Lieutenant Nick Alongi from the Department of Public Safety appeared before the Committee to discuss item #2022-310-IMA-County's Firing Range-Kent. He discussed that this IMA is similar to the agreements that we have with municipalities within the County, however since the Town of Kent is outside of Westchester County it needs separate legislation. What we gain from this at the County is that we are able to pull in instructors from other jurisdictions which enables us to diversify our Academy instructor staff. One of the instructors that we get

from Kent is our main Defensive Tactics instructors, which are few and far between because it is a difficult certification to get. This saves the County a bunch of overtime since we are able to use him at the Academy. Chair Clements asked how many police officers does the Town of Kent employ? Lieutenant Alongi responded that they have 20 full time officers and 5 civilian dispatchers.
