral, physical, mental and social well being of the youth in Westchester County." The DOJ subsequently approved BOCES as one of the sub awardees under the grant.

Based on the importance of this program to the County, your favorable action on the proposed Act is respectfully requested.

AN ACT authorizing the County of Westchester to enter into an inter-municipal Agreement with Putnam Northern Westchester BOCES, pursuant to which the municipal corporation will coordinate and present a portion of the Bureau of Justice Assistance's STOP School Violence Program by implementing Project Schools Transforming Real Interventions to Violence. for a term commencing on October 1, 2025 and expiring on September 30, 2026, for a total amount not to exceed \$212,000.00.

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Board of the County of Westchester as follows:

Section 1. The County of Westchester (the "County"), acting by and through its Department of Public Safety, is hereby authorized to enter into an inter-municipal agreement (the "IMA") with Putnam Northern Westchester BOCES ("BOCES"), in substantially the form attached hereto, pursuant to which BOCES will coordinate and present a portion of the Bureau of Justice Assistance's STOP School Violence Program, by implementing Project Schools Transforming Real Interventions to Violence ("Project STRIV") at various public, private, parochial and charter schools throughout Westchester County, for a term commencing on October 1, 2025 and continuing through September 30, 2026.

- §2. In consideration for services rendered, the County shall pay BOCES an amount not-to-exceed \$212,000.00, payable in accordance with an approved budget and payment schedule.
- §3. The County Executive or his duly authorized designee is hereby authorized and empowered to execute any and all documents appropriate and necessary to effectuate the purposes hereof.
 - §4. This Act shall take effect immediately.

THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, a municipal corporation of the State of New York, having an office and place of business in the Michaelian Office Building, 148 Martine Avenue, White Plains, New York 10601 (hereinafter referred to as the "County")

and

PNW BOCES (Putnam Northern Westchester Boards of Cooperative Educational Services), a public organization that provides shared educational programs and services to school districts, having an office and principal place of business at 200 Boces Drive, Yorktown Heights, New York 10598 (hereinafter referred to as the "Agency" or "Contractor")

WHEREAS, the County desires to obtain professional services in connection with coordinating the Bureau of Justice Assistance's STOP School Violence Program by implementing Project Schools Transforming Real Interventions ("Project STRIV") that will help improve school safety by providing students, parents and school personnel with tools to recognize, respond quickly, and prevent acts of violence and to help ensure a positive school climate; and

WHEREAS, the Agency helps to create, present and implement curriculum-based school violence prevention and early intervention programming, and training in schools, throughout Westchester County; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to retain the Agency to present and coordinate the CSTAG (Comprehensive School Threat Assessment Guidelines) and Digital Threat Assessment trainings portion of the Project STRIV program; and

WHEREAS, the Agency desires to provide such services for the compensation and on the terms herein provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms and conditions herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

FIRST: The Agency shall coordinate and present the threat assessment trainings portion of the Project STRIV program, as more particularly described in the Agency's Scope of Services which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Schedule "A" (hereinafter the "Services"). The Services shall be carried out by the Agency in accordance with current industry standards and trade practices.

<u>SECOND</u>: The term of this Agreement shall commence on October 1, 2025 and shall terminate on September 30, 2026, unless terminated earlier pursuant to the provisions of this Agreement.

All Services rendered and work performed by the Agency shall be under the direction and subject to the complete approval of the Westchester County Commissioner of Public Safety or his duly authorized designee (the "Commissioner").

<u>THIRD:</u> For the Services rendered pursuant to Paragraph "FIRST," the Agency shall be paid an amount not to exceed TWO HUNDRED TWELVE THOUSAND AND 00/100 (\$212,000.00) DOLLARS, payable in accordance with the Budget and payment schedule set forth in Schedule "B", which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

The Agency shall submit an invoice in support of each and every request for payment to be made, including any request for partial payment if such is permitted hereunder. Each such invoice shall be uniquely numbered and shall only be paid after approval by the Commissioner. In no event shall *final* payment be made to the Agency prior to completion of all Services, the submission of reports and the approval of same by the Commissioner.

Except as otherwise expressly stated in this Agreement, no payment shall be made by the County to the Agency for out of pocket expenses or disbursements made in connection with the services rendered or the work to be performed hereunder.

