Dear Members of the Board of Legislators:

Transmitted herewith for your review and approval is an Act which, if adopted, would authorize the County of Westchester ("County") to amend its current year Capital Budget (the "Capital Budget Amendment"), as well as adopt a related bond act ("Bond Act") to finance a component of the following capital project:

BCR59 - Security Systems Upgrade ("BCR59").

The proposed Capital Budget Amendment will amend the County's current year capital budget to add \$6,600,000 in County shares for project BCR59.

The Bond Act, in the amount of \$6,600,000, would finance the replacement of the current security tour phone analog system and personal body alarm system, with more modern state-of-the art systems.

The Department of Corrections (the "Department") has advised that the current method of performing security tours at the County Jail in Valhalla (the "Jail") consists of utilizing a system of analog phones set up at various locations throughout the Jail's housing units. Additionally, the Department utilizes a personal body alarm system that is set up to transmit to strategically placed receivers to alert the Jail's Main Control Center in case of an emergency. Both systems have been in place for over 25 years and have become very difficult to maintain due to the scarcity of replacement parts. The Department's security systems consultant has recommended that both systems be replaced with more modern state-of-the art systems.

Upon approval of bonding authorization, it is estimated that both systems will be replaced by the end of 2027.

In addition, Section 167.131 of the County Charter mandates that a capital budget amendment that introduces a new capital project or changes the location, size or character of an existing capital project be accompanied to the Board of Legislators by a report of the Westchester County Planning Board (the "Planning Board") with respect to the physical planning aspects of the project. Accordingly, the Planning Board Report is herewith attached for your Honorable Board's review.

It should be noted that your Honorable Board has previously authorized the issuance of bonds for project BCR59 as set forth in the attached fact sheet.

Based on the importance of this project to the County, your Honorable Board's favorable action on the proposed Capital Budget Amendment and Bond Act is most respectfully requested.

HONORABLE BOARD OF LEGISLATORS THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK

Your Committee is in receipt of a transmission from the County Executive recommending approval of an Act amending the County of Westchester's (the "County") current-year Capital Budget (the "Capital Budget Amendment"), as well as adoption of a related bond act (the "Bond Act") which, if approved, would authorize the County to issue \$6,600,000 in bonds to finance a component of capital project BCR59 – Security Systems Upgrade ("BCR59").

The proposed Capital Budget Amendment will amend the County's current year capital budget to add \$6,600,000 in County shares for project BCR59.

The Bond Act, in the amount of \$6,600,000, which was prepared by the law firm of Hawkins Delafield and Wood, LLP, would finance the replacement of the current security tour phone analog system and personal body alarm system, with more modern state-of-the art systems.

The Department of Corrections (the "Department") has advised that the current method of performing security tours at the County Jail in Valhalla (the "Jail") consists of utilizing a system of analog phones set up at various locations throughout the Jail's housing units. Additionally, the Department utilizes a personal body alarm system that is set up to transmit to strategically placed receivers to alert the Jail's Main Control Center in case of an emergency. Both systems have been in place for over 25 years and have become very difficult to maintain due to the scarcity of replacement parts. The Department's security systems consultant has recommended that both systems be replaced with more modern state-of-the art systems.

Upon approval of bonding authorization, it is estimated that both systems will be replaced by the end of 2027.

Your Committee notes that your Honorable Board has previously authorized the issuance of bonds for project BCR59 as set forth in the attached fact sheet.

The Planning Department has advised your Committee that based on its review, the above-referenced capital project may be classified as a Type "II" action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQR") and its implementing regulations, 6 NYCRR Part 617. Therefore, no further environmental review is required. Your Committee has reviewed the annexed SEQR documentation and concurs with this recommendation.

In addition, Section 167.131 of the County Charter mandates that a capital budget amendment that introduces a new capital project or changes the location, size or character of an existing capital project be accompanied to the Board of Legislators by a report of the Westchester County Planning Board (the "Planning Board") with respect to the physical planning aspects of the project. Accordingly, the Planning Board Report is herewith attached for your Honorable Board's review.

Your Committee is advised that an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of this Honorable Board is required in order to amend the County's Capital Budget, as well as to adopt the related Bond Act.

Your Committee has carefully considered the proposed Capital Budget Amendment as well as the related Bond Act, and recommends approval of both of the proposed Acts, noting that the Bond Act can only be enacted following adoption of the Capital Budget Amendment.



WHEREAS, bonding in the amount of \$1,400,000 is requested for the purchase and installation of equipment to replace existing DVRs, an obsolete technology, and

WHEREAS, the project is generally consistent with Westchester 2025 – Policies to Guide County Planning, as adopted by the Planning Board on May 6, 2008 and amended on January 5, 2010 by maintaining county facilities; now therefore, be it

<u>Project Description:</u> This project will fund a preliminary study to determine the best option for going forward for upgrading the existing security system. The 2021 Capital Budget Amendment (CBA) is requesting bonding in the amount of \$1,400,000 utilizing existing funds from Under Review for the purchase and installation of Network Video Recorders (NVR) to replace existing, obsolete technology.

