Ms. Infield, Dr. Miles, Ms. Swirin-Yao, Mr. Glass, and Mr. Cruz discussed the item. They advised that Westchester Community College (WCC) decided in conjunction with the County Attorney's Office to pursue collection efforts through an outside law firm with sufficient expertise and staffing to handle the 300 to 400 delinquent student accounts per year. In December 2013, the County entered into an agreement with Stephen Epstein & Associates P.C. (whose name was later changed to Tromberg, Morris & Poulin, PLLC) for a five-year term with three additional one-year options. The current extension is requested to provide time for WCC to receive responses to a Request for Proposals ("RFP") seeking qualified law firms to provide "of counsel" legal services to the County Attorney in connection with the recovery of delinquent student accounts at the College. Due to the pandemic and change-over of staff, WCC was unable to prepare an RFP prior to the termination of the agreement on May 31, 2021, but an RFP has recently been issued and responses are due back in June.

This legislation would authorize the County to amend the agreement to retain Tromberg, Morris & Poulin, PLLC to provide legal collection services in an "of counsel" capacity to the County Attorney for recovery of delinquent student accounts for WCC for the term commencing June 1, 2021 and terminating on August 31, 2023.

The legislators had several questions:

- 1. What is the law firm's process for collection?
- 2. Was interest accruing during the pause on collections during COVID?
- 3. What is the breakdown of the number of students and the delinquent students?
- 4. How much money is owed, and what is the median amount owed?
- 5. Is there any leeway with the interest rates on the debt?
- 6. What type of payment plans does WCC enter into with students prior to collections, and what is the term? Is interest charged on the payment plans?
- 7. Who are the 300 to 400 students who are falling behind in their payments? What is the average amount of each student's indebtedness?
- 8. Can the 40 existing cases be pursued if the extension to the agreement through August 31st is not entered into?

Mr. Glass said they will provide answers to these questions.

Mr. Tartaglia explained to the committee that in 1993 the County and the Village entered into an agreement to simultaneously purchase an undivided interest in Hillside Woods, an approximately 52-acre woodland in the Village, for purpose of establishing the Park. The terms of the 1993 agreement, the Village agreed to assume full responsibility for the administration and management of the Park. Due to overpopulation of deer, invasive plants, and poor light conditions on the forest floor, the Park is now in a severely deteriorated condition. They have a restoration project with three parts: tree invasive removal, tree and shrub replanting, and installation of deer protection fencing. They need to extend it another year because the village did not get many bids for fencing, so they have repackaged that separate from the rest of the project, and need more time. The fencing will protect future planting from the deer.
