#### 1. ACT-2022-122 ACT-Amend IMA-Hawthorne Fire District

Joint with Budget & Appropriations and Public Safety

Guests: DES: Commissioner Richard Wishnie and Deputy Commissioner Susan Spear Commissioner Wishnie discussed the legislation. He said that emphasized that the Hawthorne Fire Department has been receiving the same amount of money for 19 years and is in desperate need. Legislator Cunzio noted that Hawthorne has a volunteer fire department. Legislator Barr asked about the increase in calls on the Grassland reservations.

Mr. Kopicki said he thought Crotonville was in the \$6 million dollar range, but he would check to confirm that and the cost for the Main Street facility.
