MINUTES APPROVAL

Monday, January 23, 2022 at 10:00 a.m.

On motion of Committee Vice-Chair Pierce, seconded by Legislator Tubiolo, the minutes were approved. The motion carried by the following vote:

I. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

1. 2022-522 PH - Single Use Foodware

Legislator Pierce discussed the changes to the law, which largely covered the inclusion of the County's Department of Environmental Facilities (DEF) as an enforcing agent for retail food establishments, healthcare facilities, and schools. Ms. Macleod further explained the specific changes, and noted that these changes were the result of feedback from various departments

and legislators. Legislator Cunzio asked if DEF has enough staff to undertake this role and Ms. Macleod confirmed that they indicated they do.

Legislator Cunzio requested a cross-reference between items in the definitions and exemptions section, which Legislator Boykin confirmed has been done in the past for clarity. Legislator Boykin expressed concerns about the County's law being preempted by New York State law. Ms. Macleod said this is something they have considered, and felt confident wouldn't be an issue. Legislator Nolan asked how this would affect mobile entities like food trucks. Legislator Pierce said that, in her experience, food trucks usually ask customers what they want before providing it.

Ms. Macleod explained the change to the restrictions section, the most significant being the addition of retail food store. Legislator Cunzio asked if the capability for additional exemptions was present in the legislation in the event of another pandemic, and Ms. Macleod confirmed it was.

Legislator Boykin asked about defining the word elderly in the exemptions section [Sec. 542.51(4)], and it was agreed that simply taking out the words "to the elderly", and leaving it as just "programs that deliver meals" would be sufficient.

Legislator Barr noted that they have not spoken to the representative for retail stores yet, but they will, and are not expecting pushback.

On motion of Committee Vice-Chair Pierce, seconded by Legislator Williams Johnson, the above item was signed by committee and referred to Board of Legislators. The motion carried by the following vote:
