I. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

<u>ACT - Retention of Law Firm re: ARCO Environmental Remediation LLC</u>

Guests: County Attorney John Nonna and Associate County Attorney Rachel Noe

Ms. Noe discussed the underlying environmental issues which will require the assistance of outside counsel. She noted that we will need to speak to counsel to: 1) determine how to handle contamination if it is found in the ground; 2) address potential issues regarding access to the site for inspections, since issues have occurred in the past; 3) address and correct the possible presence of petroleum in the ground; 4) deal with the Clean Water Act; and 5) make sure we are not missing any other issues. She also noted that ARCO has their own environmental counsel, Arnold & Porter, so the County should have outside counsel as well. Mr. Nonna said that the County got quotes from three law firms, which were all close in their hourly rates. One firm had a potential conflict of interest. The County chose Abrams, Fensterman because they had worked with the firm previously to successfully settle a case involving complex federal environmental law issues, and it is clear they have the necessary expertise.

Legislator Maher asked what the hourly rates will be. Mr. Nonna advised that they will charge \$400 per hour for partners, \$295 per hour for associates, and \$325 for senior associates, which is significantly less than what Arnold & Porter would charge.

Legislator Shimsky requested that the County Attorney's office notify the town of Hastings that the County is retaining counsel. Ms. Noe agreed to do so.