The Agency shall, at no additional charge, furnish all labor, services, materials, tools, equipment and other appliances necessary to complete the Services, unless specific additional charges are expressly permitted under this Agreement. It is recognized and understood that even if specific additional charges are expressly permitted under this Agreement, in no event shall total payment to the Agency exceed the not-to-exceed amount set forth above.

FOURTH: Prior to the making of any payments hereunder, the County may, at its option, audit such books and records of the Agency as are reasonably pertinent to this Agreement to substantiate the basis for payment. The County will not withhold payment pursuant to this paragraph for more than thirty (30) days after payment would otherwise be due pursuant to the provisions of this Agreement, unless the County shall find cause to withhold payment in the course of such audit or

because of failure of the Agency to cooperate with such audit. The County shall, in addition, have the right to audit such books and records subsequent to payment.

FIFTH: The Agency shall issue progress reports to the County as the Commissioner may direct and shall immediately inform the Commissioner in writing of any cause for delay in the performance of its obligations under this Agreement. The Commissioner shall receive a copy of all such progress reports and shall use said reports in determining the progress of this contract and in such evaluation in deciding to award future contracts. In addition, the County shall have the right to periodically monitor and record the Agency's performance during the term of the contract.

SIXTH: The parties recognize and acknowledge that the obligations of the County under this Agreement are subject to the County's receipt of funding from the U.S. Department of Justice. The Agency agrees that the County shall not be liable for any of the payments hereunder unless and until the County Commissioner of Finance has received said funds.

If, for any reason, the full amount of said funds is not paid over or made available to the County by the U.S. Department of Justice, the County may terminate this Agreement immediately or reduce the amount payable to the Agency, in the discretion of the County. The County shall give prompt notice of any such termination or reduction to the Agency. If the County subsequently offers to pay a reduced amount to the Agency, then the Agency shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon reasonable prior written notice.

In addition, the parties recognize and acknowledge that the obligations of the County under this Agreement are subject to annual appropriations by its Board of Legislators pursuant to the Laws of Westchester County. Therefore, this Agreement shall be deemed executory only to the extent of the monies appropriated and available. The County shall have no liability under this Agreement beyond funds appropriated and available for payment pursuant to this Agreement. The parties understand and intend that the obligation of the County hereunder shall constitute a current expense of the County and shall not in any way be construed to be a debt of the County in contravention of any applicable constitutional or statutory limitations or requirements concerning the creation of indebtedness by the County, nor shall anything contained in this Agreement constitute a pledge of the general tax revenues, funds or moneys of the County. The County shall pay amounts due under this Agreement exclusively from legally available funds appropriated for this purpose. The County shall retain the right, upon the occurrence of the adoption of any County Budget by its Board of

Legislators during the term of this Agreement or any amendments thereto, and for a reasonable period of time after such adoption(s), to conduct an analysis of the impacts of any such County Budget on County finances. After such analysis, the County shall retain the right to either terminate this Agreement or to renegotiate the amounts and rates set forth herein. If the County subsequently offers to pay a reduced amount to the Agency, then the Agency shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon reasonable prior written notice.

Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the parties hereto agree that should funding levels change or services not be performed by the Agency hereunder, the County's payment obligation will cease and any unexpended money owed the County shall be repaid by the Agency within thirty (30) days of notification by the County.

SEVENTH: (a) The County, upon ten (10) days notice to the Agency, may terminate this Agreement in whole or in part when the County deems it to be in its best interest. In such event, the Agency shall be compensated and the County shall be liable only for payment for Services already rendered under this Agreement prior to the effective date of termination in accordance with the payment schedule specified in Schedule "B," which payments shall be prorated to the actual date of termination. Upon receipt of notice that the County is terminating this Agreement in its best interests, the Agency shall stop work immediately and incur no further costs in furtherance of this Agreement without the express approval of the Commissioner, and the Agency shall direct any approved subcontractors to do the same.

In the event of a dispute as to the value of the Services rendered by the Agency prior to the date of termination, it is understood and agreed that the Commissioner shall determine the value of such Services rendered by the Agency. The Agency shall accept such reasonable and good faith determination as final.

(b) In the event the County determines that there has been a material breach by the Agency of any of the terms of the Agreement and such breach either, (i) remains uncured for forty-eight (48) hours after service on the Agency of written notice thereof, or (ii) is not capable of being cured, the County, in addition to any other right or remedy it might have, may terminate this Agreement and the County shall have the right, power and authority to complete the Services provided for in this Agreement, or contract for its completion, and any additional expense or cost of such completion shall be charged to and paid by the Agency. Without limiting the foregoing, upon written notice to

the Agency, repeated breaches by the Agency of duties or obligations under this Agreement shall be deemed a material breach of this Agreement justifying termination for cause hereunder without requirement for further opportunity to cure.

