I. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

1. RES-2023-122 PH - Instituting Actions and Settlement Authority

Guests: Law Dept.: County Attorney John Nonna and Deputy County Attorney Justin Adin.

Mr. Adin discussed the proposed changes to Section 158.11. regarding the authority of the County Attorney's Office to institute and settle actions. First, the not to exceed amount in Section 158.11 (3) would be increased from \$10,000 to \$25,000, which would allow the County Attorney to commence collection actions better in line with the authority of various County bodies to impose fines.

He noted that Section 158.11(5) currently allows the County Attorney's office to unilaterally

settle actions against the County for an amount not to exceed \$10,000, or personal and property damage not to exceed \$75,000 with the approval of the Board of A & C. These amounts, which have not been increased since 1983, would be increased to \$25,000 and \$150,000, respectively.

Mr. Adin stated that the proposed law would also modify Section 158.11 (5) to provide that A&C's authority applies to any action that is covered through the County's 6-N fund or other insurance program. It would also allow A&C to approve reductions in Workers' Compensation liens.

On motion of Legislator Barr, seconded by Legislator Smith, the above item was signed by committee and referred to Board of Legislators. The motion carried unanimously.

2. <u>2023-400</u> <u>LL - Instituting Actions and Settlement Authority</u>

Guests: Law Dept.: County Attorney John Nonna and Deputy County Attorney Justin Adin. See discussion of Item #1 above.

On motion of Legislator Barr, seconded by Legislator Smith, the above item was signed by committee and referred to Board of Legislators. The motion carried unanimously.
