1. ACT-2021-124 ACT-Release of EOH WQIP Fund

AN ACT authorizing the transfer of up to TEN MILLION (\$10,000,000) DOLLARS of the East of Hudson Water Quality Investment Program Fund, for which the County of Westchester is the custodian under the 1997 Watershed Memorandum of Agreement, into a County Trust Account for the purpose of funding a portion of the costs for the "Town of Yorktown Hallocks Mill Sewer District Extension Phase I Project."

Commissioner Drummond and Dave Kvinge, Director of Environmental Planning appeared before the committee to discuss the 2 Acts- Release of East of Hudson (EOH) Watershed Quality Investment Program (WQIP) and IMA- Distribute EOH WQIP Fund- Yorktown. The first Act would authorize the release of the EOH WQIP Fund, of which the County serves as the custodian under the New York City Watershed Memorandum of Agreement, in the amount of \$10,000,000. The EOH Funds would be provided to the Town of Yorktown to partially fund the Town's cost as defined in the Watershed MOA. To construct the Phase one of the Town of Yorktown Hallocks Mill Sewer District Extension Phase I Project. The purpose of this project is to construct additional sewer lines in Hallocks Mills Sewer District. The total cost of the project is \$14,300,000 of which \$10,000,000 is being requested from EOH WQIP. The IMA will authorize the County to enter into an inter-municipal agreement (IMA) with the Town of Yorktown. Under the terms of the IMA the County will distribute the \$10,000,000 EOH funds to Yorktown. The legislation was amended to reflect the approval from the Town of Yorktown completed the environmental review. The committee report and the SEQR were revised with the following language:

"On July 6, 2021, the Town declared a Negative Declaration with regard to the Project. Planning has further advised that since the Town has undertaken coordinated review and the County was included in the coordinated review process, then, in accordance with Section 617.6(b)(3), no further review will be required by the County. The SEQR documentation is annexed hereto. Your Committee has carefully reviewed the documentation provided by Planning and concurs with this conclusion." Chairwoman Borgia asked if the project comes back to be more than \$10,000,000 will the town fund the remainder. Commissioner Drummond noted that the project is at \$14,300,000 so they will have to fund the remainder. Legislator Shimsky asked about the \$1,000,000 that the County is giving the Town, what if they exceed the \$1 million. Do we get reimbursed from the Town? Mr. Kvinge noted the \$1 million is for design, and they will keep track of the receipts so they do not exceed what was given to them. Anything left over will be applied to the construction. Legislator Shimsky asked for an update once the design phase is complete to make sure they have requested the proper funding. Mr. Kvinge stated that the design will not be completed until late next year. Legislator Barr asked of the 660 properties were household incomes were taken in consideration when planning this project and if those areas can afford the increase. Commissioner Drummond said that they did take into consideration, and one of the areas income is considerable lower than the other two; however she noted that those households are on septic and have to pay out a pump out annually so they have that cost already, and if they have failing septic systems or need to replace the system it would cost them much more. Legislator Barr asked if they knew how they were chosen. Mr. Kvinge stated they were chosen purely by financial and technical reason. He said the next phases are going to be more costly and the Town will struggle with that. Legislator Covill asked if there was a way to promote the County Septic Repair Program, which has not gotten a lot of publicity. The County Septic Repair Program is available to assist residents, and Mr. Kviinge said they are just about ready to complete the details of the program and roll it out. Legislator Walter asked that she noticed the fund is coming to an end, and are there plans for requested additional monies. Commissioner Drummond said they will not consider giving us more monies until we complete the projects and use the monies we have left. She noted it is about \$65 million left. Legislator Gashi said he was happy that the Town was pushing forward and there seems to be a plan and in an area based on economic need and physical feasibility, as well as water quality impact.

3. ACT-2021-126 BOND ACT-BPS32-Traffic Noise Detection Pilot Program

A BOND ACT authorizing the issuance of ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$125,000) DOLLARS in bonds of Westchester County to finance Capital Project BPS32 - Traffic Noise Detection Pilot Program.

Commissioner Gleason and Captain McGuinness appeared before the joint committees to discuss capital project BPS32- Traffic Noise Detection Pilot Program. This is a Bond Act in the amount of \$125,000 to finance the cost of a traffic noise detection pilot program, including an acoustical engineering study to determine appropriate noise detection equipment and placement locations to further the end goal of the project of identifying violators of existing noise limits in the Vehicles and Traffic Law. Commissioner Gleason discussed that in 2020 during COVID, he received a call from Legislator Walter regarding drag racing and traffic noise complaints. She had read about traffic noise detection camera system that was used in London, asking if it was something that could be used here. Commissioner Gleason discussed that it is something like a red light camera concept. It would be used to target specific violators on parkways that have a modified exhaust system. Cameras will detect when a vehicle exceeds the legal noise limit, their license plate will be scanned and a ticket will be sent in the mail. Commissioner Gleason did some preliminary research and decided the best way to proceed is to hire an acoustical engineering consultant. Legislator Walter thanked the Commissioner for meeting with her and the noise expert and being able to learn about the negative effects that noise has on peoples health. Legislator Walter noted that the number one complaint coming out of the 1st precinct in Yonkers is loud cars. Legislator Smith discussed that the issue is not as prominent in his district but excited to pilot take effect and the program to grow to other parts of the County. Commissioner Gleason discussed that this program right now is being evaluated on the Bronx River Parkway, which is a County parkway, but acknowledging this is an issue on other parkways. He said once it is underway, they will work in joint efforts with other public safety departments in those municipalities. Commissioner O'Connor, First Deputy Commissioner Tartaglia and Ken Uhle appeared before the committees to discuss the Bond Act RGP13- General Infrastructure - Equipment Acquisition '21-'25. This is a Bond Act in the amount of \$1,000,000 to finance the purchase and installation of senior fitness equipment at various County parks. It was discussed that for the mature adult population, active aging is a tremendously important key to continued physical and emotional health. Besides offering a wide range of activities to increase strength and regain lost agility, it can also promote socialization and increase motivation. The Parks Department will evaluate potential locations and work with consultants to determine the equipment that fits the needs of the park users. Commissioner O'Connor discussed that they are working location to get the most uses, prevent vandalism and be within walking distances of residents, she said they are concentrating on one location at this time. She did discuss that additionally working with the Department of Health they were able to obtain a grant to be installed at Tibbets Brook Park. Legislator Walter discussed that during the pandemic, that many seniors are not able to get together for their programs and socialization indoors and that their was an increased need for outside spaces for them to gather and exercise. She is very excited to see this project move forward.