EIGHTH: The Agency represents and warrants that all prices quoted herein for the work to be performed hereunder have been arrived at by the Agency independently and have been submitted without collusion with any other vendor of similar materials, supplies, equipment or services.

NINTH: All records or recorded data of any kind compiled by the Agency in completing the Services described in this Agreement, including but not limited to written reports, studies, drawings, blueprints, computer printouts, graphs, charts, plans, specifications and all other similar recorded data, shall become and remain the property of the County. The Agency may retain copies of such records for its own use and shall not disclose any such information without the express written consent of the Commissioner. The County shall have the right to reproduce and publish such records, if it so desires, at no additional cost to the County.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, all deliverables created under this Agreement by the Agency are to be considered "works made for hire." If any of the deliverables do not qualify as "works made for hire," the Agency hereby assigns to the County all right, title and interest (including ownership of copyright) in such deliverables and such assignment allows the County to obtain in its name copyrights, registrations and similar protections which may be available. The Agency agrees to assist the County, if required, in perfecting these rights. The Agency shall provide the County with at least one copy of each deliverable.

The Agency agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the County for all damages, liabilities, losses and expenses arising out of any claim that a deliverable infringes upon an intellectual property right of a third party. If such a claim is made, or appears likely to be made, the Agency agrees to enable the County's continued use of the deliverable, or to modify or replace it. If the County determines that none of these alternatives is reasonably available, the deliverable may be returned.

TENTH: The Agency shall not delegate any duties or assign any of its rights under this Agreement without the prior express written consent of the County. The Agency shall not subcontract any part of the Services without the prior written consent of the County. Any purported

delegation of duties or assignment of rights under this Agreement without the prior express written consent of the County is void. All subcontracts that have received such prior written approval shall provide that subcontractors are subject to all terms and conditions set forth in the Agreement. It is recognized and understood by the Agency that for the purposes of this Agreement, all Services performed by a County-approved sub-contractor shall be deemed Services performed by the Agency and the Agency shall insure that such subcontracted work is subject to the material terms and conditions of this Agreement. All subcontracts for the Services shall expressly reference the subcontractor's duty to comply with the material terms and conditions of this Agreement and shall attach a copy of the County's contract with the Agency. The Agency shall obtain a written acknowledgement from the owner and/or chief executive of subcontractor or his/her duly authorized representative that the subcontractor has received a copy of the County's contract, read it and is familiar with the material terms and conditions thereof. The Agency shall include provisions in its subcontracts designed to ensure that the Agency and/or its auditor has the right to examine all relevant books, records, documents or electronic data of the subcontractor necessary to review the subcontractor's compliance with the material terms and conditions of this Agreement. For each and every year for which this Agreement continues, the Agency shall submit to the Commissioner a letter signed by the owner and/or chief executive officer of the Agency or his/her duly authorized representative certifying that each and every approved subcontractor is in compliance with the material terms and conditions of the Agreement.

ELEVENTH: Failure of the Gounty to insist, in any one or more instances, upon strict performance of any term or condition herein contained shall not be deemed a waiver or relinquishment of such term or condition, but the same shall remain in full force and effect. Acceptance by the County of any Service or the payment of any fee or reimbursement due hereunder with knowledge of a breach of any term or condition hereof, shall not be deemed a waiver of any such breach and no waiver by the County of any provision hereof shall be implied.

TWELFTH: The Agency represents and warrants that it has not employed or retained any person, other than a bona fide full-time salaried employee working solely for the Agency to solicit or secure this agreement, and that it has not paid or agreed to pay any person (other than payments of fixed salary to a bona fide full-time salaried employee working solely for the Agency) any fee, commission, percentage, gift or other consideration, contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this agreement. For the breach or violation of this provision, without limiting any other

rights or remedies to which the County may be entitled or any civil or criminal penalty to which any violator may be liable, the County shall have the right, in its discretion, to terminate this agreement without liability, and to deduct from the contract price, or otherwise to recover, the full amount of such fee, commission percentage, gift or consideration.

