#### **CALL TO ORDER**

Meeting Jointly with the Committees on Public Safety, Seniors, Youth & Intergenerational Services, Public Works & Transportation and Labor & Housing

With a quorum present, Chair Borgia called the meeting to order at 10:09 AM.

Pursuant to Governor Andrew Cuomo's Executive Order No. 202.1, "Continuing Temporary Suspension and Modification of Laws Relating to the Disaster Emergency," which temporarily suspends portions of the New York State Open Meetings Law.

A section of the order, "Suspension of law allowing the attendance of meetings telephonically or other similar services," provides for the suspension of "Article 7 of the Public Officers Law, to the extent necessary to permit any public body to meet and take such actions authorized by the law without permitting in public in-person access to meetings and authorizing such meetings to be held remotely by conference call or similar service, provided that the public has the ability to view or listen to such proceeding and that such meetings are recorded and later transcribed."

#### I. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

#### 1. <u>ACT-2021-83</u> <u>IMA-County's Firing Range-Carmel</u>

AN ACT authorizing the County of Westchester, acting by and through its Department of Public Safety, to enter into an inter-municipal agreement with the Town of Carmel in order to

have its public safety employees from Carmel utilize the County's Firing Range located at the County's Police Academy in Valhalla, New York, for firearms training.

Commissioner Gleason, Captain McGuinness and Lieutenant Alongi from the Department of Public Safety came before the joint committee meeting to discuss the Act- IMA - County's Firing Range- Carmel. This is an Act that would authorize the County to enter in an inter-municipal agreement (IMA) with the Town of Carmel in order to have its public safety employees utilize the County's Firing Range located at the Police Academy in Valhalla for firearms training. The IMA is for a period of 5 years, commencing on August 1, 2021 and expiring on July 31, 2026. Each party has the right to terminate the agreement on 30 days notice to the other. Carmel will pay a flat fee of \$3,090.00 per 8 hour tour for a maximum of 36 officers in attendance. If Carmel chooses a fire arm instructor, Carmel will pay an additional fee of \$101.18 per hour or \$865.44 per 8 hour tour. Carmel may also provide instruction at the Police Academy in a separate agreement between the County and Carmel. The County will credit Carmel with on credit equal to 1 eight hour tour at the Firing Range for each 7 hours of instruction at the Academy.

#### 2. <u>ACT-2021-79</u> ACT-WCHCC-Medical Consulting Srvcs. to Dept. of Correction

AN ACT authorizing the County of Westchester to enter into an agreement with the Westchester County Health Care Corporation for a term commencing January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2024 whereby WCHCC, through its Occupational Health Center, shall provide medical consulting services necessary for satisfactory implementation of the Uniform Attendance Standards of the Department of Correction, including, without limitation, reviewing the medical status of employees to determine fitness for duty.

Captain Conway and Bill Fallon from the Department of Corrections came before the joint committee meeting to discuss the Act - WCHCC- Medical Consulting Services to the Department of Corrections. This is an Act that to enter in to an agreement with the Westchester County Health Care Corporation whereby the WCHCC will provide through its Occupational HealthCenter, medical consulting services necessary for satisfactory implementation of the uniform Attendance Standards of the Department of Corrections. This will include reviewing the medical status of employees to determine fitness for duty. The term of the agreement is fro January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2024. The County will pay a not-to-exceed amount of \$30,000 per year and a total of \$120,000 for the term as set by

schedule A & B attached to the legislation. The rates paid by the County will be capped at 4% increase over what the County paid for the same services in the pervious year. Both parties have the right to terminate on 30 days notice.

The term of the IMA is from January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021 and is in a not-to-exceed amount of \$30,000.

The services provided will include Livable Communities Regional Host services that provide outreach to residents to participate in and access programs and services provided by the Department. Public information and education services are provided through meetings, forums and events at which residents are educated and informed about the Department's services and programs.
