TO: BOARD OF LEGISLATORS COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER

Your Committee has reviewed "A LOCAL LAW amending Chapter 691 of the Laws of Westchester County Relating to Pesticide Notification."

Your Committee is aware that Chapter 691 was enacted by Local Law 2000-22, which adopted the special notice requirements for commercial and residential applications of pesticides to lawns as established by Section 33-1004 of the New York State Environmental Conservation Law. Under Section 33-1004, the County was authorized to adopt a law, in full conformity with Sections 33-1004 and 33-1005 of the Environmental Conservation Law.

Your Committee has been informed that the State of New York has amended Sections 33-1004 and 33-1005, to provide that certain signs and notices relating to pesticides have to be printed in both English and Spanish, and other languages designated by the Department of Environmental Conservation. As a result, the County's Pesticide Notification law needs to be amended to conform with the new language provided for in Sections 33-1004 and 33-1005. Thus, the proposed Local Law modifies Chapter 691 to maintain conformity with New York State Law, so that the County's Pesticide Notification Law can remain in force and effect.

Your Committee is aware that this Honorable Board must comply with the requirements of the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") and its implementing regulations. See Title 6, Part 617 of the New York Code Rules and Regulations (N.Y.C.R.R.). The Department of Planning has reviewed the applicable SEQRA regulations,

and has concluded that this proposed Local Law needs no further environmental review. Your Committee concurs in this conclusion.

In light of all of the foregoing, your Committee recommends the adoption of this Local Law.

LOCAL LAW INTRO. NO. -2021

A LOCAL LAW amending Chapter 691 of the Laws of Westchester County Relating to Pesticide Notification

BE IT ENACTED by the County Board of the County of Westchester as follows:

Section 1: Section 691.31(1) of the Laws of Westchester County is hereby amended to reads as follows:

1. All persons performing residential lawn applications treating an area of more than 100 square feet shall affix markers to be placed within or along the perimeter of the area where pesticides will be applied. Markers are to be placed so as to be clearly visible to persons immediately outside the perimeter of such property. [Such m]Markers shall be posted at least 12 inches above the ground and shall be at least four inches by five inches in size. Such markers shall be in both the English and Spanish languages, and any other languages required by rules or regulations enacted by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.

Section 2: This Local Law shall take effect immediately.
