Ms. Dolgin-Kmetz discussed the second draft of the legislation, which now includes a provision for a permissive referendum. She explained that the law provides that the purchase of motor vehicles shall be for plug-in hybrid, electric, or alternative fuel vehicles, unless otherwise exempted. It is subject to a permissive referendum because it changes a provision of law relating to public bidding contracts and purchases.

Legislator Covill asked how the exemption works. Ms Dolgin-Kmetz said that there are two types of exemptions: automatic and for good cause. The exemption for vehicles used for all law enforcement purposes was taken out of the automatic exemption, and "vehicles used for all law enforcement purposes or other emergency purposes" was added to the exemption for good cause, which would granted by Commissioner of Public Works & Transportation.
