MINUTES APPROVAL

I. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

PH-Airport Parking Garage Lease Termination 2022-316

Guests: Office of the County Executive: Director of Operations Joan McDonald; Law Dept.: Associate County Attorney David Vutera

Ms. McDonald explained that the legislation retroactively terminates the existing lease and allows the County to enter into a new lease, because the current lease does not provide for termination by mutual consent. Mr. Vutera said the lease they are currently negotiating is similar to the original.

Legislator Smith asked if the current tenants will be able to meet their obligations, and Ms. McDonald said that they will, as travel has already increased since the pandemic. Several legislators voiced concerns about this lease being different and having larger implications than what they originally thought. Ms. McDonald reiterated that she didn't believe there was any

negative fiscal impact to the county.

Legislator Smith noted that the Board of Legislators' fiscal team had raised several questions they felt needed to be answered before voting on the item, and asked if it would be a major issue if they delayed the vote on the item until they receive the information they needed. Ms. McDonald said that it was not. Legislator Boykin said there is potentially a lot of money tied to this lease, and it's crucial that the legislators understand what is being given up and what we're receiving in return.

It was agreed that the questions should be sent to the County Executive's staff and the Budget Department before any vote on the item was taken. Further discussion ensued on specifics of the lease, which Ms. McDonald said are actively being negotiated. She said that if the lessee is amenable, she would share some of those details. Legislator Smith said the item would be tabled pending responses to the questions raised by staff.