THIRTEENTH: The Agency shall obey, perform and comply, at its own expense, with the provisions of all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations orders or ordinances and requirements of every kind and nature, which now exist or are hereinafter enacted or promulgated ("Laws") applicable to this Agreement or the Services to be performed under this Agreement. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the Agency further agrees to comply, at its own expense, with all Laws applicable to it as an employer of labor, and all Laws and licensing requirements pertaining to its professional status and that of its employees, partners, associates, subcontractors and others employed to render the Services hereunder.

It is the intent and understanding of the County and Agency that each and every provision required by law, contract, or other proper authority to be included in this Agreement shall, for all intents and purposes, be considered and deemed included herein. The Agency understands and acknowledges that for each and every such provision that has, through mistake or otherwise, either not been inserted in writing or been inserted in writing in an incorrect form, the Agency hereby consents to amending this Agreement in writing, upon receipt of notice from the County, for the purpose of inserting or correcting the provision in question.

FOURTEENTH: The Agency expressly agrees that neither it nor any Agency, subcontractor, employee, or any other person acting on its behalf shall discriminate against or intimidate any employee or other individual on the basis of race, creed, religion, color, gender, age, national origin, ethnicity, alienage or citizenship status, disability, marital status, sexual orientation, familial status, genetic predisposition or carrier status during the term of or in connection with this Agreement, as those terms may be defined in Chapter 700 of the Laws of Westchester County. The Agency acknowledges and understands that the County maintains a zero tolerance policy prohibiting all forms of harassment or discrimination against its employees by co-workers, supervisors, vendors, contractors, or others.

FIFTEENTH: The Agency agrees to procure and maintain insurance naming the County as additional insured, as provided and described in Schedule "C" entitled "Standard Insurance Provisions", which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. In addition to, and not in limitation of

the insurance requirements contained in Schedule "C" entitled "Standard Insurance Provisions," the

Agency agrees:

(a.) that except for the amount, if any, of damage contributed to, caused by or resulting from

the sole negligence of the County, the Agency shall indemnify and hold harmless the County, its

officers, employees and agents from and against any and all liability, damage, claims, demands,

costs, judgments, fees, attorneys' fees or loss arising directly or indirectly out of the performance or

failure to perform hereunder by the Agency or third parties under the direction or control of the

Agency; and

(b.) to provide defense for and defend, at its sole expense, any and all claims, demands or

causes of action directly or indirectly arising out of this Agreement and to bear all other costs and

expenses related thereto; and

(c.) in the event the Agency does not provide the above defense and indemnification to the

County, and such refusal or denial to provide the above defense and indemnification is found to be in

breach of this provision, then the Agency shall reimburse the County's reasonable attorney's fees

incurred in connection with the defense of any action, and in connection with enforcing this

provision of the Agreement.

SIXTEENTH: All notices of any nature referred to in this Agreement shall be in writing

and sent by registered or certified mail postage pre-paid, to the respective addresses set forth below

or to such other addresses as the respective parties hereto may designate in writing. Notice shall be

effective on the date of receipt. Notices shall be sent to the following:

SEVENTEENTH: This Agreement and its attachments constitute the entire Agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and shall supersede all previous negotiations, commitments and writings. It shall not be released, discharged, changed or modified except by an instrument in writing signed by a duly authorized representative of each of the parties.

In the event of a conflict between the terms of this Agreement and the terms of any schedule or attachment hereto, it is understood that the terms of this Agreement shall be controlling with respect to any interpretation of the meaning and intent of the parties.

EIGHTEENTH: Nothing herein is intended or shall be construed to confer upon or give to any third party or its successors and assigns any rights, remedies or basis for reliance upon, under or by reason of this Agreement, except in the event that specific third party rights are expressly granted herein.

<u>NINETEENTH:</u> The Agency recognizes that this Agreement does not grant the Agency the exclusive right to perform the Services for the County and that the County may enter into similar agreements with other contractors on an "as needed" basis.

<u>TWENTIETH</u>: The Agency hereby represents that, if operating under an assumed name, it has filed the necessary certificate pursuant to New York State General Business Law Section 130.

<u>TWENTY-FIRST</u>: Attached hereto and forming parts hereof are the schedules listed below. Simultaneous with its execution of this Agreement, the Agency shall provide the County with a completed copy of each schedule. The Agency agrees that the terms of each of these schedules has been accepted and agreed-to by the Agency by virtue of its execution of this Agreement, and the

Agency represents and warrants that it has completed each of these schedules accurately and completely.

