# 1. <u>RES-2024-17</u> <u>PH-Source Separation Law</u>

A Public Hearing on "A LOCAL LAW amending Chapter 825 of the Laws of Westchester County entitled the 'Westchester County Source Separation Law' to improve recycling, reduction and waste programs in the County of Westchester. [Public Hearing set for April 29, 2024 at 7:30 p.m.]. Local Law Intro 2024-5.

Ms. Rotini and Mr. Vetrone discussed the legislation with the committee. The modifications to the original version included moving the definition of food waste and adding the definition of

food scrap. The law provides separate disposal requirements for things like lithium ion batteries and freon-containing devices, and clarifies the separation of mercury-containing devices. The law also expands the language for private food composting to include participation in voluntary programs that are already available to County residents, and adds cartons as a mandatory recyclable. Additionally, the law includes the Household Material Recovery Facility (H-MRF) in Valhalla as a household hazardous waste collection program. There are currently two DEF inspectors who enforce the source separation law and the department may request funding to add another inspector. Mr. Vetrone explained that they have been reaching out to management companies so they can educate building staff to ensure that things are posted so the residents understand what they're supposed to do. The words "state approved" were removed from Section 825.11 in the description of the "Westchester County solid waste management plan" because they submitted a plan to the State in 2011 but it was never formally approved. In 2021 New York State contacted them and asked to resubmit the updated plan. In 2023, the DEC came out with a new state solid waste management plan, which will make DEF likely to issue a new Solid Waste Management plan in compliance with that (the last plan was drafted in 2011). Section 825.70-A(3) states the requirement that "receptacles [be] clearly marked and identifiable so as to avoid the improper mixing of Solid Waste and Recyclables." Another change requested was on page 2, paragraph 2 of the committee report, the start of the first sentence needs to be changed from "Your Committed" to "Your Committee".

Legislator Tubiolo requested to add the Committee on Parks and Environment back onto this item, as it was originally. Chair Pierce expressed that this item be tabled until the next meeting to allow the Legislators an opportunity to review the changes in a formal final copy.
