Pursuant to Governor Andrew Cuomo's Executive Order No. 202.1, "Continuing Temporary Suspension and Modification of Laws Relating to the Disaster Emergency," which temporarily suspends portions of the New York State Open Meetings Law. A section of the order, "Suspension of law allowing the attendance of meetings telephonically or other similar services," provides for the suspension of "Article 7 of the Public Officers Law, to the extent necessary to permit any public body to meet and take such actions authorized by the law without permitting in public in-person access to meetings and authorizing such meetings to be held remotely by conference call or similar service, provided that the public has the ability to view or listen to such proceeding and that such meetings are recorded and later transcribed."

Standard Amusements LLC, Plantiff v. The County of Westchester, by and through George Latimer, in his official capacity as County Executive of Westchester, Kathleen O'Connor in her official capacity as the Commissioner of the Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation, and Hugh J. Greechan, in his official capacity as the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works and Transportation, Defendant.

Karen Pecora, President of CSEA Unit 9200, presented additional questions from the 31 full-time County employees at Playland. Mr. Nonna suggested that the employees should have a conversation with Standard, which might help allay their concerns. Commissioner O'Connor, Deputy Commissioner Tartaglia, and Ms. Pecora agreed that this would be beneficial for the employees.

The committees continued their review of the financials presented by the Budget Department. Legislator Parker asked what the role of the Board of Legislators would be if Standard seeks to assign the contract. Mr. Nonna said that assignment to a third party may constitute an amendment to the contract, which would require Board approval since they approved the original contract. Ms. Altschiller confirmed that assignment would require an amendment and Board approval.

Legislator Parker requested that the committees go into executive session to discuss the litigation with Standard. Chair Barr said that due to time constraints, this would take place at the next meeting. Mr. Nonna asked that questions regarding litigation be sent by privileged and confidential email to the Law Department in advance in case they need to do research. Chair Barr said that at the next meeting, the committees will also discuss questions regarding Section 10, which is the assignment provision of the agreement, and the changes made to the agreement based on previous discussions.

This ACT was tabled.