 Schedule "D" — "Business Enterprises Owned and Controlled by Women or Persons of Color"

Pursuant to Section 308.01 of the Laws of Westchester County, it is the goal of the County to use its best efforts to encourage, promote and increase the participation of business enterprises owned and controlled by women or persons of color in contracts and projects funded by all departments of the County.

2.) Schedule "E" — "Required Disclosure of Relationships to County"

In the event that any information provided in Schedule "E" must be changed during the term of this Agreement, the Contractor agrees to notify the County in writing within ten (10) business days and provide an updated version of the schedule. The Contractor shall also have each approved subcontractor complete a separate Schedule "E" and shall advise the subcontractor of the duty to report any changes to the information contained therein to the Contractor within ten (10) business days of such event and such information shall be forwarded by the Contractor to the County in the manner described above.

3.) Schedule "F" — "Criminal Background Disclosure"

This schedule is required pursuant to Executive Order No. 1-2008.

4.) Schedule "G" — "Certification Regarding Business Dealings with Northern Ireland"

Pursuant to Section 310.01 of the Laws of Westchester County, no County procuring officer may award or recommend for award any contract not subject to competitive bidding to a party that does not execute a certification in substantially the form contained in Schedule "G".

5.) Schedule "H" — "Questionnaire Regarding Business Enterprises Owned and Controlled by Service-Disabled Veterans"

The County believes it is a laudable goal to provide business opportunities to veterans

who were disabled while serving our country, and wants to encourage the participation in County contracts of certified business enterprises owned and controlled by service-disabled veterans. This schedule is required as part of the County's program to encourage the participation of such business enterprises in County contracts, and in furtherance of Article 3 of the New York State Veterans' Service Law.

6.) Schedule "I" — "Vendor Direct Program - Electronic Funds Transfer"

All payments made by the County to the Contractor will be made by electronic funds transfer ("EFT") pursuant to the County's Vendor Direct Program. If the Contractor is not already enrolled in the Vendor Direct Program, the Contractor shall fill out and submit an EFT Authorization Form as part of this Agreement. (In rare cases, a hardship waiver may be granted. For a Hardship Waiver Request Form, the Contractor understands that it must contact the County's Finance Department.)

If the Contractor is already enrolled in the Vendor Direct Program, the Contractor hereby agrees to immediately notify the County's Finance Department in writing if the EFT Authorization Form on file must be changed, and provide an updated version of the document.

TWENTY-SECOND: Pursuant to Federal Executive Order 12549, and as prescribed by federal regulations, including 48 C.F.R. Subpart 9.4, the Agency agrees to complete and comply with all attached the schedules to this Agreement, including without limitation the following which are attached hereto and made a part hereof: "Certification Regarding Lobbying" (Schedule "J"); the "Certification Regarding Drug Free Workplace Requirements" (Schedule "K"); and "Certification Regarding Debarment and Suspension" (Schedule "L").

TWENTY-THIRD: The Agency shall use all reasonable means to avoid any conflict of interest with the County and shall immediately notify the County in the event of a conflict of interest. The Agency shall also use all reasonable means to avoid any appearance of impropriety.

TWENTY-FOURTH: This Agreement may be executed simultaneously in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument. This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State

of New York. In addition, the parties hereby agree that any cause of action arising out of this Agreement shall be brought in the County of Westchester.

If any term or provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or void or unenforceable, the remainder of the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall in no way be affected, impaired, or invalidated, and to the extent permitted by applicable law, any such term, or provision shall be restricted in applicability or reformed to the minimum extent required for such to be enforceable. This provision shall be interpreted and enforced to give effect to the original written intent of the parties prior to the determination of such invalidity or unenforceability.

<u>TWENTY-FIFTH:</u> This Agreement shall not be enforceable until signed by all parties and approved by the Office of the County Attorney.

PROJECT STRIV (Schools Transforming Real Intervention to Violence) SCHEDULE A

Schools Transforming Real Intervention to Violence (aka Project STRIV) will expand and build upon existing school violence prevention initiatives and implement trainings to provide students, parents and school personnel with tools to recognize, respond quickly to, and prevent acts of violence. Training will be directed at the safety of the school communities to ensure the development of a positive school community climate and culture where students feel safe, accepted and respected regardless of their gender, race culture or sexual orientation.

