HONORABLE BOARD OF LEGISLATORS THE COUNTY OF WEST CHESTER, NEW YORK

Your Committee is in receipt of a transmission from the County Executive recommending approval of an Act amending the County of Westchester's (the "County") current-year Capital Budget (the "Capital Budget Amendment"), as well as adoption of a related amended bond act (the "Amended Bond Act") which, if approved, would authorize the County to issue an additional \$7,500,000 in bonds to finance capital project SBB07 – Blind Brook Waste Water Treatment Plant – Process Equipment Improvements ("SBB07").

The proposed Capital Budget Amendment will amend the County's current year capital budget to increase the County share for this project by \$7,500,000 to provide for additional construction funding.

The Amended Bond Act, in the total amount of \$25,500,000, which includes \$7,500,000 in previously authorized bonds of the County and was prepared by the law firm of Norton Rose Fulbright, would provide additional construction funding for the repair, upgrade and replacement of various systems and equipment at the Blind Brook Water Resource Recovery Facility (the "Plant"). The work will include, but is not limited to, the upgrading and/or replacement of various items of equipment and systems at the Plant, including the aeration system, secondary clarifiers, underground storage tank demolition, the fuel dispensing system, various process blowers, pumps, piping, valves, sluice gates, collection and mixing equipment, HVAC, and electrical systems, and the reconstruction of the damaged grit building.

The Department of Environmental Facilities (the "Department") has advised that the initial RFP issued for this project included 13 evaluations to be completed by the consultant to assess the condition and remaining useful life of various assets at the Plant. At the time, any recommendations from these evaluations were intended to be included in future capital projects. However, after these evaluations were completed, it was determined that a number of the Plant processes were in critical condition and should be replaced now to avoid catastrophic failure. These processes include the aeration system, ventilation system, and the secondary clarifier system. Unfortunately, the secondary clarifier system *did* sustain a catastrophic failure which resulted in a number of SPDES permit violations and is currently being replaced under an emergency contract. The additional

funding now being requested is needed to replace the approximately \$4,000,000 in the project budget being used for the emergency repair and includes an additional approximately \$3,500,000 of funding for the repairs deemed critical by the evaluations in order to avoid other failures.

Your Committee is advised that design is currently underway by consultants and is expected to be completed by the 3rd quarter of 2021. Construction is estimated to take eighteen (18) months to complete and will begin after award and execution of the construction contracts

Your Committee notes that your Honorable Board has previously authorized the County to issue bonds to finance prior components of SBB07, as follows: Bond Act No. 115-2015 in the amount of \$1,000,000 which financed the design phase of this project and Bond Act No. 103-2020, which amended Bond Act No. 115-2015 to increase the initial amount authorized by \$17,000,000 for a total authorized amount, as amended, of \$18,000,000. Bond Act No. 103-2020 also revised the scope of Bond Act No.115-2015 to include work associated with the construction phase of SBB07 and increased the period of probable usefulness of said bonds. The Amended Bond Act would further amend Bond Act No. 115-2015, as amended by Bond Act No. 103-2020, to increase the total amount authorized by an additional \$7,500,000, for a total authorized amount, as amended, of \$25,500,000.

The Planning Department has advised your Committee that based on its review, the above-referenced capital project has been classified as a Type "II" action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQR") and its implementing regulations, 6 NYCRR Part 617. Therefore, no further environmental review is required. Your Committee has reviewed the annexed SEQR documentation and concurs with this conclusion.

In addition, Section 167.131 of the County Charter mandates that a capital budget amendment that introduces a new capital project or changes the location, size or character of an existing capital project be accompanied to the Board of Legislators by a report of the Westchester County Planning Board (the "Planning Board") with respect to the physical planning aspects of the project. The Planning Department has advised that the Planning Board has previously reviewed this project and issued a report, and that since there is no change in the scope of the work and this is simply a change in the financing plan, no further action by the Planning Board is necessary at this time.

Your Committee is advised that an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of this Honorable Board is required in order to amend the County's Capital Budget, as well as to adopt the related Amended Bond Act.