ACT NO. -20

BOND ACT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$6,600,000 BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, OR SO MUCH THEREOF AS MAY BE NECESSARY, TO FINANCE THE COST OF THE ACQUISITION AND INSTALLATION OF SECURITY SYSTEM UPGRADES FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION, STATING THE ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST THEREOF IS \$6,600,000; STATING THE PLAN OF FINANCING SAID COST INCLUDES THE ISSUANCE OF \$6,600,000 BONDS HEREIN AUTHORIZED; AND PROVIDING FOR A TAX TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON SAID BONDS (Adopted , 20____)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF LEGISLATORS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK (by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the voting strength of said Board), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (the "Law"), the Westchester County Administrative Code, being Chapter 852 of the Laws of 1948, as amended, and the provisions of other laws applicable thereto, \$6,600,000 bonds of the County, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby authorized to be issued to finance the acquisition and installation of security system upgrades for the Department of Correction, including the replacement of the security tour phone analog system and the personal body alarm system in the Correction Facility, all as set forth in the County's Current Year Capital Budget, as amended. To the extent that the details set forth in this act are inconsistent with any details set forth in the Current Year Capital

Budget of the County, such Budget shall be deemed and is hereby amended. The estimated maximum cost of said specific object or purpose, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof is \$6,600,000. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$6,600,000 bonds herein authorized, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds, and the levy of a tax to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds and notes.

Section 2. The period of probable usefulness of said specific object or purpose, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 35 of the Law, is five (5) years.

Section 3. Current funds are not required to be provided as a down payment pursuant to Section 107.00 d. 9. of the Law prior to issuance of the bonds authorized herein, or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds. The County intends to finance, on an interim basis, the costs or a portion of the costs of said improvements for which bonds are herein authorized, which costs are reasonably expected to be reimbursed with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the County, pursuant to this Act, in the maximum amount of \$6,600,000. This Act is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to the requirements of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

Section 4. The estimate of \$6,600,000 as the estimated maximum cost of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is hereby approved.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this Act and of the Law, and pursuant to the provisions of §30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals thereof, and of §§50.00, 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of said Law, the powers and duties of the County Board of Legislators relative to authorizing the issuance of any notes in anticipation of the sale of the bonds herein authorized, or the renewals thereof, relative to

providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, relative to prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the respective amounts of bonds herein authorized, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and relative to executing agreements for credit enhancement, are hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance of the County, as the chief fiscal officer of the County.

Section 6. Each of the bonds authorized by this Act and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale thereof shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by §52.00 of said Local Finance Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the County of Westchester, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the County. The faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and provision shall be made annually in the budgets of the County by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the notes and bonds to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 7. The validity of the bonds authorized by this Act and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the County is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this Act or a summary hereof, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity, is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
 - (c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 8. This Act shall take effect in accordance with Section 107.71 of the Westchester County Charter.

Dear Members of the Board of Legislators:

Transmitted herewith for your consideration is proposed legislation, which, if adopted by your Honorable Board, would authorize the County of Westchester ("County"), acting by and through its Department of Public Safety ("Department"), to enter into inter-municipal agreements ("IMAs") with one or more Westchester County municipal corporations, as defined in Article 5-G of the New York State General Municipal Law (individually, "Municipality," and collectively, "Municipalities"), in order to have public safety employees from such Municipalities utilize the County's Firing Range ("Firing Range") located at the County's Police Academy in Valhalla, New York, also known as the Grasslands Reservation, in the Town of Mount Pleasant, New York ("Police Academy"), for firearms training. The IMAs shall be for a term of up to five (5) years, commencing upon execution and expiring on July 31, 2030. Each party shall have the right to terminate the Agreement on thirty (30) days' written notice to the other.

In exchange for the use of the Firing Range, which will be staffed by a Department safety officer, each Municipality will pay a flat fee of Six Hundred and Thirty (\$630.00) Dollars per eight (8) hour tour, for a maximum number of thirty-six (36) officers in attendance. This charge is based solely on a blended hourly rate for the Department safety officer that accommodates straight time and overtime costs. The Firing Range will be operated under the direction of the Department safety officer. Each Municipality shall adhere to all instructions issued by the Department safety officer. Each Municipality shall have the option of requesting the Department to provide a firearms instructor to assist with the training process of its employees. If the Municipality requests a firearms instructor, the Municipality shall pay an additional fee equal to \$80.79 per hour or \$646.32 per eight (8) hour tour. Anyone attending the Firing Range shall be responsible to bring his/her own weapons and ammunition.

In the event that police officers from a Municipality provide instruction at the Police Academy under a separate agreement between the County and said Municipality, the Commissioner of the Department or his duly authorized designee may provide such Municipality with a credit equal to one (1) eight (8) hour tour at the Firing Range for each seven (7) hours of instruction at the Police Academy.

The County has entered into a number of IMAs since 2008 with municipalities throughout Westchester to use the Firing Range for firearms training, which your Honorable Board last authorized on June 1, 2020 by Act No. 91-2020. As some of the existing IMAs are set to expire on July 31, 2025, the County desires to enter into new IMAs in order to continue the practice of offering the Firing Range to the Municipalities and providing firing range training services. The program has proven successful, and it is recommended that the County continue this valuable program.