PNW BOCES (Boards of Cooperative Educational Services) will offer additional CSTAG (Comprehensive School Threat Assessment Guidelines) and Digital Threat Assessment trainings. The focused trainings will offer coordinated strategies to increase the levels of security and safety within the school environment. The digital training will help attendees get a better understanding of the social media world and online activity and what tools and methods are available to identify online threat related behavior to prevent tragedy and intervene when worrisome behavior is observed.

A. Continue with CSTAG (Comprehensive School Threat Assessment Guidelines) trainings and implement Digital Threat Assessment Training

- Schedule and facilitate up to 5 trainings
- Provide additional focused school violence prevention trainings for school personnel – administration and support staff, law enforcement personnel and parents

SCHEDULE "C"

STANDARD INSURANCE PROVISIONS (Contractor)

1. Prior to commencing work, and throughout the term of the Agreement, the Contractor shall obtain at its own cost and expense the required insurance as delineated below from insurance companies licensed in the State of New York, carrying a Best's financial rating of A or better. Contractor shall provide evidence of such insurance to the County of Westchester ("County"), either by providing a copy of policies and/or certificates as may be required and approved by the Director of Risk Management of the County ("Director"). The policies or certificates thereof shall provide that ten (10) days prior to cancellation or material change in the policy, notices of same shall be given to the Director either by overnight mail or personal delivery for all of the following stated insurance policies. All notices shall name the Contractor and identify the Agreement.

If at any time any of the policies required herein shall be or become unsatisfactory to the Director, as to form or substance, or if a company issuing any such policy shall be or become unsatisfactory to the Director, the Contractor shall upon notice to that effect from the County, promptly obtain a new policy, and submit the policy or the certificate as requested by the Director to the Office of Risk Management of the County for approval by the Director. Upon failure of the Contractor to furnish, deliver and maintain such insurance, the Agreement, at the election of the County, may be declared suspended, discontinued or terminated.

Failure of the Contractor to take out, maintain, or the taking out or maintenance of any required insurance, shall not relieve the Contractor from any liability under the Agreement, nor shall the insurance requirements be construed to conflict with or otherwise limit the contractual obligations of the Contractor concerning indemnification.

All property losses shall be made payable to the "County of Westchester" and adjusted with the appropriate County personnel.

In the event that claims, for which the County may be liable, in excess of the insured amounts provided herein are filed by reason of Contractor's negligent acts or omissions under the Agreement or by virtue of the provisions of the labor law or other statute or any other reason, the amount of excess of such claims or any portion thereof, may be withheld from payment due or to become due the Contractor until such time as the Contractor shall furnish such additional security covering such claims in form satisfactory to the Director.

In the event of any loss, if the Contractor maintains broader coverage and/or higher limits than the minimums identified herein, the County shall be entitled to the broader coverage and/or higher limits maintained by the Contractor. Any available insurance proceeds in excess of the specified minimum limits of insurance and coverage shall be available to the County.

- 2 The Contractor shall provide proof of the following coverage (if additional coverage is required for a specific agreement, those requirements will be described in the Agreement):
 - a) Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability. Certificate form C-105.2 or State Fund Insurance Company form U-26.3 is required for proof of compliance with the New York State Workers' Compensation Law. State Workers' Compensation Board form DB-120.1 is required for proof of compliance with the New York State Disability Benefits Law. Location of operation shall be "All locations in Westchester County, New York."

Where an applicant claims to not be required to carry either a Workers' Compensation Policy or Disability Benefits Policy, or both, the employer must complete NYS form CE-200, available to download at: http://www.wcb.ny.gov.

If the employer is self-insured for Workers' Compensation, he/she should present a certificate from the New York State Worker's Compensation Board evidencing that fact (Either SI-12, Certificate of Workers' Compensation Self-Insurance, or GSI-105.2, Certificate of Participation in Workers' Compensation Group Self-Insurance).

- b) Commercial General Liability Insurance with a combined single limit of \$1,000,000 (c.s.1) per occurrence and a \$2,000,000 aggregate limit naming the "County of Westchester" as an additional insured on a primary and non-contributory basis. This insurance shall include the following coverages:
 - i. Premises Operations.
 - ii. Broad Form Contractual.
 - iii. Independent Contractor and Sub-Contractor.
 - iv. Products and Completed Operations.
- c) Commercial Umbrella/Excess Insurance: \$2,000,000 each Occurrence and Aggregate naming the "County of Westchester" as additional insured, written on a "follow the form" basis.