Your Committee has carefully considered the proposed Capital Budget Amendment as well as the related Amended Bond Act, and recommends approval of both of the proposed Acts, noting that the Amended Bond Act can only be enacted following adoption of the Capital Budget Amendment.

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

A BOND ACT OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK, AMENDING BOND ACT 115-2015, AS AMENDED BY BOND ACT 103-2020, WHICH PROVIDED FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$18,000,000 BONDS TO PAY THE DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT AND CONSTRUCTION COSTS FOR THE REHABILITATION, UPGRADING AND/OR REPLACEMENT OF VARIOUS ITEMS OF EQUIPMENT AND SYSTEMS AT THE BLIND BROOK WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANT, FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE BLIND BROOK SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT, TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM ESTIMATED COST TO \$25,500,000 AND TO PROVIDE AN ADDITIONAL \$7,500,000 BONDS FOR SAID PURPOSE.

WHEREAS, this Board has previously authorized the issuance of \$18,000,000 bonds to finance design, construction management and construction costs for the rehabilitation, upgrading and/or replacement of various items of equipment and systems at the Blind Brook Waste Water Treatment Plant, for the benefit of the County's Blind Brook Sanitary Sewer District, a class of objects or purposes, pursuant to Bond Act 115-2015, as amended by Bond Act 103-2020;

WHEREAS, no obligations have been issued under Bond Act 115-2015, as amended by Bond Act 103-2020;

WHEREAS, upon further engineering analysis, it has now been determined that the maximum estimated cost thereof is now \$25,500,000, and that the description of typical items in the class of objects or purposes to be financed should be updated to reflect current needs;

WHEREAS, \$25,500,000 has been appropriated in the Capital Budget of the County for the aforesaid class of objects or purposes;

WHEREAS, the cost of said class of objects or purposes shall be specially assessed against properties in the County's Blind Brook Sanitary Sewer District, which are specially benefitted by said specific object or purpose; and

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF LEGISLATORS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK (by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the voting strength of said Board), as follows:

Section (A): The bond act duly adopted by this Board entitled

ACT NO. 115-2015, AS AMENDED BY BOND ACT NO. 103-2020.

A BOND ACT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$18,000,000 BONDS TO PAY THE DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT AND CONSTRUCTION COSTS FOR THE REHABILITATION, UPGRADING AND/OR REPLACEMENT OF VARIOUS ITEMS OF EQUIPMENT AND SYSTEMS AT THE BLIND BROOK WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANT, FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE BLIND BROOK SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT.

is hereby amended to read as follows:

A BOND ACT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$25,500,000 BONDS TO PAY THE DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT AND CONSTRUCTION COSTS FOR THE REHABILITATION, UPGRADING AND/OR REPLACEMENT OF VARIOUS ITEMS OF EQUIPMENT AND SYSTEMS AT THE BLIND BROOK WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANT, FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE BLIND BROOK SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the capital project hereinafter described has been duly approved in the adopted capital budget for the current fiscal year;

WHEREAS, the plan for the financing of the maximum estimated cost of such capital project, as hereinafter set forth in this Bond Act, is in conformity with such capital budget;

WHEREAS, all other conditions precedent to the financing of the capital project hereinafter described, and compliance with the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, to the extent required, have been performed;

WHEREAS, it is now desired to authorize the financing of the costs of such capital project allocable to the County's Blind Brook Sanitary Sewer District; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ENACTED, by the Board of Legislators of the County of Westchester, New York, by the affirmative vote of not less than two thirds of the entire voting strength thereof, as follows:

Section 1. There are hereby authorized to be issued \$25,500,000 bonds of the County of Westchester to finance the design, construction management and construction costs for the rehabilitation, upgrading and/or replacement of various items of equipment, systems and infrastructure at the Blind Brook Waste Water Treatment Plant, presently expected to include the damaged grit building, the aeration system, secondary clarifiers, the plant effluent piping system, the primary sludge piping system, the odor control system, influent pump station valves, the primary scum pit piping system, recycled activated sludge discharge isolation valves, underground storage tank demolition and the fuel dispensing system, and incidental expenses in connection therewith, which is a class of objects or purposes, in and for the benefit of the County's Blind Brook Sanitary Sewer District. To the extent that the details of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes set forth in this act are inconsistent with any details set forth in the current Capital Budget of the County, such Budget shall be deemed and is hereby amended to the extent inconsistent herewith.

