Dear Honorable Members of the Board:

I respectfully request that your Honorable Board adopt "An ACT of the Westchester County Board of Legislators amending Chapter 295 of the Laws of Westchester County to conform the County's law governing liability and casualty reserve fund payments to New York State's corresponding law."

In 1986, your Honorable Board enacted Chapter 295 of the Laws of Westchester County, creating the County's Liability and Casualty Reserve Fund, ("Chapter 295"), known as the County's "6-n Fund," to act as a self-insurance fund in accordance with Section 6-n of the New York State General Municipal Law ("the State Law").

As enacted, Chapter 295 only discusses expenditures from the 6-n Fund for settlements of claims and litigation. However, the State Law authorizes payments from the 6-n Fund for additional expenditures, including for the uninsured portion of losses (such as deductible payments) for property damage, and other insurable events. As the State Law specifically authorizes these expenditures, it is unclear if their absence from Chapter 295 impacts the County's ability to pay these expenditures from the 6-n Fund.

The proposed Local Law amends Chapter 295 to include all expenditures authorized under the State Law, in order to eliminate this ambiguity. As such, I respectfully request that this Honorable Board adopt the proposed legislation.

Your Committee has reviewed "A LOCAL LAW amending Chapter 295 of the Laws of Westchester County to conform the County's law governing liability and casualty reserve fund payments to New York State's corresponding law."

Your Committee notes that, in 1986, this Honorable Board enacted Chapter 295 of the Laws of Westchester County, creating the County's Liability and Casualty Reserve Fund ("Chapter 295"), known as the County's "6-n Fund," to act as a self-insurance fund in accordance with Section 6-n of the New York State General Municipal Law ("the State Law"). As enacted, Chapter 295 only discusses expenditures for settlements of claims and litigation. Your Committee is informed that the proposed legislation does not meet the definition of an action under New York State Environmental Quality Review Act and its implementing regulations 6 NYCRR Part 617. Please refer to the memorandum from the Department of Planning dated January 14, 2025, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Legislators. Your Committee

concurs in this conclusion.

RESOLVED, that this Board hold a public hearing pursuant to Section 209.141(4) of the Laws of Westchester County on Local Law Intro. No. ____ - 2025, entitled "A LOCAL LAW amending Chapter 295 of the Laws of Westchester County to conform the County's law governing liability and casualty reserve fund payments to New York State's corresponding law". The public hearing will be held at ___m. on the _____ day of _______, 2025 in the Chambers of the Board of Legislators, 8th Floor, Michaelian Office Building, White Plains, New York. The Clerk of the Board shall cause notice of the time and date of such hearing to be published at least once in one or more newspapers published in the County of Westchester and selected by the Clerk of the Board for that purpose in the manner and time required by law.

A Local Law amending Chapter 295 of the Laws of Westchester County to conform the County's law governing liability and casualty reserve fund payments to New York State's corresponding law

BE IT ENACTED by the County Board of the County of Westchester as follows:

Section 1. Effective January 1, 2026, Section 295.31 of the Laws of Westchester County is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 295.31. - Expenditures.

An expenditure may be made from this fund for the payment of all or part of the costs, including interest, of:

- 1. Judgments;
- 2. Actions and claims.
- a. Actions that have been compromised or settled and that have been approved by the court in which the action or proceeding is pending;
- b. Claims that have been compromised or settled and that have been approved by a Justice of the Supreme Court of the Ninth Judicial District;
- c. Expert or professional services rendered in connection with investigation, adjustment, settlement or defense of claims, actions or judgments;
- d. Claims, demands or actions that have been compromised, settled or adjusted by the County Attorney or County Board of Acquisition and Contract pursuant to <u>Chapter 158</u>.
- e. Any other expenditure authorized by subdivision 9 of section 6-n of the General Municipal Law.

Section 2. This Local Law shall take effect immediately.