NOTE: Additional insured status shall be provided by standard or other endorsement that extends coverage to the County for both on-going and completed operations.

All Contracts involving the use of explosives, demolition and/or underground work shall provide proof that XCU is covered.

- d) Automobile Liability Insurance with a minimum limit of liability per occurrence of \$1,000,000 for bodily injury and a minimum limit of \$100,000 per occurrence for property damage or a combined single limit of \$1,000,000 unless otherwise indicated in the contract specifications. This insurance shall include for bodily injury and property damage the following coverages and name the "County of Westchester" as additional insured:
 - (i) Owned automobiles.
 - (ii) Hired automobiles.
 - (iii) Non-owned automobiles.
 - 3. All policies of the Contractor shall be endorsed to contain the following clauses:

- (a) Insurers shall have no right to recovery or subrogation against the County (including its employees and other agents and agencies), it being the intention of the parties that the insurance policies so effected shall protect both parties and be primary coverage for any and all losses covered by the above-described insurance.
- (b) The clause "other insurance provisions" in a policy in which the County is named as an insured, shall not apply to the County.
- (c) The insurance companies issuing the policy or policies shall have no recourse against the County (including its agents and agencies as aforesaid) for payment of any premiums or for assessments under any form of policy.
- (d) Any and all deductibles in the above described insurance policies shall be assumed by and be for the account of, and at the sole risk of, the Contractor.

- (2) take steps to promote adequate security for the protection of employees from underrepresented religious groups both at the workplace and while traveling to and from work;
 - (3) ban provocative religious or political emblems from the workplace;
- (4) publicly advertise all job openings and make special recruitment efforts to attract applicants from underrepresented religious groups;
- (5) establish layoff, recall and termination procedures which do not in practice favor a particular religious group;
- (6) abolish all job reservations, apprenticeship restrictions and differential employment criteria which discriminate on the basis of religion;
- (7) develop training programs that will prepare substantial numbers of current employees from underrepresented religious groups for skilled jobs, including the expansion of existing programs and the creation of new programs to train, upgrade and improve the skills of workers from underrepresented religious groups;
- (8) establish procedures to assess, identify and actively recruit employees from underrepresented religious groups with potential for further advancement; and
- (9) appoint a senior management staff member to oversee affirmative action efforts and develop a timetable to ensure their full implementation.
- C. For purposes of this Certification, "Northern Ireland" shall be understood to be the six counties partitioned from the Irish Province of Ulster, and administered from London and/or from Stormont.
- D. The Contractor agrees that the warranties and representation in paragraph "A" are material conditions of this Agreement. If the County receives information that the Contractor is in violation of paragraph "A", the County shall review such information and give the Contractor opportunity to respond. If the County finds that such a violation has occurred, the County may declare the Contractor in default, and/or terminate this Agreement. In the event of any such termination, the County may procure the supplies, services or work from another source in accordance with applicable law. The Contractor shall pay to the County the difference between the contract price for the uncompleted portion of this Agreement and the cost to the County of completing performance of this Agreement either by itself or by engaging another contractor. If this

is a contract other than a construction contract, the Contractor shall be liable for the difference in price if the cost of procurement from another source is greater than what the County would have paid the Contractor plus any reasonable costs the County incurs in any new procurement and if this is a construction contract, the County shall also have the right to hold the Contractor in partial or total default in accordance with the default provisions of this Agreement. In addition, the Contractor may be declared not to be a responsible bidder or proposer for up to three (3) years, following written notice to the Contractor, giving the Contractor the opportunity for a hearing at which the Contractor may be represented by counsel. The rights and remedies of the County hereunder shall be in addition to, and not in lieu of, any rights and remedies the County has pursuant to this Agreement or by operation of law or in equity.



The Department of Information Technology (the "Department"), which oversees the Project for the Department of Emergency Services ("DES"), the Department of Public Safety ("DPS"), and the Department of Public Works and Transportation ("DPWT"), has recently been informed that additional stormwater management and tree removal work is required at the County's Sun Valley Drive site located at 40 Sun Valley Drive, Croton Falls, in the Town of North Salem, New York (the "Site"), as requested by the Town of North Salem.

