ACT-2022-129 ACT-2022 Operating Budget Amendment-Woodfield Cottage 1.

Ms. McDonald explained that in 2018, it was decided that there was a need for a new facility in Valhalla because what the County had does not meet the state's legal requirements for housing and programming. The state legislation allows for the Dormitory Authority to finance, design, and construct projects. This will be a new facility, and it makes sense to use the Dormitory Authority because they have the ability to do design/build and the County does not. Doing this will shave 18 months to 2 years off the total project timeline and will save costs. It avoids having designers and contractors arguing over design elements because they are one team. The County is in negotiations with the Dormitory Authority to determine what the scope and size of the project will be. The Dormitory Authority will retain a bridge consultant to look at concepts and best practices for facilities of this nature. To start that work, we need to front \$5 million to the Dormitory Authority, so we can get to a point that the work can go to prequalified design teams.

Chair Shimsky asked if Ms. McDonald sees this as a model for other work we might have to do to satisfy state mandates. Ms. McDonald said it would depend on what the Dormitory Authority is authorized to do, but it's something they can look into.

Commissioner Kopicki discussed the item. He said this pumping station is larger than most, which is reflected in the cost of repairs. He noted that the pump station was significantly

damaged during Ida, and they will be doing storm hardening work, which also accounts for the increased cost. Legislator Tubiolo asked when the pumping station was built. Commissioner Kopicki said he didn't know, but would find out and let him know.

Legislator Williams Johnson asked if the building was both being raised and adding a second floor to avoid future flooding. Mr. Gelardo said it is just being raised. He said there was a plan to create a second floor but during the course of design, it was determined that they could just raise the floor four feet and that would be sufficient to get it over the expected flood elevation. Legislator Williams Johnson said that the Bond Act would need to be corrected to remove the references to building a second floor. Legislator Gashi asked how this should be handled. Lynne Colavita from the Law Department said she was not involved in drafting this, but if the committee deems this to be a material item, she recommends that the Committee Report, Resolution, and Bond Act be amended. Chair Shimsky suggested voting on it as amended, and having everything corrected before the full Board votes on it.
