County to retain the Wicks Group, PLLC for the provision of outside counsel services in connection with various legal issues relating to the Westchester County Airport, for a one year term commencing on January 1, 2022 for an amount not to exceed One Hundred Thousand Dollars. This firm was initially retained in 2011 after a nationwide competitive proposal process to identify a source of counsel in the specialized fields of airport law and administrative practice before the FAA. The Firm was chosen both on the basis of their outstanding qualifications and their fee structure. Their contract had been renewed on an annual basis

Mr. Gardner discussed the facts of the case and the plaintiff's injuries. Legislator Maher asked the procedural status of case. Mr. Gardner advised that the case is ready for trial, and the judge suggested this settlement. He cited settlements in other cases which confirm this is a fair amount for settlement.

Legislator Barr noted that the committee had recently discussed another settlement involving a similar issue where the bus doors closed too early, and asked if there anything else we can do to try to avoid these types of incidents. Mr. Gardner said he will look into the prior case, and we can suggest to Liberty Lines that they increase training in this area.

Guests: County Attorney John Nonna and Deputy County Attorney David Chen Mr. Nonna explained that certain airlines operating at the County Airport have been violating the terminal use agreement by operating air service to or from the Airport (for which seats are sold to a segment of the public) not from the Terminal, as required, but rather from Forward Operating Bases (FBOs). The County is seeking authorization to commence litigation against these airlines.