WHEREAS, this Board has heretofore duly authorized the issuance of bonds to finance various elements of Capital Project BIT32 pursuant to Act Nos. 109-2018, 110-2018, 111-2018, 112-2018, 113-2018, 114-208 and 115-2018 duly adopted on July 16, 2018, including amendments to 110-2018, 113-2018 and 114-2018 by amending bond acts 146-2019, 147-2019 and 148-2019 duly adopted on July 15, 2019 (collectively, the "Previous Bond Acts",

WHEREAS, on November 9, 2020, the Board adopted Bond Act No. 203-20 which (i) amended Bond Act 109-2018 to expand the scope of project to be financed pursuant to such bond act to encompass all project elements as collectively authorized in the Previous Bond

Acts, and (ii) revoked the Previous Bond Acts, except for 109-2018 which was amended hereby, to the extent of authorized but unissued amounts of bonds pursuant to each respective bond act;

WHEREAS, on November 22, 2021, the Board adopted Bond Act No. 208-2021 which increased the appropriation for the project by \$2,360,000 for increased costs of such project;

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2022, the Board adopted Bond Act No. 110-2022, to (i) expand and revise the scope of the project and (ii) increase the appropriation for the project by \$8,500,000, including increasing the maximum cost and the amount of bonds authorized in connection therewith; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to expand and revise the scope of the project by adding stormwater management and additional tree removal work; and

WHEREAS, in order to accomplish such purpose it is necessary to amend and restate Bond Act 110-2022 to expand and revise the scope of the project;

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF LEGISLATORS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK (by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the voting strength of said Board), TO AMEND AND RESTATE BOND ACT NO. 110-2022 IN ITS ENTIRETY AS FOLLOWS:

BOND ACT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$32,018,183 BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, OR SO MUCH THEREOF AS MAY BE NECESSARY, TO FINANCE THE COST OF THE RADIO SYSTEM REPLACEMENT PROJECT FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY; STATING THE ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST THEREOF IS \$32,018,183; STATING THE PLAN OF FINANCING SAID

COST INCLUDES THE ISSUANCE OF \$32,018,183 BONDS HEREIN AUTHORIZED TO FINANCE SUCH COST; AND PROVIDING FOR A TAX TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON SAID BONDS. (Adopted ______, 20__)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF LEGISLATORS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK (by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the voting strength of said Board), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (the "Law"), the Westchester County Administrative Code, being Chapter 852 of the Laws of 1948, as amended, to the provisions of other laws applicable thereto, \$32,018,183 bonds of the County, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby authorized to be issued to finance the cost of the radio system replacement project for the Department of Information Technology, including stormwater management and additional tree removal; all as collectively set forth in section 1 of each of the Previous Bond Acts, the County's 2021 Capital Budget, the County's current year Capital Budget, and includes any new or additional costs in connection with the project. To the extent that the County has previously issued bonds pursuant to each of the Previous Bond Acts as detailed in column E of the attached Schedule I, the proceeds of such previously issued bonds shall only be expended for the scope of the project as set forth in the respective bond act, from which such proceeds are derived, when originally adopted and/or amended as set forth in column A of Schedule I. The total estimated maximum cost of said objects or purposes, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof is \$32,018,183. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$32,018,183 bonds herein authorized, and any bond

anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds, and the levy of a tax to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds.

Section 2. The period of probable usefulness of said class of objects or purposes, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 25 of the Law, is ten (10) years.

Section 3. Current funds are not required to be provided as a down payment pursuant to Section 107.00 d. 9. of the Law prior to issuance of the bonds authorized herein, or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds. The County intends to finance, on an interim basis, the costs or a portion of the costs of said improvements for which bonds are herein authorized, which costs are reasonably expected to be reimbursed with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the County, pursuant to this Act, in the maximum amount of \$32,018,183. This Act is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to the requirements of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

Section 4. Subject to the provisions of this Act and of the Law, and pursuant to the provisions of §30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals thereof, and of §\$50.00, 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of said Law, the powers and duties of the County Board of Legislators relative to authorizing the issuance of any notes in anticipation of the sale of the bonds herein authorized, or the renewals thereof, relative to providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, relative to prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the respective amounts of bonds herein authorized, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and relative to executing agreements for credit enhancement, are hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance of the County, as the chief fiscal officer of the County.

Section 5. Each of the bonds authorized by this Act and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale thereof shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by §52.00 of said Local Finance Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the County of Westchester, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the County. The faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and provision shall be made annually in the budgets of the County by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the notes and bonds to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this Act and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the County is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this Act or a summary hereof, are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity, is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 7. This Act shall take effect in accordance with Section 107.71 of the Westchester County Charter.