Section 2. It is hereby determined that the maximum estimated cost of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes is \$25,500,000, and that the plan for the financing thereof is by the issuance of the \$25,500,000 bonds of said County authorized to be issued pursuant to this Bond Act.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes is thirty years pursuant to subdivision four of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 4. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Commissioner of Finance, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 5. The faith and credit of the County of Westchester, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations becoming due and payable in such year. To the extent not paid from the assessment of properties assessable for this purpose in County's Blind Brook Sanitary Sewer District, or other sources, there shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said County a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same become due and payable.

Section 6. Such bonds shall be in fully registered form and shall be signed in the name of the County of Westchester, New York, by the manual or facsimile signature of the Commissioner of Finance and a facsimile of the corporate seal shall be imprinted or impressed thereon and may be attested by the manual or facsimile signature of the County Clerk.

Section 7. The powers and duties of advertising such bonds for sale, conducting the sale and awarding the bonds, are hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance, who shall advertise such bonds for sale, conduct the sale, and award the bonds in such manner as said Commissioner of Finance shall deem best for the interests of the County; including, but not limited to, the power to sell said bonds to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation; provided, however, that in the exercise of these delegated powers, the Commissioner of Finance shall comply fully with the provisions of the Local Finance Law and any order or rule of the State Comptroller applicable to the sale of municipal bonds. The receipt of the Commissioner of Finance shall be a full acquittance to the purchaser of such bonds, who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 8. The Commissioner of Finance is hereby further delegated the power to authorize the sale and issuance of the bonds authorized pursuant to this Bond Act (a) at a discount in the manner authorized by paragraphs e and f of Section 57.00 of the Local Finance Law, (b) at

private sale pursuant to the applicable provisions of the Local Finance Law and any regulations of the New York State Comptroller appertaining thereto, including the private sale of bonds at a premium, (c) as capital appreciation bonds or term bonds at public sale or private sale pursuant to the applicable provisions of the Local Finance Law and any regulations of the New York State Comptroller appertaining thereto, and (d) at a variable rate of interest in the manner authorized by Section 54.90 of the Local Finance Law, including notes issued in anticipation thereof. The Commissioner of Finance is hereby authorized to enter into such agreements as said Commissioner of Finance shall determine reasonable and necessary to facilitate the issuance, sale, resale and, or repurchase of such bonds or notes pursuant to the provisions of Section 54.90 of the Local Finance Law. Such bonds and, or notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Commissioner of Finance.

Section 9. The power to issue and sell notes to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation pursuant to Section 169.00 of the Local Finance Law is hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents as may be prescribed by said Commissioner of Finance consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 10. The Commissioner of Finance is hereby further authorized, at the sole discretion of the Commissioner of Finance, to execute a project financing and loan agreement, and any other agreements with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and/or the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation, including amendments thereto, and including any instruments (or amendments thereto) in the effectuation thereof, in order to effect the financing or refinancing of the specific object or purpose described in Section 1 hereof, or a portion thereof, by a bond, and, or note issue of said County in the event of the sale of same to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation.

Section 11. The intent of this Bond Act is to give the Commissioner of Finance sufficient authority to execute those applications, agreements, instruments or to do any similar acts necessary

to effect the issuance of the aforesaid bonds and, or notes without resorting to further action of this Board of Legislators.

