#### 1. 2022-294 ACT-1st Amendment to IMA-Mount Kisco & City of New York

Guests: Planning Dept: Blanca Lopez, Deputy Commissioner and Millie Magraw, Program Coordinator

Ms. Macgraw discussed the background of the legislation. She said that the Fox Hollow Treatment Plant, which is located in the Town of New Castle, is in serious disrepair. It is in the New York City watershed, adjacent to the Kisco River, which flows directly into the Croton Reservoir. If this system were to fail, it could have a disastrous effect on the quality of our water. Mt. Kisco, New Castle, New York City and the County have been working together for a couple of years to address this situation. New York City agreed to finance the diversion of the

treatment plant if certain provisos are met. Given the proximity of the plant to the Mt. Kisco sewer line, the proposed legislation will enable the effluent to be diverted through Mt. Kisco's pump station into the County Saw Mill Valley trunk sewer system.

Legislator Shimsky said this is about another 80,000 gallons a day. She asked if we have the math in any documents to establish that we have the capacity to handle the additional 80,000 gallons per day. Ms. Macgraw said she will send it.

Chair Pierce thanked the Planning Department staff for all the work they put into this over the years.
