1. <u>RES-2024-110</u> <u>PH - Amending Chapter 107 of the Laws of Westchester County to</u> modify the length of terms for Legislator

Mr. Adin said this legislation will modify the term length for County legislators from two years to four years. He noted that the County previously amended its laws to conform with State law moving elections to an even year cycle, and the County law is set to go in effect when the State law goes in effect because there are pending legal challenges to the State law. He noted that the proposed law changes County law to enact four year terms and also changes County law as it would exist if the State law goes into effect to provide that there would be a three-year transitional term under the State law and four year terms thereafter.

Mr. Adin said this legislation changes the language on term limits because the current law provides for six consecutive two-year terms, and since there will no longer be two year terms, the new law limits it to twelve consecutive years to accommodate both two and four year terms. He noted that the legislation permits completion of a term if a legislator would reach twelve consecutive years in the middle of a four-year term.

Mr. Adin noted that the State law provides for an even year cycle by shortening a single term by one year so that the subsequent election will be on an even year cycle, but the shortened term does not count towards term limits unless a local jurisdiction chooses to count it. He said that this law will provide that the three-year term would count toward term limits if the State law goes into effect.

Mr. Adin noted that the law will be subject to a mandatory referendum. Legislator Cunzio asked if there is a plan to educate voters about the proposed changes prior to the referendum. Mr. Nonna suggested reaching out to organizations like the League of Women Voters for support.

Legislator Barr suggested create an FAQ document to provide clear information to voters about the proposed changes to four-year terms.

Legislators Woodson Samuels said that we need to emphasize that other counties in the State already have four-year terms for County legislators, and highlight the efficiency and other benefits of longer terms.

Chair Smith said it is important to clarify that they are not changing the length of time legislators can serve consecutively, and that term limits already exist at the executive and legislative branches of the County level.