Section 12. All other matters, except as provided herein relating to such bonds, including determining whether to issue such bonds having substantially level or declining annual debt service and all matters related thereto, prescribing whether manual or facsimile signatures shall appear on said bonds, prescribing the method for the recording of ownership of said bonds, appointing the fiscal agent or agents for said bonds, providing for the printing and delivery of said bonds (and if said bonds are to be executed in the name of the County by the facsimile signature of the Commissioner of Finance and, providing for the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent or of a designated official of the County), the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, place or places of payment, and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the Commissioner of Finance. It is hereby determined that it is to the financial advantage of the County not to impose and collect from registered owners of such bonds any charges for mailing, shipping and insuring bonds transferred or exchanged by the fiscal agent, and, accordingly, pursuant to paragraph c of Section 70.00 of the Local Finance Law, no such charges shall be so collected by the fiscal agent. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Commissioner of Finance shall determine.

- Section 13. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:
 - Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said
 County is not authorized to expend money, or
 - 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this Bond Act are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 14. This Bond Act shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150 - 2. Other than as specified in this Bond Act, no moneys are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

Section 15. This Bond Act, which shall take effect immediately in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.10 of the Local Finance Law and as provided in Section 107.71 of the Westchester County Charter, shall be published in summary form in the official newspaper of said County for purposes of this Bond Act, together with a notice of the Clerk and Chief Administrative Officer of the County Board of Legislators in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section (B). The amendments of the bond act set forth in Section (A) of this act shall in no way affect the validity of the liabilities incurred, obligations issued, or action taken pursuant to said bond act, and all such liabilities incurred, obligations issued, or action taken shall be deemed to have been incurred, issued or taken pursuant to said bond act, as so amended.

Section (C). This Act shall take effect immediately upon approval by the County Executive.

Overall Project Description

This project will provide for the repair, upgrading and replacement of various items of equipment and systems at the Blind Brook Wastewater Treatment Plant. Equipment or systems to be replaced or refurbished will include, but not be limited to, HVAC equipment not included in performance maintenance project, primary sludge and sludge transfer pumps including associated piping and valves; primary and secondary clarifier mechanisms; primary clarifier scum pit piping and valves; aeration tank influent and effluent sluice gates and mixers; all aeration blowers and blower piping; piping, valves and controls for caustic and hypochlorite tanks associated with odor control scrubbers; plant and service water system upgrade; replacement of RAS discharge isolation valves; final clarifier drain values and plant effluent water system including pumps and associated values; demolition and removal of obsolete boilers and fuel oil storage tanks and installation of security system improvements. The project is broken down into design and construction phases; preliminary design will also include a review of the sludge forcemain to the Port Chester Plant. Further refinement and phasing will be performed after design is undertaken. All equipment upgrades will include integration into SCADA system.

Comments:

The initial RFP included 13 evaluations to be completed by the consultant to assess the condition and remaining useful life of various assets at the plant. At the time, any recommendations from these evaluations were intended to be included in future capital projects. However, after these evaluations were completed, it was determined that a number of the plant processes were in critical condition and should be replaced now to avoid catastrophic failure. These processes include the aeration system, ventilation system, and the secondary clarifier system. Unfortunately, the secondary clarifier system did sustain a catastrophic failure which resulted in a number of SPDES permit violations and is currently being replaced under an emergency contract. The additional funding being requested now is needed to replace the approximately \$4,000,000 of budget being used for the emergency repair and includes an additional approximately \$3,500,000 of funding for the repairs deemed critical by the evaluations in order to avoid other failures.

Equipment or systems to be replaced or refurbished will include, but not be limited to, HVAC equipment not included in performance maintenance project, primary sludge and sludge transfer pumps including associated piping and valves; primary and secondary clarifier mechanisms; primary clarifier scum pit piping and valves; aeration tank influent and effluent sluice gates and mixers; all aeration blowers and blower piping; piping, valves and controls for caustic and hypochlorite tanks associated with odor control scrubbers; plant and service water system upgrade; replacement of RAS discharge isolation valves; final clarifier drain values and plant effluent water system including pumps and associated values; demolition and removal of obsolete boilers and fuel oil storage tanks and installation of security system improvements.
